Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone:

Selectmen: The annual town meeting will be held on Columbus Day weekend, October 10 at 9:00a.m. We will be voting for 1 - 3 year term for selectmen at this meeting.

In order to run for selectman, a candidate must be a registered voter in Frye Island. John Nun, the incumbent, has decided to run for another three year term. There are no other candidates at this time.

Board of Island Trustees (BIT) Executive

Committee: There is 1 – 3 year term open on the BIT Executive Committee that will be voted on at the October Town Meeting. In order to be a candidate you must be a member of the Board of Island Trustees (See below). We have no candidates for this open position.

Board of Island Trustees - Eligibility for

Membership: He or she must be a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age, and an owner or a spouse of an owner of real property located within the Town of Frye Island with a fixed home currently occupied by the person, maximum two people per fixed home.

Candidates: If anyone is interested in becoming a candidate for either of these positions, and you meet the requisite qualifications, please complete the “*Volunteer Form to Serve on a Frye Island Board or Committee*” and submit it to the office. This form can be found on the Frye Island web-site.

Raymond Cape Road: I have been informed that the Town of Raymond is planning to do some paving on the Cape Road. I don't know exactly when this will happen but their plans are to do it sometime in September. When I have more details I will let you know.

Taxes: We still have 51 delinquent property owners that have outstanding taxes for the 2009 tax year. Lien notices on these properties will be generated and recorded at the Cumberland County Registry of Deeds on Tuesday September 22.

Community Center: We have shut down the Recreation Room at the Community Center for the season in order to repair the floor. We will be repairing the existing floor, installing new underlayment and tile in the whole area. I would like to thank **Mike Vesprini** for his very generous donation of the tile, cove base and adhesive. I would also like to thank Dave Bond for trucking the material to the Island for us.

Ferry Ticket Sales: The ticket sale projections are trending a little lower than anticipated last year when the budget was prepared. That's the bad news. The good news is that operation expenses are also less than anticipated and the revenues are covering the expenses. I will watch this closely and keep you informed but unless something drastic happens we should be fine at the end of the season.

Selectmen / Executive Committee Meeting: The next scheduled meeting will be held on Saturday September 19th at 9:00 AM in the Community Center.



Road, Fire Lane And Lot Numbers

All owners and renters should know the road, fire lane and lot number where they are located in the event of a fire, medical or police emergency.

This information will greatly expedite the response time for the emergency service that is answering your call. Time is critical!

All road signs and fire lanes signs on the island are clearly marked.

Every house, by town ordinance, shall have a lot number in large, contrasting colors that can be seen by emergency responders approaching from either direction.

If possible, a person should meet the emergency responders on the street and at night turn on all outdoor lighting.

If you have any questions or concerns regarding your road, fire lane or lot number, they can be addressed by any member of the fire department.

FIFD responded to the following calls as of 19 September 2009:

- 19 Medical
- 2 Alarm sounding
- 1 Tree on wires
- 2 Water - boat in distress
- 3 Open fires
- 1 Smoke investigation
- 1 Respond for police (possible breaking and entering)

Safe Boating Tips

When winter comes and you are no longer going to spend time out on your boat, you need to find a way to find the right kind of boat storage for yours.

There are many benefits to be had from storing your boat correctly and whilst it may take a little time to get the job done right by following good boat storage procedures will not only save you money but a lot of stress as well.

Below you will find a few tips that need to be followed in order to make sure that your boat has been stored correctly and you will need to have the following equipment in order to get it ready for storage.

1. Storage/Fogging Oil
2. Fuel Stabilizer
3. Anti-Corrosion Spray
4. Spray Lube
5. Trailer Jack
6. Tools

The first thing we are looking at is fuel stabilizer which helps to stop condensation forming in the fuel tank and fuel lines and therefore this needs to be added to a full tank of gas first. When adding the fuel stabilizer it is important that you follow the manufacturer's instructions to the letter. Now start the motor on flusher for approximately 1 minute in order to push the treated fuel through the fuel system.

Now we come to fogging oil this is applied to the carburetors. You will find that most boat motors have fittings for applying fogging oil. However, if yours does not have such a fitting then you will need to find openings where this oil can be applied (you may even have to remove the carburetor cover to do this). However, what you should remember is that fogging oil will make the motor of the boat smoke more than is normal when you run it the first few times.

Next you will need to unhook the flusher and drain the gear case and then refill with fresh lubricant. If you happen to notice water in the flushed lubricant this may be a sign that the shaft seal needs to be replaced. It is important to remember that a bad seal if not replaced could cost you \$1,000 or more in repairs.

The spark plugs should be removed and spray fogging oil into the cylinders, also clean the housing and coat electrical connections with an anti-corrosion spray. Also replace the removed spark plugs with new ones.

Next you should inspect the steering all of the cables both on and in the steering column and clean out any grime and then let the shaft air out. Ensure that all cables have been sprayed using anti-corrosion spray.

Now you will need to disconnect the battery and clean all the terminals and spray these with anti-corrosion liquid and then store it properly. Also remember to put the battery on charge for a couple of days each month whilst the boat is in storage.

The motor of your boat should be tilted downward in the running position and cover with a motor cover. It is important that you do not use plastic to cover the motor as it will trap moisture against the motor instead use either a cloth or canvas covering (it allows the motor to breathe).

If your boat is being kept on a trailer inspect it fully and grease all the bearings on it. Also check the tires and spray any unprotected metal or iron parts with an anti-corrosion spray.

Now you have correctly stored your boat by following the tips above you will be able to relax and look forward to next season.



Advice from the Maine Extension Service: The rain caused a lot of blight this year. The fungus lives in the soil so gardens should be cleaned out and diseased plants should be disposed of (not composted). Take this opportunity to cover your cleared garden with layered newspaper covered by mulch. The newspaper disintegrates and the soil will be ready for planting next spring.

When you ready your gardens for spring, please think about any divisions you can make and donate to the Garden Club for the 2010 Memorial Day Plant and Bake Sale. With the funds raised from that sale, spring and fall maintenance can be contracted again.
