Town News

Island Manager's Comments

Greetings everyone: We hope your summer has been a good one. Mother Nature has cooperated this year with some beautiful summer weather.

Water Distribution System: The crew installing the new water distribution line continues to make progress on Ridge Road. We are still in hopes of finishing Ridge Road this season so that this fall we can connect to the main line at the intersection of High Point and Birch Road that was installed last year. In addition, we have a lot of connections to side streets and homes to complete after the system is shutdown this fall. As a reminder, there will be times when the road is closed for this work so please avoid Ridge Road if you can. If not drive with care because the crew may be in the road way.

E-Tickets: I still think we are making progress with the system. The question we had with the recording of all the transactions and the account balances seems to be resolved – (at least the credits minus the debits now equals the account balance) which is always a good thing. People that we have set up accounts for have been able to go on line and purchase tickets successfully so that seems to work as well. We still have our share of issues but they seem to be more at the ferry end of the operation than the office. That is understandable because that is where most of the action takes place but they continue to peck away at them so things are improving. We still anticipate doing some refinement of the program this fall and winter to better process the data and to make the system easier to operate.

The monster that reared its ugly head this week was Fairpoint. The actual EZRide program resides on a web based server at a remote site. This means that in order to access the program, print tickets and review reports, we have to access this remote server through the internet. On a number of other occasions before and twice this week the internet was down. This leaves us without access to the system. Consequently, we were not able to print tickets and or generate reports. I have been railing all along about developing some reliability and confidence in the EZRide system before we expand its use, which is obviously quite important, but reliability and confidence in the ability to access the system is equally as important. I am told that we can host the program on our own server and provide access to off site users as well. We currently have a server in the office that hosts our local area network and that has been very reliable (knock on wood – I probably just jinxed that) this year. We will review the pros and cons of having a similar server, in house, to host the EZRide / eTicket system.

Mainland Parking: For the past couple of weeks I have been warning people about parking on the mainland and the possibility that some folks on the Cape Road could complain to the Town of Raymond. Well it has happened. We didn't heed the warnings and Raymond has complained. I got a call this week from the Town Manager in Raymond saying that he has received complaints about the parking issues on the Cape Road adjacent to our access road. Apparently, the mail carrier has had to park in the middle of the road at times in order to access the mail boxes at the mail station near the access road. It doesn't take too much imagination to picture how dangerous this is to both the mail carrier and anyone flying around the corner trying to catch the ferry. I also spoke to the President of one of the associations at the end of the Cape Road. His members are also quite upset with the parking situation. He stated that there have been times when vehicles have been parked on both sides of the Cape Road creating a serious safety issue. He also mentioned that when the line for the ferry extends beyond the access road, it is not unusual for people to leave their vehicle to count the cars ahead of them and / or to commiserate with others in line. This is especially dangerous, and even more so when cars are parked along the road so that the line forming for the ferry winds up in the travel lane.

I explained to both of these gentlemen about the work our Transportation Committee is doing in an effort to develop a park and ride facility on the mainland property we purchased a few years ago but it certainly isn't anything that will be available this year. The only option that Raymond has is to post the Cape Road as "No Parking". If this happens violators could be fined or towed or both. I have agreed to work with them in an effort to minimize their safety concerns but truthfully, until we are able to develop the park and ride facility, there is not a lot I can do except warn you of the consequences. You can park on the access road as long as your vehicle is completely off the paved road. If not you will be towed. We must keep the pavement free for the vehicles accessing the ferry and for emergency vehicles. Please refrain from parking on the Cape Road. If you don't, it will be posted.

Undeveloped / Unimproved Lots: During this past winter the Town contracted with Paul White and Bob Konczal, both certified State assessors, to analyze the assessed values of the unimproved / undeveloped property relative to the assessed values of the improved properties and the fair market value of each. This study concluded that the assessed value of an improved property (one with a dwelling on it) was, on average, 68% of the fair market value while the assessed value of an unimproved / undeveloped property was 30% of the fair market value. Based on this, they recommended some of the factors in the real estate program be adjusted resulting in an increase in the assessed value of the unimproved / undeveloped property. This adjustment raised some questions so I have asked the Assessors to attend the next meeting of the Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee. If you have questions about this study and the resulting adjustments the meeting will be at 9:00AM on Saturday August 21st at the Community Center. I will ask the Chair to have this item the first thing discussed on the agenda.

Elections: The Frye Island Incorporated Stockholders meeting will be held on Saturday of Labor Day weekend. At that meeting there will be an election for the FII Board of Directors. There are 6 Board members that serve one year terms. If you are interested in becoming a candidate for one of these positions please come to the office and complete a volunteer form.

Also, at the Town meeting to be held on Columbus Day weekend, there will be an election for one Select-Person for a three year term and for one Board of Island Trustee representative to the Executive Committee. This is a three year term as well. To become a select-person you must be a registered voter in Frye Island. To become a BIT representative on the Executive Committee you must own real property (a house) on the Island. If you are interested in either of these positions please come into the office and complete the volunteer form.

Board Meeting: The next scheduled Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee meeting is scheduled for Saturday August 21st. The meeting will be held at the Community Center and will begin at 9 AM. HOME CANDLE SAFETY TIPS

A candle is an open flame that can easily ignite nearby combustible materials. The NFPA offers the following safety tips:

- Use candles only with constant adult supervision
- Extinguish all candles when leaving a room or going to sleep
- Keep candles away from items that can catch fire, such as Christmas trees, clothing, paper or curtains
- Place candles and candle holders on a secure piece of furniture
- Make sure candleholders are non-combustible and large enough to collect dripping wax
- Do not place lighted candles in windows, where blinds or curtains can close over them
- Keep wicks trimmed to ¼ inch, and extinguish candles when they burn to within two inches of the holder
- Keep candles and all open flames away from flammable liquids
- Do not use candles in places where they can be knocked over by children or pets

ROAD, FIRE LANE AND LOT NUMBERS

All owners and renters should know the road, fire lane and lot number where they are located in the event of a fire, medical or police emergency.

This information will greatly expedite the response time for the emergency service that is answering your call.

Time is Critical!

All road signs and fire lanes signs on the island are clearly marked.

Every house, by town ordinance, shall have a lot number in large, contrasting colors that can be seen by emergency responders approaching from either direction.

If possible, a person should meet the emergency responders on the street and at night turn on all outdoor lighting.

If you have any questions or concerns regarding your road, fire lane or lot number, they can be addressed by members of the fire department at the central station on Sundays, between 1030 and 1230.

Safe Boating Tips

- Milfoil/Invasive Plants Sticker-“A person may not place or operate a motor boat or personal watercraft on the inland waters of the State of Maine unless a current/valid lake and river protection sticker, issued annually, is permanently affixed to each side of the bow, above the waterline and approximately 3 inches behind the validation sticker.” These stickers are available at the Town Office on Frye Island.
- Get into the habit of cleaning your boating gear every time that you travel from one body of water to the next. Invasive water species are so small, you may not realize that they're “hitching a ride”.
- Age Requirements-“When operating a motorboat with more than 10 horsepower, a person under the age of 12 must be under immediate supervision of a person located in the boat who is at least 16 years of age. A person under the age of 16 years may not operate personal watercraft, which includes jet skis. **A person between 16-18 years of age may operate a personal watercraft if they have successfully completed an approved education course, or if they are accompanied by a person 18 years of age or older.** Proof of age and course must be possessed while operating a personal watercraft.” For the safety of all, please abide by the above law.


