# Town News

## Island Manager's Comments

**Greetings everyone:** If you have been on the Island most of the summer, a lot of this will seem redundant but I thought it might be best for the folks that haven't been here.

**Water Distribution System:** The crew installing the new water distribution line continues to make progress on Ridge Road. We are still in hopes of finishing Ridge Road this summer so that this fall we can connect to the main line at the intersection of High Point and Birch Road that was installed last year. In addition, we have a lot of connections to side streets and homes to complete after the system is shutdown this fall. As a reminder, there will be times when the road is closed for this work so please avoid Ridge Road if you can. If not drive with care because the crew may be in the road way.

**E-Tickets:** I guess I am a bit of an optimist but I like to think we are continuing to make progress, as painful as it is. The data base issue I mentioned last week seems to have been reconstructed and corrected, as has the duplication problem that we had. In addition to the transition to the use of bar code tickets, we have enrolled 23 accounts in the EZRide system. Those have been mostly Board members, employees and / or people I felt wouldn't shoot me if we encountered trouble with their accounts....and we have. One of the earlier "fixes" impacted many of the account balances and we questioned whether all of the debits and credits were being registered. And they weren't, but I have been assured by the developer that they have all been retrieved and are now included in the accounts. In fact, during this period some of the account users actually notified us that some of their debits were not showing up on the reports. That's a good thing, (that they notified us, not that the debits weren't on the reports), and we were able to get this corrected. Yesterday I went through all of the accounts and made sure the account balances were correct. In addition, we have done 8 ACH (electronic bank transfers) so far and they have all worked properly, that's also a good thing. We continue to have our share of problems with the operation at the ferry as well but slowly they are being addressed as well. I am also told that there may be some configuration issues with the programs relational data base, that stuff is over my head, but if so, we will probably address those concerns this fall and winter after the system is shut down to minimize the impact on the operation. Needless to say, because of the problems we continue to have I am not establishing

any new accounts and probably won't until after the high season. We may even wait until next year. I hope that's not the case but until we are confident that all aspects of the system are going to function consistently and accurately we won't be adding anymore accounts. I appreciate your understanding and will keep you posted.

**Boating:** We are now in the final month of the high season which is typically one of the busiest months of the year, so I think a refresher on boating safety laws is warranted. In case there are any questions, I would like to summarize a few of the laws and definitions found in the State of Maine Boating Laws.

### Definitions:

- **Water Safety Zone:** "Water Safety Zone" means the area of water **within 200 feet of any shoreline**, whether the shoreline is of the mainland or of an island. Remember this, as it will be mentioned in upcoming General Laws.
- **Motorboat:** Motorboat means any watercraft equipped with propulsion machinery of any type.
- **Personal Watercraft:** "Personal Watercraft" includes but is not limited to a jet ski.

### General Laws:

- **Swimming Area:** A motorboat shall not be operated in an area marked or buoyed for swimming.
- **Speed Regulations:** Watercraft may not be operated at a speed greater than headway speed while within the water safety zone. (Remember the definition...200 feet from any shoreline).
- **Age Requirements:** A person under 16 years of age may not operate personal watercraft, which includes jet skis.
- **Water skiing:** A watercraft towing a person or persons on water-skis; surf boards or similar devices shall not operate within the water safety zone (there it is again). It is lawful to pick up and drop off a skier in the water safety zone but this must be done as directly as possible. In addition, the operator must consider the effect of the wash and waves created by their watercraft to waterfront piers, floats, other property, shorelines and people.

Please be considerate so that everyone can have a safe and enjoyable boating season.

**Golf Carts:** I know that there are quite a few renters and new owners on the Island that might not be familiar with the laws associated with the operation of golf carts on the Island. Golf carts must comply with many of the same laws that govern the use of automobiles when used on Island roads and the penalties and fines are identical. One of the laws requires the driver of a golf cart to have a valid driver's license. If a parent allows a child to drive a golf cart we can and will hold the parent responsible.

**Mainland Parking:** I am sure that you are aware that parking on the mainland is very limited and it seems that we have more and more people wanting to do so. While we do permit parking along the access road the parked vehicle must be completely off the pavement. This is essential to insure that emergency vehicles can get through. Anyone violating this policy could have their vehicle towed at the owners' expense.

In addition, I have received complaints from the U.S. Post Office in Raymond and from some upset mainlanders when the mail boxes at the corner of the access road are blocked by parked cars. If the Town of Raymond gets many more complaints, that whole area could be designated a "no parking" area. So, if you, or your family and friends park on the mainland please be very careful where you, or they, decide to park.

**Elections:** The Frye Island Incorporated Stockholders meeting will be held on Saturday of Labor Day weekend. At that meeting there will be an election for the FII Board of Directors. There are 6 Board members that serve one year terms. If you are interested in becoming a candidate for one of these positions please come to the office and complete a volunteer form.

Also, at the Town meeting to be held on Columbus Day weekend, there will be an election for one Select-Person for a three year term and for one Board of Island Trustee representative to the Executive Committee. This is a three year term as well. To become a select-person you must be a registered voter in Frye Island. To become a BIT representative on the Executive Committee you must own real property (a house) on the Island. If you are interested in either of these positions please come into the office and complete the volunteer form.

**Board Meeting:** The next scheduled Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee meeting is scheduled for Saturday August 21st. The meeting will be held at the Community Center and will begin at 9 AM. Copies of the agenda will be made available at the meeting or can be sent electronically to those that want one. # ***Fire Department***

## ***FRYE ISLAND FIRE DEPARTMENT EMS RESPONSE PROCEDURES***

The Frye Island Fire Department is the provider of Emergency Medical Services (EMS) for victims of illness or accident while they are on the island.

Members of the fire department provide first responder / Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) level treatment with a variety of tools and equipment carried on the ambulance. Members are trained to treat patients using Basic Life Support (BLS) skills. All members are trained annually in Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and in the use of the Automated External Defibrillator (AED).

The Raymond Rescue is the contract transport ambulance service and will provide that service to the local hospitals in the area if needed. Members of the Raymond Rescue also provide paramedic level medical care for patients needing such assistance.

On receipt of a 9-1-1 call to the Cumberland County Regional Communications Center, the Frye Island and Raymond Rescue are simultaneously notified. If the call is received on island (no telephone call to the CCRCC), the FIFD will notify the CCRCC and an incident will be generated for both departments to respond.

On arrival of the FIFD, and after a patient survey has been completed, a decision will be made as to whether the Raymond Rescue is needed or if they can be dismissed. If transport is required, and depending on the nature of the illness or accident, the patient can be loaded into the FIFD ambulance and taken to the mainland by ferry to await the arrival of the Raymond Rescue.

Frye Island Fire Department members are dispatched by the CCRCC on the receipt of a fire or medical emergency by portable radios. We maintain radio communications with the CCRCC, the Raymond Fire Department and the Raymond Rescue.

## Safe Boating Tips

- After a day on the water, remove any visible vegetation, animals, mud, fishing gear and all equipment exposed to the water while you are at the launch ramp. Frye Island has a wash down station at it's ramp located at Long Beach Marina.
- Get into the habit of cleaning your boating gear every time that you travel from one body of water to the next. Invasive water species are so small, you may not realize that they're "hitching a ride".

Attention to safety concerns by all of us, whether we're boaters or guests, will make our boating experiences fun and memorable. Please try to keep your fellow boaters and their guests in mind while utilizing either the Long Beach Marina or Quail Circle Marina. Try to be vigilant for unsightly trash and hazards (small stumps, brush, logs, discarded or lost boating equipment, etc.) Some of our boaters utilize our docking facilities during the hours of darkness. Early in the season, an unlighted stump or piece of winter "slash" could cause a serious injury. PLEASE take the time to remove these items and take them out of harms way, by making an effort to dispose of them in the proper manner. If we all pitch in, our marinas will be kept in a condition that we can all be proud of.


