Island Manager's Comments

Greetings everyone:

Meetings: The following meetings have been scheduled:

Town Meeting: The Town Meeting has been scheduled for tomorrow; Saturday October 11, at 9:00 AM at the Community Center. Registration will commence at 8:15 AM.

Selectmen: We will be voting for 1 - 3 year term for selectmen at this meeting.

In order to run for selectman, a candidate must be a registered voter in Frye Island. The incumbent, Phil Perry has decided to run for a second term. Jim Kuiken has decided to run for this Board position as well. If anyone else is interested, please notify the office.

Phil Perry — Phil lives at 276 Leisure Lane and lived in Cumberland Foreside, ME for 30 years prior to moving to Washington, DC and Alexandria, VA. He is married with 4 children and 8 grandchildren. He served as a line officer in the US Navy and is a retired senior executive from Digital Equipment Corp and earlier from Fairchild Semiconductor Corp. He has served 4 years on the FII Board, the last as Treasurer, and for 3 years on the FI Recreation Commission and is now serving as a selectman. Phil has lived on Frye Island for 17 years and is willing to devote his energy to making FI a better place to live.

Jim Kuiken — Jim lives at 323 Leisure Lane and lived in Alfred, ME for the past 27 years before just moving to Concord, NC this past year. He is married and has 1 child and 2 grandchildren. While residing in Maine, Jim owned and operated an electrical contracting company and retired 2 years ago. He has been a resident of Frye Island for 35 years and has served many years on various boards – President of FII, Treasurer of MSC, Selectman for 8 years, First Selectman for 6 years.

Board of Island Trustees (BIT) Executive

Committee: There are 2 – 3 year terms open on the BIT Executive Committee that will be voted on at the October Town Meeting. In order to be a candidate you must be a member of the Board of Island Trustees (See below). We now have 3 candidates for the 2 open positions. Betsy Gleysteen has thrown her hat into the ring joining Joe Potts and David Bond. If others are interested please notify the office.

- **Joe Potts** (incumbent) – Joe lives at 1633 Ridge Road and in Punta Gorda Florida. Joe retired as a senior executive for GTE after 34 years of service. He has been very involved in various leadership roles on Frye Island and is currently the President of the FII Board of Directors and is the Treasurer for the Town.
- **Dave Bond** – Dave lives at 297 Leisure Lane and in Topsfield, Massachusetts. Dave has over 30 years of municipal experience in Public Works, Police, Fire and EMS and currently serves as the Director of Public Works for Topsfield. Dave and his wife Heidi have been on Sebago Lake for over 40 years. They have 3 children and have been Islanders since 2001. He is a member of the Marina Committee and is currently in his second term as Chairman. He also serves on the Transportation Committee and most recently served on the Ferry Advisory Committee. He also has undertaken a number of tasks as a volunteer to the Town. If elected, Dave would strive to maintain essential Town services and participate in the long term planning of capital projects and improvements to our infrastructure, in an affordable manner.
- **Betsy Gleysteen** – Betsy has been an islander since 2000. She works part-time in Information Technology as a Business Systems Analyst for Maine Medical Center. Previously, she held various managerial and analyst positions and owned a small computer business for five years. She has Bachelor's degree is in Economics. She is married to Eric and has two children, Sam, 10, and Kelly, 4. When not on FI, they reside in Scarborough, Maine. Much of her time is dedicated to family, community and church activities, and, of course, as much island time as possible! As a member of the BIT Executive Committee, she would like to explore ideas for how to involve more islanders in the democratic process of our unique town, including exploring the use of technology. She believes that the island must remain affordable for those of us solidly in the middle class and for retired islanders on fixed incomes. We must continue to explore ways of achieving a more equitable school funding formula for Frye Island, and we must ensure affordable and convenient transportation to the island.

Board of Island Trustees - Eligibility for

Membership: He or she must be a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age, and an owner or a spouse of an owner of real property located within the Town of Frye Island with a fixed home currently occupied by the person, maximum two people per fixed home.

SAD 6 School Board Representative: We will also be voting for a school board representative at the Town Meeting. If you are interested in being a candidate for this position, please call the office. Oleg Svetlichny presently serves as our representative to the School Board and has indicated he will be a candidate again. Oleg offers the following:

Greetings,

I am asking for your vote to serve on the MSAD6 School Board. If elected, this would be my third three-year term. I served as Board Chair (05-06); Board Vice Chair (04-05); Finance Committee – 2 terms, one as Chair; Facility Committee – one term; Policy Committee – two terms; Salary & Personnel Committee – one term; several advisory and search committees, including Superintendent Search Committee; Budget Committee – five terms, one as Chair. Through my efforts, the Board switched from the incremental budgeting to the zero-based budgeting, allowing assignment of priorities in a more rational manner. Only three, out of fourteen, board members served longer than I did. Experience and “corporate memory” matter. Thank you for your vote.

Water Distribution System: The Town Public Works crew, with a lot of help from Jeff Snow, has made great progress installing the new 4” water distribution pipe on High Point Drive. They started at Sunset and have reached the intersection of Ridge and Birch Roads which finishes the first phase. They have not made the connections to the cottages and the side streets but this will be done after the system is shut down and drained this fall so it will be ready to charge in the spring. They also have to finish some work on the road now that the installation is done.

Elections: I am sure that everyone is aware that the State and Federal elections are coming November 4th. The polls will open at the Community Center at 10:00 AM and remain open until 8:00 PM. The ferry will run until 9:00 PM to insure that everyone that would like to vote in person will have the opportunity. **I need ballot clerks and ballot counters.** If you would like to join me at the Community Center at some time during the day and help out please call Lisa in the office to sign up. Please do it early to avoid the rush.

The sample ballots are posted on the bulletin boards and the absentee ballots are now available in the office.

Island Closing: The last ferry for the public will run at 9:00 PM on Tuesday November 4th. The last day to do business in the office will be Monday November 3rd.

Code Officer: The final day for the Code Officer will be Thursday October 30th. If you have business with the CEO or anticipate questions for the next season make sure you see him before the office closes on the 30th.

Long Beach Marina: I have scheduled to have the docks removed on Saturday November 1st. Please make sure that your boat is off the docks by then.

Town Meeting Warrant: The warrant for the Town Meeting has been posted on the Town bulletin Boards and will be on the web site if it isn't already. In addition, the proposed budget will also be on line.

FINS: Next week will be the final publication for the 2008 season.

Town of Frye Island Public Works Department – Transfer Station

Because of after hours illegal dumping inside and outside of the Transfer Station, the Public Works Department will be restricting after hours access to the transfer station.

Residents have been leaving televisions, computers, lawn chairs, used motor oil, paint, insecticides, tires, boat, automobile and jet ski batteries, wood, furniture etc. all so that they can avoid transfer station fees.

This illegal dumping is not fair to those taxpayers who go by the rules and pay their fair share. We all end up paying for your illegal dumping.

Anyone caught inside the transfer station fence with anything other than bagged household trash shall be fined the maximum penalty allowed by state law.

The Public Works Department and the Frye Island Police Department will be aggressively monitoring the transfer station.

Failure to pay any fees or fines may affect you or your guests right to use or purchase discounted ferry tickets.

When the Transfer Station is closed, you may walk around the fence only with bagged household trash and deposit it in the back of the truck.

Safe Boating Tips

- **Storage Tips-** Strategically place handfuls of mothballs in the bilge and compartments on your watercraft to deter field mice and nature’s critters from making their homes in your boat for the winter months. Place an uncovered five gallon plastic bucket filled with loose charcoal briquettes in the center of your galley area or cockpit for winter storage. The briquettes wick away moisture and give your watercraft a clean odor after a long winter.
- Secure your watercraft covers tightly and with “pitch” to allow for rapid water run-off. This will prevent sagging and pooling of water and leaves, etc.; the primary cause for canvas wear and tears.
- When commissioning your watercraft from storage, ensure that all hose clamps and hoses are reattached and hose clamps secured tightly. Check same periodically during the boating season. Vibrations will loosen those hoses and clamps.

Volunteer Firefighter, First Responder and Treasurer of the Frye Island Fire Department Ruth Ann Bourque's Mother has passed away.

Addie Madeline Niska passed away peacefully on Friday, October 3, 2008 at 91. She was born in Plainfield, Vermont, September 9, 1917, the daughter of Nathaniel and Ruth (Vincent) Batchelder. She resided at the home of her daughter, Ruth Ann and son-in-law, Paul Bourque on Frye Island and Punta Gorda Isles, Florida during the winter since May 2003. She was an entrepreneur running many businesses during her life. A nursery/kindergarten, a bed and breakfast in East Sebago called the Red Oak Lodge during the 1950's, real estate (landlady of a 4 apartment building, the smallest and an 18 apartment building, the largest among several) and an elderly care home in Barre, Vermont during the 1980's when she was the caregiver for her mother. For enjoyment she would join groups for square dancing, bowling and volunteer at the local senior centers. She is survived by her daughter, Ruth Ann, a sister, Marion Corson, a brother Roland Batchelder, a daughter-in-law, Margaret Niska, 5 grandchildren, several nieces and nephew. 

Leisure Lounge Addition – Sue's Kitchen

Leisure Lounge has become a significant recreational area for all Islanders to meet socially to enjoy a meal, watch a ball game on the HD television, play cards and games, enjoy a root beer float during the day or your favorite cocktail at night. While the facilities have served us well over the years, they must be upgraded. Specifically, we need a modern kitchen, handicap accessible bathroom and expanded first floor storage.

The kitchen area is currently in the basement. Although we have wonderful new appliances, the facilities are awful and working out of the basement when trying to prepare and serve food is inefficient, burdensome and generally unfair to the volunteers putting on a meal. The handicap bathroom on the first floor level has obvious benefits. The existing storage on the first floor is extremely limited and our employees have to bounce up and down stairs like yo-yos to keep the lounge properly stocked.

Our proposed solution is a 30' x 14' addition to be located on the left side of Leisure Lounge as you face the building. We plan to "build it right" with materials that will be easy to clean and last for many years. The addition will be accessed through a new door where the window is currently located on the left side of the building. There will also be doors leading to the Bar-B-Q Pit and the back deck which will eliminate the need to haul food through the lounge area when preparing food outside. The addition will be planned in a manner that will make it easy to include as part of future expansion if that is deemed necessary years from now.

We are at the one-year anniversary of the untimely passing of Sue Nisula. For all of us who knew her, she was a delightful lady who continues to be missed on a daily basis. Sue had many wonderful traits – not the least of which was that she was a marvelous cook. Therefore, we are going to celebrate her life by naming the new addition "SUE'S KITCHEN".

The good news is that the labor to complete the addition will be provided at no cost. Additionally, through initial donations and a recent auction completed in Sue's memory, together with donations by the golf membership and a number of friends we have already collected in excess of \$32,000 for the addition. Naturally, we need more. If you haven't already done so, please consider making a donation to Sue's memory and to this very worthwhile project. 


