Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone:

SAD 6: The SAD 6 Board of Directors has decided to hold a Referendum seeking permission to issue bonds totaling \$12,821,765 to renovate the Hollis Elementary School. I have included the warrant below. It has also been posted on the web site and the Town bulletin boards.

Public Hearing: There will be a Public Hearing this Saturday immediately following the FII Stockholders meeting to present the first draft of the 2010 Budget. Everyone is invited to attend.

TO THE VOTERS OF FRYE ISLAND:

You are hereby notified that a District referendum election will be held at Frye Island Community Center, High Point Drive in the Town of Frye Island at 10:00 A.M. on September 8, 2009 for the purpose of determining the following articles:

Article 1: To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Article 2: Shall the Board of Directors of Maine School Administrative District No. 6 be authorized to issue bonds, notes and other evidences of indebtedness in an amount not to exceed \$12,821,765.00 to construct and equip additions and renovations to Hollis Elementary School on River Road in the Town of Hollis (the "Project") and to acquire and convey such real estate interests as the Board of Directors may determine to be necessary for the Project, which may include up to 40 acres of adjoining land to supplement the existing school site?

The voting on Article 2 shall be by secret ballot referendum. The polls will be opened immediately after the election of the Moderator following commencement of the meeting at 10:00 A.M. and closed at 8:00 P.M.

Absentee ballots for the September 8th referendum are available in the Town Office for those registered Town voters who will not be able to vote in person on the 8th. All absentee ballots will be counted with the ballots cast in person at 8:00 PM on Tuesday September 8th at the Community Center.

I will need ballot clerks to assist with the referendum vote. Anyone interested in helping can sign up at the Town office.

Taxes: We have a number of Islanders that are delinquent in the payment of their 2009 taxes and have mailed "30 Day Notices" to those property owners. Some of the amounts due are relatively small amounts resulting from interest accrued from late payments. Others are the second half of the tax payment which was due June 30th. The 30 day notice is a reminder. If we haven't received the payment before the 30 day notice expires we will have to lien the property. The receipt of 2009 tax payments is behind our normal response. Hopefully the 30 day notices will prompt the delinquent payment.

Ferry Service: Next Wednesday morning (Sept 9) we will be replacing the cables on the counterweights on the mainland gantry system. You may recall that one of the cables on the Island broke while in service and had to be replaced. As part of our preventive maintenance we replaced the other cable on the Island. We now have new cables for the mainland gantry so we plan to replace them. We will be starting at 5:00 AM Wednesday morning. We will be hiring a crane truck to lift the weights which will expedite the process but this replacement will probably extend beyond the 7:00 AM normal start of the ferry service and will delay the first run to and from the Island. Unfortunately, I don't know how much time this will take but we will do all we can to minimize the delay. Please make your plans accordingly.

Raymond Cape Road: I have been informed that the Town of Raymond is planning to do some paving on the Cape Road. I don't know exactly when this will happen but their plans are to do it sometime in September. When I have more details I will let you know.

Leave Your Firewood At Home!

“All campers, especially our out-of-state visitors, can do a lot to preserve our woods heritage and our economy by following this simple suggestion,” she stressed.

Campers at state parks, particularly those from other states, will be asked about their firewood, Tom Morrison, Maine Bureau of Parks and Lands operations and maintenance director, said Monday. Signs warning of the problem also will be posted at the parks this summer, he said.

One highly dangerous insect – the Asian longhorned beetle – already is too close to Maine, Donohue said. This beetle, which kills maples, birches, poplars, willows and other tree species, already has been found in Worcester, MA, as well as in New York, New Jersey and Toronto, Canada.

A federal quarantine is in place, prohibiting the transportation of firewood across quarantine lines, the MFS entomologist said.

“If this nasty bug ever gets established in Maine, it could destroy our maple sugar industry and our foliage tourism industry,” Donohue warned. “This is serious business.”

Invasive species can lodge in, on or under firewood bark, or be deep within the wood, the entomologist said. The insects often can't be seen in the wood. Infected wood that is transported to “clean” locales, especially if it's left lying around for any length of time, can allow the spread of the bad bugs, she said. Left alone, an invasive insect might spread only a few miles in one year, Donohue said. Carried in firewood, it can spread hundreds of miles in one year, she pointed out.

One of the most serious invasive bugs is the emerald ash borer, which has the potential to kill all ash trees in North America. Ash wood, in particular, is used to make baseball bats.

The emerald ash borer, which can kill a tree in three to five years, has killed millions of trees in the Midwest and has been found, as of 2008, in Michigan, Illinois, Indiana, Ohio, Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Virginia, Wisconsin, Missouri, Maryland and Ontario, Canada.

Donahue asks everyone to remember these four safety tips:

1. Use firewood you obtain locally;
2. Don't transport firewood more than 50 miles (e.g., across county lines especially to second homes, such as summer houses, cottages, cabins and hunting shacks);
3. Don't take firewood home that you got elsewhere;
4. If you've already transported firewood, don't leave it or bring it home – burn it!


