## Island Manager's Comments

**Winter Break-Ins:** Some good news...Some arrests have been made in the winter break-ins. I have attached a press release that Chief Beaulieu issued Wednesday. I applaud Chief Beaulieu for his hard work and persistence in bringing the investigation to this point. The District Attorney will now prosecute the case.

August 12, 2009**

Frye Island Chief of Police Rod Beaulieu announced today multiple Indictments and charges relating to a series of unoccupied home burglaries which occurred on Frye Island during December, 2008 and January, 2009.

Chief Beaulieu said that on August 6, 2009, a Cumberland County Grand Jury handed down:

Sixty (60) Indictments against Patrick John Dyer, age 28, of Norridgewock, Maine,  
Twenty Two (22) Counts of Burglary, Class B [Felonies]  
Nineteen (19) Counts of Theft, Class C [Felonies]  
Eighteen (18) Counts of Criminal Mischief, Class D [Misdemeanors]  
One (1) Count of Aggravated Criminal Mischief, Class C [Felony]

Also Indicted in the matter was Cyril Wesley King, age 32, of Westbrook, Maine. King was indicted on the following charge;

One (1) Count of Theft by Receiving Stolen Property, Class C [Felony]

Also arrested in the matter was Paul Christian Larsen, Jr., age 20, of Raymond, Maine, who was charged with One (1) Count of Theft by Receiving Stolen Property, Class E. [Misdemeanor]. Mr. Larson was not indicted by the Grand Jury but was later arrested by the Frye Island Police Department.

The Indictments and charges were the result of a lengthy investigation by the Frye Island Police Department. Chief Beaulieu wished to thank the Cumberland County Sheriff's Department for their assistance with information sharing during the investigation.

Chief Beaulieu added that the investigation is still active and that more charges may result.

Article 1: To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Article 2: Shall the Board of Directors of Maine School Administrative District No. 6 be authorized to issue bonds, notes and other evidences of indebtedness in an amount not to exceed \$12,821,765.00 to construct and equip additions and renovations to Hollis Elementary School on River Road in the Town of Hollis (the "Project") and to acquire and convey such real estate interests as the Board of Directors may determine to be necessary for the Project, which may include up to 40 acres of adjoining land to supplement the existing school site?

The voting on Article 2 shall be by secret ballot referendum. The polls will be opened immediately after the election of the Moderator following commencement of the meeting at 10:00 A.M. and closed at 8:00 P.M.

Absentee ballots for the September 8<sup>th</sup> referendum are available in the office for those registered Town voters who will not be able to vote in person on the 8<sup>th</sup>. All absentee ballots will be counted with the ballots cast in person at 8:00 PM on Tuesday September 8<sup>th</sup> at the Community Center.

I will need ballot clerks to assist with the referendum vote. Anyone interested in helping can sign up at the Town office.

**Ferry:** If you were on the Island Monday and trying to get off you no doubt experienced the delays caused by the gantry failure. Without getting too technical I will try to explain what happened. The ferry ramp weighs an estimated 37,000 lbs. In order to reduce the size of the hoists required to lift the end of the ramp, counterweights were added to each side of the gantry. Each one of these counterweights weighs about 9,300 lbs. These weights are attached to the ramp by a 3/4 inch steel cable that goes up and over the gantry. On Monday one of these cables broke and the counterweight dropped to the bottom stop. In order to install a new cable the weight had to be lifted off approximately 3 feet. This was not an easy task considering the counterweights weigh almost 5 tons. However, the Public Works crew was able to get the weight lifted and the new cable installed. The process took about 3-1/2. I appreciate the understanding and patience displayed by all of those people that were inconvenienced by the delay.

We were told that the cables should last for years but we have learned that the number of times we cycle the ramps tends to fatigue the cables sooner than normal. We have ordered a whole new set of cables so that we can replace them all.

# Marina News

## Safe Boating Tips

- Registration-All motorboats of any size, including airboats and personal watercraft, must be registered in Maine or reciprocal state. State of Maine registrations may be processed at the Town Office, here on Frye Island. Any boat principally used in Maine should be registered in Maine. Out of State reciprocity is only good for 60 calendar days. This is a problem here on Frye Island and the Maine Wardens Service will be checking.

### **Message from the Marina Committee**

There are several boats and PWC in the Long Beach Marina that are not authorized to be there. All of the authorized boats and watercraft are paying for the right to be there and it is not fair of other islanders to abuse the system by docking there for a few days, and in some cases, weeks. There are open slips available for rental. If you need a slip, call the Office. This activity is being monitored and the Town **will tow** the offending craft away at the owner's expense. Please remove any unauthorized vessel as soon as possible. Thank you.

## HOME CANDLE SAFETY TIPS

A candle is an open flame that can easily ignite nearby combustible materials. The NFPA offers the following safety tips:

- Use candles only with constant adult supervision
- Extinguish all candles when leaving a room or going to sleep
- Keep candles away from items that can catch fire, such as Christmas trees, clothing, paper or curtains
- Place candles and candle holders on a secure piece of furniture
- Make sure candleholders are non-combustible and large enough to collect dripping wax
- Do not place lighted candles in windows, where blinds or curtains can close over them
- Keep wicks trimmed to ¼ inch, and extinguish candles when they burn to within two inches of the holder
- Keep candles and all open flames away from flammable liquids
- Do not use candles in places where they can be knocked over by children or pets


