# Town News

## Island Manager's Comments

### Greetings everyone:

**Water Distribution System:** We have resumed the installation of the new water distribution pipe on Ridge Road. The crew is about half way down Ridge Road now so with any luck at all we should be able to complete Ridge Road this summer so that when we shut the system off this fall we will be able to tie into the line at the intersection of Independence and Birch that we ran last year. We will not make the cottage connections until we shut the water system off next fall. Please be careful and considerate when traveling in that area.

**Un-authorized Fire Works:** Every year, since 1998, we have paid to have a licensed pyrotechnics company put on a fire works display on the July 4<sup>th</sup> weekend. In order to do this we must comply with the safety requirements of the State. This includes moving half the boats out of the Marina, having the Fire Dept standing by, and restricting access to the area for both people in the beach and marina areas and on the water. I realize that it is easy to get caught up with the holiday spirit but it is illegal to shoot fire works in Maine without the proper license. As a matter of fact, it is against the law to bring fire works into the State without the appropriate permits. Since the 4<sup>th</sup> we have had a couple of incidents when Islanders have taken it upon themselves to produce their own fire works displays. This not only proved to be very annoying to the neighbors and creates an extremely dangerous fire safety issue but it is illegal. Furthermore, Chief Beaulieu informed me that if an adult allows children to shoot fire works it is a violation of Title 17A, "Endangering the welfare of a child" an offence that he says always sticks and is accompanied with a substantial first time fine. The police officers have been alerted so please it is in your best interest to refrain from exploding fire works on the Island.

**E-Tickets:** Well I think we are making progress. The duplication issue I spoke of last weekend has been resolved I hope. I say that with cautious optimism but after a change in the software around 11:30 AM yesterday we haven't duplicated so let's hope that is behind us. We now have to simplify the process at the ferry landing on the mainland. The first thing are going to do is eliminate all of the old non-bar coded tickets. I know this is somewhat sooner than we all anticipated and we understand that this might be difficult for some so we have decided to pre-print a number of the bar coded tickets and have a special clerk on the mainland

Friday evening to exchange the old \$15.00 tickets for new bar coded tickets. This person will actually meet the cars as they approach the ferry to exchange the tickets so no one will have to leave their vehicle. I realize that people won't be able to read this before they get to the ferry but we will probably do this the following Friday as well. If you have older tickets of a different value you will still have to come to the office for credit towards the new tickets. We will also set up a special exchange window at the office on Saturday. This may seem a bit drastic but the volume of traffic has been so heavy recently that dealing with the old tickets is actually impeding the operation of the ferry.

We have many people asking about the EZ Ride accounts as well; and we hope to implement this as soon as we can but our first priority is to get rid of the old paper tickets first. We appreciate your cooperation and your patience.

**Signs:** The Frye Island deed covenants prohibit the posting of signs on the Island. I have been informed that signs, especially contractor and for sale signs, are beginning to appear again so I have asked the Public Works Department to start removing them Monday if they are not removed before then.

**Beaches:** As we enter the high season I want to remind everyone of the ordinance for the use of the public beaches. This ordinance can and will be enforced by the police officers. I have attached a copy of the ordinance for your review.

### 118-1 Title.

This Ordinance shall be known as the "Ordinance for the use of Public Beaches in the Town of Frye Island, Maine."

### 118 – 2 Purpose.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to provide rules for the use of Public Beaches.

### 118 – 3 Requirements.

- 1.No open fires on beaches. (\*)
- 2.No camping overnight on beaches.
- 3.No personal items left on beaches overnight.
- 4.NO DOGS on beaches between the hours of 10:00 am and 5:00 pm. (Owners must clean up after your dogs).
- 5.No powered watercraft is to be left or tied up on Frye Island Public beaches. Pick up and drop- offs only. No power boats are to enter swimming areas. All power boats accessing Frye Island Public beaches must have

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a current resident or a temporary rental Frye Island sticker.

6. Canoes, kayaks, rowboats and paddleboats must be pulled up beyond sandy area, racked, or in designated areas only.

7. No littering. Use trash containers provided.

8. Moorings must be out beyond swimming areas, and must not interfere with swim areas.

Noncompliance with mooring placement will result in the mooring being removed.

#### **118 - 4 Violations and Penalties.**

Any person who violates any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a civil violation and, upon conviction, shall be fined not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) and not more than five hundred (\$500.00), with each incident being considered a separate violation: all fines accrue to the Town. A warning may be issued for a first offense.

#### **118 - 5 Enforcement.**

This Ordinance shall be enforced by the Town of Frye Island Police Department, the Cumberland County Sheriff's Department, or their designees.

**Ferry Service:** We are now in the "High Season"; the Island population has increased resulting in a significant increase in ferry traffic. Please review the ferry schedule and plan your trips to and from the Island when both ferries are scheduled to operate.

**Golf Carts:** We are fortunate that the State of Maine has granted us the privilege to drive golf carts on Island roads. We are one of only 14 islands in the State afforded this privilege. In order to retain this privilege we must comply with the same laws that automobiles comply with. This includes requiring a valid motor vehicle driver's license to operate a golf cart on the town roads. In addition, everyone is required to display an identification number, designated by the Town Clerk on their golf cart. That number is the owners' lot number. There may be new people to the Island that are not familiar with these requirements but any one that has been here for more than a year has to know this. I have included articles in the FINS at least a couple of times each season and if you want to see the complete ordinance it is available on our web site. The biggest offenders continue to be un-licensed, underage drivers and speeding. And; the Police continue to give warnings but the warnings don't appear to have any impact. So, consider this a final warning. The police will start ticketing for golf cart violations just as they would for any other motor vehicle violations. This could mean a date with a judge and a probable fine.

**Trimming of Branches:** I have also had complaints of people trimming branches from lots other than their own. This could result in a civil complaint from the

aggrieved party and if it is in the shoreland zone could become a violation of the Shore Land Zoning Ordinance. So please know what you are doing before you trim branches and if there are any questions ask the Code Officer before hand.

**Reminder - Board Meeting:** The next Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee meeting has been scheduled for Saturday July 31st. ## ***Marina News***

### **Safe Boating Tips**

- Age Requirements-“When operating a motorboat with more than 10 horsepower, a person under the age of 12 must be under immediate supervision of a person located in the boat who is at least 16 years of age. A person under the age of 16 years may not operate personal watercraft, which includes jet skis. **A person between 16-18 years of age may operate a personal watercraft if they have successfully completed an approved education course, or if they are accompanied by a person 18 years of age or older.** Proof of age and course must be possessed while operating a personal watercraft.” For the safety of all, please abide by the above law.
- Watercraft may not be operated at a speed greater than “headway speed” while within a water safety zone (**200 feet of shore**), marina or approved anchorage. Headway speed is defined as the minimum speed necessary to maintain steering and control of the watercraft while it is moving.
- Boaters must always consider the effects of the wash or waves created by their watercraft to piers, floats, shorelines, or property of others. The operator is civilly responsible for any damage incurred.
- Watercraft 16 feet or longer, must have a wearable U.S. Coast Guard approved Type I, II, or III PFD (personal flotation device) for each person on board PLUS at least one throw able device (Type IV) on board. Watercraft under 16 feet in length require one PFD for each person on board. All children 10 years of age and younger must wear a Type I, II, or III PFD while on board a watercraft.

### ***Boat Safety Course – Here on Frye Island*** (Please see page 13 for details.)

The Frye Island Marina Committee recommends that all boaters take a boating safety course. The U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary offers these nationwide. Even the most experienced boater can benefit from taking a course. Check your nearest “adult evening education” facilities in your school district. Also, The Boat U.S. Foundation for Boating Safety and Clean Water offers a free online course that may be taken from the comfort of your own home.

## SUMMER SAFETY TIPS

On extremely hot and muggy days, exposure to heat can lead to heat exhaustion and heat stroke. Seniors, infants and individuals in poor health are at greatest risk. Joggers and other who exercise outdoors are also at risk. The Frye Island Fire Department recommends the following prevention tips for beating the heat this summer.

- Stay out of the sun because sunlight increases body heat, and sunburn prevents the release of body heat.
- Avoid jogging, or do it at night when it is cooler.
- Wear clothing that is lightweight, light-colored, and loose fitting.
- Drink plenty of water and cool, non-alcoholic beverages.
- Stay indoors; use a fan and air conditioning if possible.

- Eat light food and avoid high protein and high calorie foods, which increase body heat.
- Seek medical advice if you or someone you know becomes ill. If someone develops a high temperature, is flushed, and stops perspiring; bathe the person in cool water and seek medical advice immediately.
- Keep a flashlight with fresh batteries close by since blackouts often occur during extremely hot weather. Please remember that candles are a serious fire hazard.
- Check on elderly or infirm neighbors to see if they need help. Escort them to a "cool area" if necessary.


