Town News

Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone:

Ferry Revenue: The total ferry revenues continue to run a little higher than last year at this same time. This is a bit of a surprise considering the difficulties with the present economy and the poor weather we have suffered through so far this season. Hopefully the weather will improve during the second half of our season and the ferry revenues will remain strong.

Ferry Boat Discretionary Fund: For the past couple of years the "Transportation Committee" has been studying the ferry operation in an effort to develop a long term plan for the ferry service. As a result of these studies we hired a company to develop a conceptual park and ride facility on the 25 acres of land the Town owns on the mainland. We also discussed a plan with a naval architect to modify / refurbish the ferries. This plan included the possibility of widening the ferries to increase the ability to load them more safely as well as increasing their length by about 20 feet to allow the loading of an additional row of vehicles. This plan also included new propulsion units, new hydraulic steering and a complete re-wiring job. We applied for federal grants to accomplish some of this work. Unfortunately, it doesn't look too promising that we will get any help.

We met this week with Hannah Pingree, Speaker of the Maine House of Representatives, and Jackie Potter, Senior Policy Advisor to Congresswoman Chellie Pingree. Basically, they said that our chances were very slim because the requests for these funds is very competitive and it is difficult to convince the government advisors that a seasonal community consisting of second homes should be considered a "hardship" case. In addition, we can't make the case that our ferry service is required to commute students to school or workers to their jobs. So, as I said, there is still a possibility that we could get some financial help, but the chances are not great. That being said, I was very impressed with Ms. Pingree. She seemed very knowledgeable, very articulate, very observant and very easy to talk to. Both she and Ms. Potter agreed to help us as much as they could in these and other areas where we may have needs. We should and will continue to cultivate this relationship.

House Numbers: We have noticed that there are quite a few homes that do not have the required house numbers installed. This is important for your safety and the safety of all that might use your Island home. Frye Island doesn't use the conventional odd-even house numbering system so it is even more important that numbers be attached to the property so that emergency responders can locate the correct property in an emergency. It could mean the difference between life and death. I have attached a copy of the ordinance for your information.

Home Numbering Requirements

§ 112-1. The Board of Selectman shall require that every lot with a building in the Town of Frye Island bear, in a conspicuous place, visible from the street when approached from any direction, the number assigned to it by the 911 Designation, in clear and legible numbers. The numbers shall be a minimum of three inches in height.

§ 112-2. No person shall, for a longer period than thirty (30) days (when the island ferry is running) after notification from the Board of Selectmen, or their designee, neglect or refuse to affix to, or suffer to remain on, any property owned or leased by him, her or it, a street number other than the one designated for such property by the 911 Designation. These signs do not require a sign permit.

§ 111-3. Violations of this by-law shall be prosecuted by the Town or on the order of the Fire Department, the Town Manager or the Board of Selectmen or their designee. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this by-law shall be subject to:

First Offense – written warning

Second Offense - \$50.00

Third and Subsequent Offenses - \$200.00

Each day any violation of this section shall continue shall constitute a separate offense. This ordinance shall be put into effect on August 1, 2002.

Golf Carts: I know that there are quite a few renters and new owners on the Island that might not be familiar with the laws associated with the operation of golf carts on the Island. Golf carts must comply with many of the same laws that govern the use of automobiles when used on Island roads and the penalties and fines are identical. One of the laws requires the driver of a golf cart to have a valid driver's license. If a parent allows a child to drive a golf cart we can and will hold the parent responsible.

Winter Break-Ins: Rod continues to work with the District Attorney to their attempts to identify the people responsible for the break-ins. I will let you know as we get more information. In the mean time, he has asked me to ask the victims to check for L.L.Bean clothing, (i.e. rain jackets, fleeces, light weight jackets etc.), that may have been left on the Island last winter. If you had any of these items that are missing, please e-mail Rod at fpd@fairpoint.net with the details.

Board Meeting: The next scheduled meeting of the Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee will be held on Saturday July 25, 2009. The meeting will be held at the Community Center and will begin at 9 AM. All are welcome to attend.

Fire Barn: 207-655-8618

Open Fires

Open fires in a screened enclosure designed for such use or a chimeneas are permitted with the following conditions:

It must be used only on an acceptable permit required burn day within the state. (A permit will not be necessary to use the device but it must be a day in which burning is allowed).

The device must be on sand or dirt in a wide open area to prevent any spread of fire. It must be placed away from any structure and CAN NOT be situated on a porch, deck or other similar area. It must be continuously monitored by an adult. A fire hose or bucket of water must be nearby. The fire department has the authority to extinguish any fire that constitutes a hazard.

A camp fire is not permitted or is any burning of slash, leaves, branches or tree trunks. A person using one of these devices accepts full responsibility for their action if a mishap occurs.

The Forest Service determines the class day every morning. They broadcast this information over the radio to notify all the fire departments. The Frye Island Fire Department gets this information over their portable radios. In addition, local fire departments, like Raymond, give out this information in their morning radio announcement. They give the class day and whether or not permits will be issued. If conditions are extremely dry or if there are high winds, there probably will be no permits issued. A call to the Raymond Fire Department dispatcher or asking one of our own members should give you the answer.

Class Days are grouped into five (5) categories.

Class 1 is when there is very little potential danger.

Class 2 is when there is some danger.

Class 3 is when there is danger present.

Class 4 is when there is moderate danger.

Class 5 is when there is extreme danger or fire threat.

Safe Boating Tips

- After a day on the water, remove any visible vegetation, animals, mud, fishing gear and all equipment exposed to the water while you are at the launch ramp. Frye Island has a wash down station at it's ramp located at Long Beach Marina.
- Get into the habit of cleaning your boating gear every time that you travel from one body of water to the next. Invasive water species are so small, you may not realize that they're "hitching a ride".
- The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service recommends: "Do not release unused bait into the waters that you are fishing; dump it into a proper trash receptacle on land far away from any water body." This will help in reducing the number of invasive species from our precious water resources.
- Milfoil/Invasive Plants Sticker-"A person may not place or operate a motor boat or personal watercraft on the inland waters of the State of Maine unless a current/valid lake and river protection sticker, issued annually, is permanently affixed to each side of the bow, above the waterline and approximately 3 inches behind the validation sticker." These stickers are available at the Town Office on Frye Island.
