Island Manager's Comments

Greetings Everyone:

Selectmen: The annual town meeting will be held on Columbus Day weekend, October 10. We will be voting for 1 - 3 year term for selectmen at this meeting.

In order to run for selectman, a candidate must be a registered voter in Frye Island. John Nun, the incumbent, has decided to run for another three year term. There are no other candidates at this time.

- **Board of Island Trustees (BIT) Executive Committee:** There is 1 – 3 year term open on the BIT Executive Committee that will be voted on at the October Town Meeting. In order to be a candidate you must be a member of the Board of Island Trustees (See below). Bob Sutherland has decided to run for the vacant position on the BIT Executive Committee.

Board of Island Trustees - Eligibility for

Membership: He or she must be a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age, and an owner or a spouse of an owner of real property located within the Town of Frye Island with a fixed home currently occupied by the person, maximum two people per fixed home.

Candidates: If anyone else is interested in becoming a candidate for either of these positions, and you meet the requisite qualifications, please complete the “*Volunteer Form to Serve on a Frye Island Board or Committee*” and submit it to the office. This form can be found on the Frye Island web-site.

Raymond Cape Road: I have been informed that the Town of Raymond is planning to do some paving on the Cape Road but I still haven't heard when this will happen. I was told it would be sometime in September but we are rapidly running out of September. When I have more details I will let you know.

State Wide Referendum Election: There will be a state wide referendum election on Tuesday November 3rd. The polls will be set up at the ferry trailer and will be open from 10:00 AM until 8:00 PM. Sample ballots have been posted on both bulletin boards at the office. Absentee ballots are now available in the office.

Selectmen / Executive Committee Meeting: The next scheduled meeting will be held on Saturday September 26th at 8:00 AM in the Community Center. It will be followed by a budget workshop.

Moorings: We have had a couple of incidents this year where moorings have broken and boats have washed ashore. We had another last week. One difficulty we have had when this occurs is identifying the owner. I know the season is about over and I realize that we don't have a mooring ordinance but please when you remove your mooring buoy for the season help us help you by marking your mooring buoy with your name and phone number. This way it will be ready when you put it in next spring. If it is already out mark it before you put it in next year.

Safe Boating Tips

- Milfoil/Invasive Plants Sticker—"A person may not place or operate a motor boat or personal watercraft on the inland waters of the State of Maine unless a current/valid lake and river protection sticker, issued annually, is permanently affixed to each side of the bow, above the waterline and approximately 3 inches behind the validation sticker." These stickers are available at the Town Office on Frye Island. **New for 2008, a Maine registered boat will have a combined registration/invasive plant sticker system.**
- Get into the habit of cleaning your boating gear every time that you travel from one body of water to the next. Invasive water species are so small, you may not realize that they're "hitching a ride".
- After a day on the water, remove any visible vegetation, animals, mud, fishing gear and all equipment exposed to the water while you are at the launch ramp. Frye Island has a wash down station at it's ramp located at Long Beach Marina.



Take this opportunity to cover your cleared garden with layered newspaper covered by mulch. The newspaper disintegrates and the soil will be ready for planting next spring.

When you ready your gardens for spring, please think about any divisions you can make and donate to the Garden Club for the 2010 Memorial Day Plant and Bake Sale. With the funds raised from that sale, spring and fall maintenance can be contracted again.
