## Island Manager's Comments

### Greetings everyone:

It hardly seems possible that Labor Day weekend is upon us already. This weekend brings the end of the summer season and the beginning of the fall. I hope everyone had an enjoyable summer as we look forward to a pleasant fall season.

**Meetings:** The following meetings have been scheduled this weekend:

- FII Stockholders Meeting – Saturday August 30th at 9AM at the Community Center.
- Public Hearing – 1<sup>st</sup> draft of the 2008 Budget Saturday August 30th at 10:00 AM at the Community Center.

**FII Board of Directors:** As was mentioned last week, there are 6 Directors on the Board of Frye Island Incorporated. All six serve a one (1) year term and are elected at the annual stockholders meeting. All six directors are candidates again this year. The candidates are:

Joe Potts	Nancy Donio
Jacquie Ossi	Ed Charrette
Neill Bovaird	David Lowe

If anyone else is interested in running for a position on the Board of Directors, please notify the office so that we can get you on the ballot.

The owner of each lot on the Island is entitled to one vote for the officers at this meeting.

**Selectmen:** The annual town meeting will be held on the Columbus Day weekend in October. We will be voting for 1 vacant selectmen's position at this meeting. This vacant position is for a three year term.

In order to run for selectman, a candidate must be a registered voter in Frye Island.

Phil Perry the incumbent has decided to run for a second term. In addition, Jim Kuiken has indicated he will be running for this Board position as well. If anyone else is interested, please notify the office. We will publish more information on the candidates as we get closer to the election.

### Board of Island Trustees (BIT) Executive

**Committee:** There are 2 – 3 year terms open on the BIT Executive Committee that will be voted on at the October Town Meeting. In order to be a candidate you must be a member of the Board of Island Trustees (See below). I presently have 2 candidates for these positions; Joe Potts and David Bond. If others are interested please notify the office. I will publish more information on the candidates when we get closer to the meeting date.

### Board of Island Trustees - Eligibility for

**Membership:** He or she must be a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age, and an owner or a spouse of an owner of real property located within the Town of Frye Island with a fixed home currently occupied by the person, maximum two people per fixed home.

**SAD 6 School Board Representative:** We will also be voting for a school board representative at the Town Meeting. If you are interested in being a candidate for this position, please call the office.

**Public Hearing:** We will have a Public Hearing Saturday, August 30<sup>th</sup> to present the first draft of the 2009 Budget. The hearing is scheduled for 10:00 A.M., or immediately following the FII stockholders meeting, at the Community Center. Everyone is welcome to attend and provide input.

**Water Distribution System:** We have started the installation of the 4" distribution pipe on High Point Drive. The installation will be suspended for the weekend but there may still be some open areas. Please be very careful when traveling in the work area.

**Ferry Tickets:** The ferry crew just received a tan \$5.00 ticket marked MSC. This ticket has to be at least 10 years old. Because we honor all tickets previously sold we have an inordinate amount of different tickets out there. In addition to this ticket, we still get \$5 blue tickets, \$7 blue tickets, \$10 tickets, \$10 tickets with a \$2 surcharge stamp, \$12 tickets, \$12 tickets with a \$3 surcharge stamp and people are paying with all kinds of ticket combinations and cash. This causes a nightmare when the crews try to reconcile the tickets and cash at the end of each shift. Sooo, if you still have some of these old tickets would you please bring them to the office and exchange them for the more current tickets. The ferry crew and the office would really appreciate it.

**Ordinances:** The Planning Board will be presenting a number of ordinances for approval at the Town Meeting in October. I will publish one at a time in the FINS between now and the meeting. Last week I published the proposed ordinance on the Beaches. This week is the proposed Utility Vehicle Ordinance.

**ARTICLE I**

**Use of Utility Vehicles**

**§ 106-1. Title:**

This Ordinance shall be known as and may be cited as the "Ordinance Prohibiting Unsafe Use of Utility Vehicles in the Town of Frye Island, Maine, Providing Penalties for Violation Thereof," and shall be referred to herein as "this chapter."

**§ 106-2. Purpose:**

The purpose of this Ordinance is to protect the health, safety and well-being of the citizens of Frye Island by prohibiting the unsafe use of Utility Vehicles on the public roads in the town, many of which have narrow roadways and hidden obstructions which may endanger the safety of persons driving, bicycling or walking on the roads or the safety of motorists, cyclists or pedestrians.

**§ 106-3. Registration of Utility Vehicles:**

- A. Prior to initial registration, the UTV must be inspected by a Law Enforcement Officer or a designated Town Official.
- B. No Utility Vehicle shall be used on Town public roads unless it has been registered with the Town Clerk and has been issued a license. The Town registration fee, license, insurance requirements and other requirements shall be as ordered by the Selectmen with the advice of the Executive Committee of the Board of Island Trustees. The owner must sign an acceptance of liability for any operator of the Utility Vehicle.
- C. No Utility Vehicle shall be used on Town public roads unless it bears a number identification issued by the Town Clerk. The number identification issued shall be as ordered by the Selectmen with the advice of the Executive Committee of the Board of Island Trustees.
- D. A Utility Vehicle is defined as a subset of ATV's as defined by the State of Maine and stated as such by the manufacturer's description on the Bill of Sale.
- E. No Utility Vehicle shall be used as an off road ATV.

**§ 106-4. Unsafe use of Utility Vehicles prohibited:**

The following practices constitute unsafe use of Utility Vehicles on Town public roads and will prevent it from being registered or being used on Town Roads:

- A. Use of a Utility Vehicle one half hour after sunset to one half hour before sunrise without headlights and rear lights installed and illuminated.
- B. Use of a Utility Vehicle without a rearview mirror.
- C. Use of a Utility Vehicle without a warning device such as a horn.
- D. Use of a Utility Vehicle with more than two people on each seat, unless the seat has been specifically designed by the manufacturer to hold more than two people. In no case shall there be more passengers than the Utility Vehicles is designed to carry.
- E. Use of a Utility Vehicle by a driver without a valid motor vehicle driving license in any class.
- F. Use of a Utility Vehicle not equipped with a speed governor.
- G. Operating a Utility Vehicle that is not equipped at all times with an effective and suitable muffling device on its engine to effectively deaden or muffle the noise of the exhaust. Each Utility Vehicle must meet noise emission standards of the United States Environmental Protection Agency and in no case exceed 82 decibels of sound pressure level at 50 feet on the 'A' scale as measured by the SAE standards.

- H. Operating a Utility Vehicle that is not equipped at all times with a working spark arrester. In addition to any penalties imposed under this subsection, the court may, subject to Title 17-A, chapter 54 of the Maine State Statues, order restitution for fire suppression costs incurred by state or municipal government entities in suppressing fires caused by operation of a Utility Vehicle without a working spark arrester.
- I. Operation of a Utility Vehicle at speeds greater than reasonable and prudent for the existing conditions, or greater than speed limits set by the Department of Transportation.
- J. Operating a Utility Vehicle in violation of ordinances or regulations applicable to motor vehicles, except as expressly permitted by the article, or in reckless manner in such a way as to recklessly create a substantial risk of serious bodily injury to another person.
- K. Operating a Utility Vehicle in a manner to endanger, so as to endanger any person or property.
- L. Operating a Utility Vehicle under the influence or with excessive blood-alcohol level. A person commits the crime of operating a Utility Vehicle while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs if that person operates or attempts to operate any Utility Vehicle while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs or a combination of liquor and drugs; or, for a person 21 years of age or older, while having alcohol levels in that person's blood; higher than the minimum requirements under TITLE 29-A, CHAPTER 19 for operation of motor vehicles; or, for a person less than 21 years of age, while having any amount of alcohol in the blood. Operating a Utility Vehicle while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs is a Class D crime.
- M. Failure to comply with duty to submit. A person is guilty of failure to comply with the duty to submit to and complete a blood-alcohol or drug concentration test under TITLE 29-A, CHAPTER 23 of the Maine State Statues, if that person refuses to submit to or fails to complete a blood-alcohol or drug concentration test or both, when requested to do so by a law enforcement officer who has probable cause to believe that the person operated or attempted to operate a Utility Vehicle while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs.

**§ 106-5. Impoundment of Utility Vehicles:**

When a law enforcement officer issues a summons for a violation under this ordinance, the officer may impound the Utility Vehicle operated by the person who received the summons if, in the judgment of the officer, based on actual previous offenses by the operator or other considerations, the operator will continue to operate the vehicle in violation and such operation may be a hazard to the safety of persons or property.

The operator or owner may reclaim his vehicle at any time subsequent to 24 hours after the issuance of the summons upon payment of the costs of impoundment to the enforcement agency impounding the vehicle.

**§ 106-6. Violations and penalties:**

Any person who violates any of the provisions of this Ordinance except §106-4L or §106-4M shall be guilty of a civil violation and, upon conviction, shall be fined not less than fifty dollars (\$50.) and not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.), with each incident being considered a separate violation: all fines accrue to the Town. A warning may be issued for a first offence.

Any person who violates provision §106-4L of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a Class D crime, and upon conviction, shall be punished according to TITLE 29-A, CHAPTER 23 of the Maine State Statues.

Any person who violates provision §106-4M of this ordinance shall be guilty of a Class E crime, and upon conviction, shall be punished according to TITLE 29-A, CHAPTER 23 of the Maine State Statues.

**§ 106-7. Enforcement:**

This Ordinance shall be enforced by the Town of Frye Island Police Department, the Cumberland County Sheriff's Department, or their designees.

## **Town of Frye Island Public Works Department – Transfer Station**

Because of after hours illegal dumping inside and outside of the Transfer Station, the Public Works Department will be restricting after hours access to the transfer station.

Residents have been leaving televisions, computers, lawn chairs, used motor oil, paint, insecticides, tires, boat, automobile and jet ski batteries, wood, furniture etc. all so that they can avoid transfer station fees.

This illegal dumping is not fair to those taxpayers who go by the rules and pay their fair share. We all end up paying for your illegal dumping.

Anyone caught inside the transfer station fence with anything other than bagged household trash shall be fined the maximum penalty allowed by state law.

The Public Works Department and the Frye Island Police Department will be aggressively monitoring the transfer station.

Failure to pay any fees or fines may affect you or your guests right to use or purchase discounted ferry tickets.

When the Transfer Station is closed, you may walk around the fence only with bagged household trash and deposit it in the back of the truck.

# Marina News

## Safe Boating Tips

- Age Requirements-“When operating a motorboat with more than 10 horsepower, a person under the age of 12 must be under immediate supervision of a person located in the boat who is at least 16 years of age. A person under the age of 16 years may not operate personal watercraft, which includes jet skis. **A person between 16-18 years of age may operate a personal watercraft if they have successfully completed an approved education course, or if they are accompanied by a person 18 years of age or older.** Proof of age and course must be possessed while operating a personal watercraft.” For the safety of all, please abide by the above law.
- Watercraft towing a person on water skis, surfboard, or other similar devices must have a person in the watercraft who is at least 12 years of age, in addition to the operator, who is in a position to continually observe the person/s being towed.
- Watercraft 16 feet or longer, must have a wearable U.S. Coast Guard approved Type I, II, or III PFD (personal flotation device) for each person on board PLUS at least one throw able device (Type IV) on board. Watercraft under 16 feet in length require one PFD for each person on board. All children 10 years of age and younger must wear a Type I, II, or III PFD while on board a watercraft.

## HOME CANDLE FIRES

Do you use candles in your home to decorate? According to the National Candle Association, candles are used in seven out of ten households in the United States.

Most people don't view candles as a fire hazard, but the numbers of home candle fires is steadily increasing. The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) reports from 1983 through 1997 candles in the home caused an annual average of:


- 8,690 fires
- 104 civilian deaths
- 947 injured
- Estimated direct property damage of \$126 million

Nearly half of home candle fires started in the bedroom, with 19 percent starting in living rooms, family rooms or dens. Thirty-six percent occurred because candles were left unattended, abandoned or inadequately controlled.

A candle is an open flame that can easily ignite nearby combustible materials. The NFPA offers the following safety tips:

- Use candles only with constant adult supervision
- Extinguish all candles when leaving a room or going to sleep
- Keep candles away from items that can catch fire, such as Christmas trees, clothing, paper or curtains
- Place candles and candle holders on a secure piece of furniture
- Make sure candleholders are non-combustible and large enough to collect dripping wax
- Do not place lighted candles in windows, where blinds or curtains can close over them
- Keep wicks trimmed to ¼ inch, and extinguish candles when they burn to within two inches of the holder
- Keep candles and all open flames away from flammable liquids
- Do not use candles in places where they can be knocked over by children or pets
