FII Board of Directors: As was mentioned last week, there are 6 Directors on the Board of Frye Island Incorporated. All six serve a one (1) year term and are elected at the annual stockholders meeting. All six directors are candidates again this year. The candidates are:

If anyone else is interested in running for a position on the Board of Directors, please notify the office so that we can get you on the ballot.

The owner of each lot on the Island is entitled to one vote for the officers at this meeting.

Selectmen: The annual town meeting will be held on the Columbus Day weekend in October. We will be voting for 1 vacant selectmen's position at this meeting. This vacant position is for a three year term.

In order to run for selectman, a candidate must be a registered voter in Frye Island.

Phil Perry the incumbent has decided to run for a second term. In addition, Jim Kuiken has indicated he will be running for this Board position as well. If anyone else is interested, please notify the office. We will publish more information on the candidates as we get closer to the election.

SAD 6 School Board Representative: We will also be voting for a school board representative at the Town Meeting. If you are interested in being a candidate for this position, please call the office.

Public Hearing: We will have a Public Hearing next Saturday, August 30th to present the first draft of the 2009 Budget. The hearing is scheduled for 10:00 A.M., or immediately following the FII stockholders meeting, at the Community Center. Everyone is welcome to attend and provide input.

Ordinances: The Planning Board will be presenting a number of ordinances for approval at the Town Meeting in October. I will publish one at a time in the FINS between now and the meeting. The first is to establish an ordinance for the use of the beaches.

Chapter 118--- Ordinance for use of Public Beaches in the Town of Frye Island, Maine, Providing Penalties for Violation.

118-1 Title.

This Ordinance shall be known as the “Ordinance for the use of Public Beaches in the Town of Frye Island, Maine.”

118 – 2 Purpose.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to provide rules for the use of Public Beaches.

118 – 3 Requirements.

- a) No open fires on beaches. (*)
- b) No camping overnight on beaches.
- c) No personal items left on beaches overnight.
- d) NO DOGS on beaches between the hours of 10:00 am and 5:00 pm. (Must clean up after your dogs).
- e) No powered watercraft is to be left or tied up on Frye Island Public beaches. Pick up and drop- offs only. No power boats are to enter swimming areas. All power boats accessing Frye Island Public beaches must have a current resident or a temporary rental Frye Island sticker.

- f) Canoes, kayaks, rowboats and paddleboats must be pulled up beyond sandy area, racked, or in designated areas only.
- g) No littering. Use trash containers provided.
- h) Moorings must be out beyond swimming areas, and must not interfere with swim areas. Noncompliance with mooring placement will result in the mooring being removed.

118 – 4 Violations and Penalties.

Any person who violates any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a civil violation and, upon conviction, shall fined not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) and not more than five hundred (\$500.00), with each incident being considered a separate violation: all fines accrue to the Town. A warning may be issued for a first offense.

118 - 5 Enforcement.

This Ordinance shall be enforced by the Town of Frye Island Police Department, the Cumberland County Sheriff’s Department, or their designees.

PETER HUCHTHAUSEN 1939-2008



Peter Huchthausen, longtime resident of Frye Island, died at his home in Normandy, France on July 11. He was a graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy. His 28 years of service in the Navy included tours in Vietnam and as the naval attaché in Yugoslavia, Romania, and the U.S.S.R. After retirement from the navy, he began a successful writing career that included *Frye Island, Maine's Newest Town*. It was written during the winter and ice storm of 1998. His first book recounted a human-interest experience from Vietnam called *Echoes of the Mekong*. Two of his books, *Hostile Waters* and *K-19, the Widomaker* were made into movies.

He is survived by his former wife Kathy of Kennebunk; his son Paul of Gumspring, VA; his daughter Donna Davis of Perth, Australia; his sister Christa and brother-in-law Fritz Mueller of Williamsburg, VA; and his sister Annie and brother-in-law Mike Ekman of Waynesboro, VA.; and four grandchildren.

He will be buried with full military honors in Arlington National Cemetery.

Town of Frye Island Public Works Department – Transfer Station

Because of after hours illegal dumping inside and outside of the Transfer Station, the Public Works Department will be restricting after hours access to the transfer station.

Residents have been leaving televisions, computers, lawn chairs, used motor oil, paint, insecticides, tires, boat, automobile and jet ski batteries, wood, furniture etc. all so that they can avoid transfer station fees.

This illegal dumping is not fair to those taxpayers who go by the rules and pay their fair share. We all end up paying for your illegal dumping.

Anyone caught inside the transfer station fence with anything other than bagged household trash shall be fined the maximum penalty allowed by state law.

The Public Works Department and the Frye Island Police Department will be aggressively monitoring the transfer station.

Failure to pay any fees or fines may affect you or your guests right to use or purchase discounted ferry tickets.

When the Transfer Station is closed, you may walk around the fence only with bagged household trash and deposit it in the back of the truck.

Safe Boating Tips

- Trash bags(kitchen size) and gallon size zip lock bags come in handy while boating for numerous uses(especially for securing trash). Please encourage your boating passengers to use them and secure them while underway. A trash bag sucked onto a boat's outdrive, could prove fatal to the engine that picks it up.
- Secure your watercraft covers tightly and with "pitch" to allow for rapid water run-off. This will prevent sagging and pooling of water and leaves, etc.; the primary cause for canvas wear and tears.
- Storage Tips- Strategically place handfuls of mothballs in the bilge and compartments on your watercraft to deter field mice and nature's critters from making their homes in your boat for the winter months. Place an uncovered five gallon plastic bucket filled with loose charcoal briquettes in the center of your galley area or cockpit for winter storage. The briquettes wick away moisture and give your watercraft a clean odor after a long winter.

Medical Emergency Procedure

Dial 9-1-1

Your 9-1-1 call will be received at the Raymond Dispatch Center.

State your name, your location, and the nature of the emergency.

The Raymond Dispatch Center will dispatch the Frye Island Fire Department medical First Responders and Raymond Rescue. The Raymond Dispatch Center will also notify the ferry captain for an emergency run. This will occur during normal operating hours and during off-hours.

Time is critical in an emergency! Stay at your location until help arrives. Medical personnel are responding to your location. If you leave that location, you may bypass responding rescue personnel.

Fire Emergency: Dial 9-1-1

Your 9-1-1 call will be received at the Raymond Dispatch Center.

State your name, your location, and the nature of the emergency. Then **get out of the building if there is a fire.**

The Raymond Dispatch Center will dispatch the Frye Island and Raymond Fire Departments. Raymond Dispatch will also notify the ferry.

Note that all streets and fire lanes on the island are clearly marked. All owners and visitors should know the street, lot number, fire lane, and a nearby landmark where they are located in the event of a fire, medical, or police emergency. This information will greatly expedite the response time for the emergency service that is answering your call. Time is critical!
