## **Island Manager's Comments**

### **Greetings Everyone:**

**SAD 6:** The SAD 6 Board of Directors has decided to hold a Referendum seeking permission to issue bonds totaling \$12,821,765 to renovate the Hollis Elementary School. I have included the warrant below. It has also been posted on the web site and the Town bulletin boards.

TO THE VOTERS OF FRYE ISLAND:

You are hereby notified that a District referendum election will be held at Frye Island Community Center, High Point Drive in the Town of Frye Island at 10:00 A.M. on September 8, 2009 for the purpose of determining the following articles:

Article 1: To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Article 2: Shall the Board of Directors of Maine School Administrative District No. 6 be authorized to issue bonds, notes and other evidences of indebtedness in an amount not to exceed \$12,821,765.00 to construct and equip additions and renovations to Hollis Elementary School on River Road in the Town of Hollis (the "Project") and to acquire and convey such real estate interests as the Board of Directors may determine to be necessary for the Project, which may include up to 40 acres of adjoining land to supplement the existing school site?

The voting on Article 2 shall be by secret ballot referendum. The polls will be opened immediately after the election of the Moderator following commencement of the meeting at 10:00 A.M. and closed at 8:00 P.M.

Absentee ballots for the September 8<sup>th</sup> referendum are available in the Town Office for those registered Town voters who will not be able to vote in person on the 8<sup>th</sup>. All absentee ballots will be counted with the ballots cast in person at 8:00 PM on Tuesday September 8<sup>th</sup> at the Community Center.

I will need ballot clerks to assist with the referendum vote. Anyone interested in helping can sign up at the Town office.

**Golf Carts:** Last week we had a number of golf carts stolen from private properties and from the golf course. A couple of them were damaged as a result. I am pleased to report that we have charged a renter with these thefts. The young man has been issued a summons to appear in District Court. Because the young man is a juvenile I can not report any more. However, I would like to thank everyone that helped the police officers identify the person responsible for these thefts.

**Ferry Gantry:** Last week I mentioned that one of the cables that support the counterweights on the Island gantry broke and delayed ferry operation for almost four hours. These cables were all replaced in 2006 when we rebuilt the ramps and we were led to believe the new cables and sheaves would last many years. Now we are told that because we cycle them as frequently as we do the life expectancy is much less. We have inspected the other cables and will be replacing them all. The first one will be this Friday morning. I have to write this Thursday night or Lisa gets after me for holding up production so I don't know the results of our plan but hopefully it went well. Each counterweight weighs 9300 lbs. and we have no safe way to lift that weight. So we have hired Bancroft Contractors to bring in one of their crane trucks. The plan is for them to lift the weight creating slack in the cable. With the cable slack we will be able to disconnect it and replace it with the new one. Bancroft will then lower the weight again and the gantry will be back in service. We plan to start this at 5:00 AM and if it goes as planned we should be able to make the first ferry run scheduled for 7:00 AM. Here's hoping!!!

Hey...I am pleased to report that it worked. It took a little while to get the crane truck set-up to pick the counterweight but once that was figured out everything went well and the ferry left the Island with the vehicles that were waiting at 7:02 AM. Good job by John and his Public Works crew.

**Medical Emergencies:** There are times when it becomes necessary to leave the Island to attend to a family medical emergency. If this happens when the ferry is not running you should call the Cumberland County Communications Center at 207-893-2810. They have the necessary information to get a ferry. Again, this is only if you have to attend to a family member who is not on the Island.

Please, please, please, don't confuse this with an emergency medical issue with someone on the Island. If someone on the Island requires emergency medical services call 911. The Communications Center will dispatch the ferry and an ambulance.

**Hurricane Bill:** We are watching Hurricane Bill closely. As it stands now, the track has the worst of the weather skirting the State if Maine on Sunday and going out to sea, but these storms can be quite fickle. Keep in mind that many people have to leave the Island on Sunday to return home, and if the weather gets really bad we may have to shut the ferry service down for a while. We don't anticipate this as long as the hurricane stays on its predicted track but we will be watching this closely and will take action accordingly to insure the safety of everyone working or using the ferry. I urge you to do the same.

Also, when hurricane Bob went through this area in the mid - 90's, electrical power was out in many places for a week or more so you might want to consider this scenario as well while making your plans.

**Taxes:** We have a number of Islanders that are delinquent in the payment of their 2009 taxes. We have prepared the "30 Day Notices" which will be mailed this week. Some of the amounts due are relatively small amounts resulting from interest accrued from late payments. Others are the second half of the tax payment which was due June 30th. The 30 day notice is a reminder. If we haven't received the payment before the 30 day notice expires we will have to lien the property.

**Board Meeting:** The next scheduled meeting of the Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee will be held on Saturday August 29, 2009. The meeting will be held at the Community Center and will begin at 9 AM. All are welcome to attend.

## ***Package Deliveries to the Island***

Reminder:

We are more than happy to help Islanders receive packages from Fed Ex and UPS, since they will not deliver directly to the island. We accept their packages here at the trailer Mon. - Fri. We sign for them, log them in, and keep them under cover from the elements. Then, our wonderful volunteer, Islander Bob Sutherland, delivers them to the island post office by 6:00PM daily. We realize that you are able to track your package and know the exact time it arrived here at the mainland, but please understand that it is only one of literally hundreds of packages that we have to handle every month. We have received everything from carpets to kayaks, flooring and even doors! It is impossible for us to dig through dozens of packages to locate your one and then to get it on an earlier ferry (especially when we are running 2 ferries during the weekdays). You may walk on the ferry and get your package and return to the island free of charge if you cannot wait, otherwise please be patient and wait to pick up your package in the post office.

## Safe Boating Tips

- Milfoil/Invasive Plants Sticker-“A person may not place or operate a motor boat or personal watercraft on the inland waters of the State of Maine unless a current/valid lake and river protection sticker, issued annually, is permanently affixed to each side of the bow, above the waterline and approximately 3 inches behind the validation sticker.” These stickers are available at the Town Office on Frye Island. **New for 2008, a Maine registered boat will have a combined registration/invasive plant sticker system.**

### **Message from the Marina Committee**

There are several boats and PWC in the Long Beach Marina that are not authorized to be there. All of the authorized boats and watercraft are paying for the right to be there and it is not fair of other islanders to abuse the system by docking there for a few days, and in some cases, weeks. There are open slips available for rental. If you need a slip, call the Office. This activity is being monitored and the Town **will tow** the offending craft away at the owner’s expense. Please remove any unauthorized vessel as soon as possible. Thank you.


