Island Manager's Comments

Greetings everyone:

Ferry Service: The surcharge went into effect last Friday and I am pleased to say that everyone has responded very positively. For that, I thank you all. There seems to have been a spike in the sale of tickets but it is too early to tell how long it will be sustained.

I have organized a small group of Islanders to review the suggestions for financing the ferry service that were presented at the Public Hearing and the Special BIT meeting. We held a meeting last Saturday to review the issues and discuss some of the data needed to better analyze the operation. Once we are able to develop some possible solutions we will present them to the Executive Committee and to the BIT.

Water System: Earlier this season the Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee approved phase one of the replacement of the distribution line. This phase includes installing a 4" water line down High Point Drive from Sunset to Birch / Ridge Roads. We have been getting the materials and equipment necessary for the project and now hope to begin this coming week. The plan is to start installing the new line on the Sunset Road end of High Point but we will not connect the new line to the water system until after the Island closes. We will attempt to proceed with this work with as little interference to normal traffic as possible. Please consider alternate routes as you travel the Island.

Hunting on Frye Island: For what I would consider to be obvious reasons, Frye Island adopted an ordinance to prohibit the use of weapons on the Island. I heard a rumor this week that some people were planning to hunt with bow and arrow on the Island this fall so I think it is a good time to remind everyone of the ordinance. I have attached a copy for your review.

§ 103-1. Title.

This Ordinance shall be known as and may be cited as the "Ordinance to Prohibit the Use of Weapons ". [October, 2000; [WA26](#); modified]

§ 103-2. Purpose.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to protect the health, safety and well-being of the citizens of Frye Island by regulating the use of weapons with the Town. [October, 2000; [WA26](#); modified]

§ 103-3. Prohibition of the Use of Weapons. [October, 2000; [WA26](#); modified]

- a. No person shall shoot with or use a bow and arrow, bb gun, air gun of any kind, gas pellet gun of any kind, slingshot, a firearm of any kind or description, or any such weapon within the Town except in the performance of official duties, at authorized ranges, or in self-defense.
- b. Notwithstanding the above, the Town Clerk may issue special permits for:
 1. Hunting to cull the deer herd or other animals when approved by the Board of Selectmen.
 2. The shooting of rabid animals by law enforcement agents in the performance of their duties.
 3. The special permits shall be effective only for the period established by the Board of Selectmen and may be revoked at any time.

§ 103-4. Violations and Penalties.

Any person who violates any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a civil violation and, upon conviction, shall be fined not less than fifty dollars (\$50.) and not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.), with each incident being considered a separate violation. A warning may be issued for a first offense. All fines accrue to the Town of Frye Island.

Town of Frye Island Public Works Department – Transfer Station

Because of after hours illegal dumping inside and outside of the Transfer Station, the Public Works Department will be restricting after hours access to the transfer station.

Residents have been leaving televisions, computers, lawn chairs, used motor oil, paint, insecticides, tires, boat, automobile and jet ski batteries, wood, furniture etc. all so that they can avoid transfer station fees.

This illegal dumping is not fair to those taxpayers who go by the rules and pay their fair share. We all end up paying for your illegal dumping.

Anyone caught inside the transfer station fence with anything other than bagged household trash shall be fined the maximum penalty allowed by state law.

The Public Works Department and the Frye Island Police Department will be aggressively monitoring the transfer station.

Failure to pay any fees or fines may affect you or your guests right to use or purchase discounted ferry tickets.

When the Transfer Station is closed, you may walk around the fence only with bagged household trash and deposit it in the back of the truck.


Marina News





Barbecue Safety

- ~Use all barbecue grills away from the house. LP gas grills should be at least 3 feet from the building, away from doors, windows and any air intake vents.
- ~All LP gas cylinders with a capacity between 4-40 lbs. must be equipped with an overfill protection device (OPD).
- ~We recommend LP gas cylinders be ten (10) feet away from the house, especially when in use.
- ~LP gas is heavier than air and sinks. A leaky grill or cylinder could pose a serious hazard if leaking. Possible ignition sources include smoking materials, pilot lights, automobiles, compressors and heating or cooling units.
- ~Make sure that all connections are tight and secure.
- ~Supervise children whenever any type of grill is in use.
- ~Use only charcoal lighter fluid to start charcoal grills. **NEVER** use gasoline. Once the coals are lit, **NEVER** add lighter fluid to the fire, flames may travel up the stream resulting in serious burns.

Gasoline and Lawn Mowers

- ~Gasoline vapors are highly flammable. They stay on your clothing and **can ignite** if you light a match or cigarette.
- ~Store gasoline only in an approved container, outside, or in a building or shed not attached to the house. **NEVER** keep gasoline inside the home.
- ~Keep gasoline away from all heat sources such as smoking materials, pilot lights, and grills.
- ~**NEVER** fuel a lawn mower while it is hot. Give it a few minutes to cool off before refueling.
- ~Keep your hands and feet away from the mower while it is running.
