Island Manager's Comments

Greetings everyone:

Water Distribution System: We have resumed the installation of the new water distribution pipe on Ridge Road. We are hoping to complete Ridge Road this summer so that when we shut the system off this fall we will be able to tie into the line at the intersection of Independence and Birch that we ran last year. We will not make the cottage connections until we shut the water system off next fall. Please be careful and considerate when traveling in that area.

Long Beach Marina /Quail Circle: We still have two Islanders that haven't paid their Long Beach Marina rental fees yet. We are making an effort to reach these people, as we do every year, but if we are unable to contact them and collect the rental fee by next weekend, June 19th, we will make these slips available to people on the waiting list. I hesitate to put the peoples names in the FINS but maybe if you know these people you can let them know that according to the Yacht Club Policy, if the appropriate fees are not paid by Memorial weekend we can reassign the rental slips and rent out the Equity slips. We don't want to have to do this but if we don't abide by the policy, it is not fair to the others on the waiting list. So if you know any of the following, please tell them to come to the office or send in their payment. Thanks

E-Tickets: As I have said before, I think we are getting closer to implementing the system,..... no really!! I have the ID cards working now and Joe Potts is back from vacation and is working with the ferry crews and the data collection process. We are still experiencing some difficulties with some of the reports but we hope this will be worked out soon. It doesn't appear to be a problem collecting the data because it shows up on some of the reports but not on others. It seems like a minor problem but as I said, we don't want to implement the system until we are confident that it is all working properly. It was our intent to start using the system this coming Monday and if we can get the reporting issues worked out before then we still will. If not we will have to delay it a little longer. I will keep you posted.

Ferry Service: We have started keeping the second ferry running until 10:00 PM on Friday evenings because of the later traffic but we have instructed the crews to lay the boat up a little sooner if the traffic doesn't develop. We want to serve the islanders as best we can but on the flip side, we don't want to run the boats if the traffic doesn't warrant.

Also, believe it or not, we still get people showing up with old \$6.00 tickets. The policy was established last year that we would no longer accept any of the older tickets. We have been using the \$15.00 orange ticket for the past couple of years and that is all the ferry crews are set up to handle so please cooperate with us on this. We will provide a credit toward the current ticket if you turn your old tickets in at the office but they will not be accepted at the ferry terminal on the mainland. As a matter of fact, after we get the E-ticket system implemented we will not accept the orange tickets at the ferry either. We were hoping to set the deadline around July 15th but we will have to see how we are doing with the e-tickets. Once we have the system operational you will have to turn in your existing tickets to the office. If you have an EZ Ride account, we will credit that account. If you opt not to set up an EZ Ride account we will print bar coded paper tickets for you.

And, I have been asked by the folks in the office to remind everyone that we can not accept credit cards in the office. Cash or checks only.

Fire Works: The fire works are scheduled for Saturday July 3rd. I always get a number of inquires about what time they will start and the best info we have is when the pyrotechnic technicians think it is dark enough.

Reminder - Board Meeting: The next Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee meeting has been scheduled for Saturday June 12th. The meeting will be held at the Community Center and will begin at 9 AM. This destroyer is presently completing construction and outfitting at the Bath Iron Works, prior to sailing in October to its home port in Norfolk, VA. Water Lines

Installation of new water lines will continue starting Tuesday, June 1st. Work this season will be on Ridge Road, starting just beyond Leap View Circle. The new piping will be installed on the lake side of the street, and on the town-owned land between the property stakes and the edge of Ridge Road. Wherever possible, the Public Works crew will avoid decorative plantings, stonewalls and fences, however, it will be the owner's responsibility to remove any or all of these obstructions.

When practical, the Public Works Crew will try and work around any of these obstructions that have been left in place; however, we will remove them if necessary to install the new water lines. Your cooperation and assistance will be greatly appreciated. The Town of Frye Island will not be responsible for any damage to property of others caused by the removal of any obstruction due to the installation of the new water line(s).

Safe Boating Tips

- Registration-All motorboats of any size, including airboats and personal watercraft, must be registered in Maine or reciprocal state. State of Maine registrations may be processed at the Town Office, here on Frye Island. Any boat principally used in Maine should be registered in Maine. Out of State reciprocity is only good for 60 calendar days. This is a problem here on Frye Island and the Maine Wardens Service will be checking.
- Milfoil/Invasive Plants Sticker-"A person may not place or operate a motor boat or personal watercraft on the inland waters of the State of Maine unless a current/valid lake and river protection sticker, issued annually, is permanently affixed to each side of the bow, above the waterline and approximately 3 inches behind the validation sticker." These stickers are available at the Town Office on Frye Island. **A Maine registered boat will have a combined registration/invasive plant sticker system.**

ROAD, FIRE LANE AND LOT NUMBERS

All owners and renters should know the road, fire lane and lot number where they are located in the event of a fire, medical or police emergency.

This information will greatly expedite the response time for the emergency service that is answering your call. Time is critical!

All road signs and fire lanes signs on the island are clearly marked.

Every house, by town ordinance, shall have a lot number in large, contrasting colors that can be seen by emergency responders approaching from either direction.

If possible, a person should meet the emergency responders on the street and at night turn on all outdoor lighting.

If you have any questions or concerns regarding your road, fire lane or lot number, they can be addressed by any member of the fire department.

Maytag Recalls Dishwashers Due to Fire Hazard – For Immediate Release June 3, 2010

Incidents/Injuries: Maytag has received 12 reports of dishwasher heating element failures that resulted in fires and dishwasher damage, including one report of extensive kitchen damage from a fire. No injuries have been reported.

Description: The recall includes Maytag®, Amana®, Jenn-Air®, Admiral®, Magic Chef®, Performa by Maytag® and Crosley® brand dishwashers with plastic tubs and certain serial numbers. The affected dishwashers were manufactured with black, bisque, white, silver and stainless steel front panels. The brand name is printed on the front of the dishwasher. The model and serial numbers are printed on a label located inside the plastic tub on a tag near the left side of the door opening. 
