Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone,

Greetings everyone: I would like to welcome everyone back to the Island. We opened last weekend and enjoyed a couple of sunny 80° ☐ days which is remarkable for April in Maine. Lets all hope that last weekend was a sign of good weather to come this season.

Long Beach Marina & Quail Circle Canal: The docks at the Long Beach Marina are in; so feel free to use your slip. However, we still have Islanders on the waiting list so if you do not plan to renew your rental slip, please call the office so that we can assign your slip to someone on the waiting list. The fees for 2009 are the same as last year:

- Marina Equity Slips \$225.00
- Marina Rental \$900.00
- Quail Circle \$200.00

DON'T FORGET: Your Yacht Club fees must be paid by the time the office closes on Saturday, May 30th or you could lose your spot.

Note: Proof of insurance must be presented when registering your boat as is the case with Motor Vehicles in accordance with the Yacht Club Policy.

If you are installing a dock at Quail Circle, please make sure you install it correctly so that it doesn't infringe upon your neighbors space. The center of the dock should be located at the numbered pipe and pointed at the corresponding pipe on the other side of the channel. In addition, it has been brought to my attention that some people at Quail do not secure the outboard (the end in the water) of the dock and wave action and wind can cause the dock to swing into their neighbor's space. So, in addition to getting the dock in the right location, please consider this swinging potential when installing your docks.

Reminder: Parking for Quail Circle is at Quail Circle, the two areas on either side are intended as 5 minute pick-up, drop-off, so if you are taking your boat out for the day, please park accordingly.

SAD 6 Budget Meeting: The new legislation establishing the Regional School Units (RSU's) requires that an open meeting be held to approve a budget for the upcoming school fiscal year (July 1 2009 – June 30 2010) and then a referendum election be held to validate that budget. SAD 6 held the budget meeting at 7:00 PM on Thursday April 30th at the Bonny Eagle Middle School in Buxton. (A copy of the notice calling this meeting was posted on the Town bulletin board and on our website). This notice contains 17 articles the School Board of Directors recommends be approved at this meeting. However, during this meeting it is possible that some of these articles may be changed. After the articles have been finalized and approved at the meeting, the voters, registered to vote in the five (5) municipalities comprising School Administration District 6, get to vote, by secret ballot, to validate this budget. See page 5 for amounts adopted at the Budge Meeting.

This referendum validation election is scheduled to be held on Tuesday, May 5th. (The notice of this referendum election has also been posted on the Town bulletin board and on our website). The polls will open at the Frye Island Community Center at 10:00 AM and will remain open until 8:00 PM. All Frye Island registered voters can participate in this referendum election by voting in person, at the Community Center, or by absentee ballot. A copy of the "Specimen Ballot" has been posted.

If you are a registered voter and wish to vote by absentee ballot, please let us know ASAP and we will mail the official ballot to you. All of the ballots, including the absentee ballots, will be counted immediately after the polls close at 8:00 PM on the 5th.

I will post the results of the meeting on the Town bulletin board and an our website as soon as possible Friday so that you can review the results of the meeting, vote and still mail the absentee ballots in time to be counted.

Help: I will need poll workers for the Validation Referendum on Tuesday the 5th so if you can spare a couple of hours please call the office and Lisa will put you on the schedule.

Reminder: Board Meeting: The next Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee meeting has been scheduled for Saturday May 16th. The meeting will be held at the Community Center and will begin at 9 AM.

Boat Registrations: Frye Island is presently enrolled in a program administered by InforME that allows Islanders to re-register their automobiles and trailers on line. InforME, in conjunction with the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, has expanded their service to include the registration of boats. The Boat Registration Renewal service is available to registrants who have previously registered their boat and live in or primarily dock their boat at Frye Island. Following your transaction, you will receive a temporary registration form to print for immediate use. Your official registration and stickers will be sent to the address you specify and should be received within ten business days. To complete the online transaction, you will need the following:

- Owners name on the registration
- Boat Information, including Serial Number or Registration Number
- Credit/debit card (MasterCard, Visa & Discover)
- A printer, if you want to print a copy of your temporary registration

The system will tell you what you owe for excise tax on the boat and the registration fees. InforME will then send the excise tax to Frye Island's account and the registration fees to IF&W. The good thing is that you will be able to use a credit card for the transaction and InforME will absorb the credit card fees so the Island won't lose any revenue except for the agent fee of \$1.00 per re-registration.

All boat registrations are valid from January 1 through December 31.

This service should be available today. We will put a link on our web page as soon as the system is activated.

Speaking of the Rapid Renewal system; some Islanders have experienced difficulties re-registering their automobiles. The process on our end has been to download the registration information from the Bureau of Motor Vehicles and upload it to InforME. We just learned that the data from those that re-registered on line was not included in this download. Now we know that we need to perform an additional step or two in the process to include those that re-registered through the Rapid Renewal system. I apologize for the difficulties but hopefully we have this straightened out.

Swine Flu: I have included a bulletin that I received from **Cumberland District Public Health** with some links for your information:

Good evening. No doubt you have been barraged with information on swine flu, and updates are continuous. Please remember, and share with your colleagues and constituents, that the best prevention is to wash hands frequently, cough/sneeze into one's arm, and if sick, stay at home and monitor symptoms. I realize it can be unsatisfying to heed such simple directives, but these measures really will help prevent the spread of swine flu and other related infectious diseases.

Sad News

Subject: Michael Cogliandro

On Patriots' Day, Sunday, April 19, 2009, Frye Island lost one of its original homeowners. Mike Cogliandro, who purchased land and built his cottage in the mid 1960s, died, at the age of 89, in Revere, Massachusetts.

Mike's death's occurring on Patriots' Day was fitting timing for this son of Italy who embraced his adopted country with enthusiasm. No sooner had Mike settled into his new land than he was conscripted into the army and deployed to Burma during WWII.

After the war, Mike opened a barber shop in Day Square, East Boston, and, later, his shop in Harvard Square, Cambridge. At Mike's 75th birthday celebration, held at the Harvard Faculty Club, attending professors, Nobel Laureates, and statesmen acknowledged that they made no momentous decision without first consulting with Mike the Barber.

The day Mike first came to Frye Island tells its own story about Mike. As he was settling on purchasing a waterfront lot on the west side of the Island, the salesperson suggested that, since a doctor had purchased the land to his right and an engineer the land to his left, he might not be comfortable with that lot. Mike's response was: "There will be a doctor there, an engineer over there, and a barber here!"

So, Mike built his cottage which he and his sons cared for with pride and hard work through the years. In his 80s, Mike could still be seen each spring standing on the cottage roof sweeping off twigs, fallen branches, and leaves. Mike was a wonderful neighbor, often bringing the produce of his Revere garden to share with Island neighbors. He was always ready to lend a helping hand and always had a good story to share.

Most of all, Mike loved and enjoyed his family—his wife of 62 years, Ann, and his three sons Anthony, Richard, and Dominic, and his six grandchildren and three great-grandchildren. When they lost their sons, Richard and Dominic, Mike and Ann joined their love for them to Mike's love of the Island by honoring them with a granite memorial bench located at the Island ball field.

With Mike's death, many of us Islanders feel as if part of the heart of the Island has been lost. As we return to Frye Island this year, we, with his family, mourn Mike's absence as we also celebrate the warmth, fun, and love he brought to his Island friends.

Marina News

Safe Boating Tips

- The Frye Island Marina Committee recommends that all boaters take a boating safety course. The U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary offers these nationwide. Even the most experienced boater can benefit from taking a course. Check your nearest “adult evening education” facilities in your school district. Also, The Boat U.S. Foundation for Boating Safety and Clean Water offers a free online course that may be taken from the comfort of your own home.
- Registration-All motorboats of any size, including airboats and personal watercraft, must be registered in Maine or reciprocal state. State of Maine registrations may be processed at the Town Office, here on Frye Island. Any boat principally used in Maine should be registered in Maine. Out of State reciprocity is only good for 60 calendar days. This is a problem here on Frye Island and the Maine Wardens Service will be checking.
- Milfoil/Invasive Plants Sticker-“A person may not place or operate a motor boat or personal watercraft on the inland waters of the State of Maine unless a current/valid lake and river protection sticker, issued annually, is permanently affixed to each side of the bow, above the waterline and approximately 3 inches behind the validation sticker.” These stickers are available at the Town Office on Frye Island. **New for 2008, a Maine registered boat will have a combined registration/invasive plant sticker system.**

A Maine Boating Laws and Rules booklet for 2008 is available at the Town Office.
