Town News

Island Manager's Comments

Greetings everyone: Now that the summer season is drawing to a close, we hope everyone has enjoyed their time on the Island this year. It truly is a very special place and Mother Nature blessed us with exceptional weather all summer.

Water Distribution System: The crew installing the new water distribution line continues to make progress on Ridge Road. We are still in hopes of finishing Ridge Road this season so that this fall we can connect to the main line at the intersection of High Point and Birch Road that was installed last year. In addition, we have a lot of connections to side streets and homes to complete after the system is shutdown this fall. As a reminder, there will be times when the road is closed for this work so please avoid Ridge Road if you can. If not drive with care because the crew may be in the road way.

Ferry Schedule: The ferry lines always seem to develop right after the second ferry is scheduled to shut down. Because of this, the ferry office has suggested a trial be run next week to modify the schedule of the second boat. Therefore, next Monday, August 23rd through Thursday the 26th the second boat will run from 10:30 AM until 4:30 PM. The second boat on Friday will remain the same as scheduled. This trial is intended to see if it works better for people coming to and from the Island and if these times should be considered when we prepare next years schedule.

E-Tickets: The system seems to be more stable now than before but we do have intermittent problems that pop up. This week the system missed an electronic bank transfer (ACH). The good thing is when the user's card was read at the ferry terminal it showed the balance at "0". The bad thing is, the ACH transfer didn't occur as it should have. I have passed this on to the developer to determine the reason for the failure. We are still going through a learning curve so I am not sure if this failure was the result of a system error or an operator error. As I have said before, we are planning some additional work on the program later on this fall to increase the system reliability and to make some of the functions easier for the operators. Because of this I will not be establishing any more accounts for awhile.

Taxes: We have a number of Islanders that are delinquent in the payment of their 2010 taxes. We have prepared the *30 Day Notices* which will be mailed this week. Some of the amounts due are relatively small amounts resulting from interest accrued from late payments. Others are the second half of the tax payment which was due June 30th. The 30 day notice is a reminder. If we haven't received the payment before the 30 day notice expires we will have to lien the property.

Budget Meeting: There will be a presentation of the first draft of the 2011 budget on Saturday September 4th at the Community Center. The presentation will begin following the FII Stockholders meeting.

Found Dog: A female Golden Retriever was found in the Ridge Road area this week. There were no reports of a missing dog so the Animal Control Officer took her to the Animal Rescue Shelter in Westbrook. There was no collar on the dog and no means of identification, however, the ACO did leave a picture of her in the office. If you are missing a dog or know someone that is please call the office.

Undeveloped / Unimproved Lots: During this past winter the Town contracted with Paul White and Bob Konczal, both certified State assessors, to analyze the assessed values of the unimproved / undeveloped property relative to the assessed values of the improved properties and the fair market value of each. This study concluded that the assessed value of an improved property (one with a dwelling on it) was, on average, 68% of the fair market value while the assessed value of an unimproved / undeveloped property was 30% of the fair market value. Based on this, they recommended some of the factors in the real estate program be adjusted resulting in an increase in the assessed value of the unimproved / undeveloped property. This adjustment raised some questions so I have asked the Assessors to attend the next meeting of the Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee. If you have questions about this study and the resulting adjustments, the meeting will be at 9:00AM on Saturday August 21st at the Community Center. All are welcome to attend. This item will be the first thing discussed on the agenda.

Elections: The Frye Island Incorporated Stockholders meeting will be held on Saturday of Labor Day weekend. At that meeting there will be an election for the FII Board of Directors. There are 6 Board members that serve one year terms. If you are interested in becoming a candidate for one of these positions please come to the office and complete a volunteer form.

Also, at the Town meeting to be held on Columbus Day weekend, there will be an election for one Select-Person for a three year term and for one Board of Island Trustee representative to the Executive Committee. This is a three year term as well. To become a select-person you must be a registered voter in Frye Island. To become a BIT representative on the Executive Committee you must own real property (a house) on the Island. If you are interested in either of these positions please come into the office and complete the volunteer form.

Board Meeting: The next scheduled Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee meeting is scheduled for Saturday August 21st. The meeting will be held at the Community Center and will begin at 9 AM. Copies of the agenda will be made available at the meeting or can be sent electronically to those that want one. You can request the agenda by emailing me at wfournier@fryeisland.com

The Miracle of Beach Five

Nothing ever seems to ruffle the hardy mallard ducks that patrol the beaches of Frye Island, one eye on the watch for dropped food, the other to keep just out of reach of the grasping fingers of adoring children. So it was a surprise to the human inhabitants of Beach 5 last Friday afternoon, to see one duck stagger from a line waddling a few feet from the lake's edge and plow beak-first into the sand.

Was it a hurt foot? Or a damaged wing (one flapped at an awkward angle)? Maybe something she ate? A crowd of children, soon joined by adults, pressed in to peer as the stressed bird floundered in vain to regain its footing. In a matter of minutes, the duck's condition worsened. It lay sprawled, eyes closed, movements slowing. Calls to animal control proved fruitless – a person was missing on Sebago Lake and all hands were responding to that emergency. The message from the authorities was to leave the duck alone; if it was dying, just let it die.

One of the men on the beach decided to speed the course of nature by burying the duck with a plastic bag and kicked sand. This was too much for the (human) mothers and children, who brushed away the sand to show that life still flickered in the bird, evidenced by its shallow breathing. One mother fetched a box and the limp bird was carried up to the yard of the Gibson cottage on Timber. At least it could die in peace, out of the hot sun.

Then the small miracle occurred. A young man visiting the Gibsons washed the sand out of the bird's eyes. His sister set a bowl of water within reach; the duck stirred the water with its beak, finally lapping a bit. Children and parents from Beach 5 stopped by to visit. An hour passed and the duck (now named 'Jemily' by its growing circle of admirers), lifted its head. Soon it was snapping its beak at the towel that swaddled it. Within another hour Jemily was eating cereal. Then she was out of her box, walking about the yard.

Just after sunset Jemily walked out to Timber Road. She looked to the west, towards the beach. Taking a running start, she spread her wings. Soon she was airborne, flapping higher and higher, finally soaring over the trees, a duck left for dead back among the living.

Marina News

Safe Boating Tips

- Watercraft 16 feet or longer, must have a wearable U.S. Coast Guard approved Type I, II, or III PFD (personal flotation device) for each person on board PLUS at least one throw able device (Type IV) on board. Watercraft under 16 feet in length require one PFD for each person on board. All children 10 years of age and younger must wear a Type I, II, or III PFD while on board a watercraft.
- Boaters must always consider the effects of the wash or waves created by their watercraft to piers, floats, shorelines, or property of others. The operator is civilly responsible for any damage incurred.
- Secure your watercraft covers tightly and with “pitch” to allow for rapid water run-off. This will prevent sagging and pooling of water and leaves, etc.; the primary cause for canvas wear and tears.
- Watercraft may not be operated at a speed greater than “headway speed” while within a water safety zone (**200 feet of shore**), marina or approved anchorage. Headway speed is defined as the minimum speed necessary to maintain steerage and control of the watercraft while it is moving.



SHAKER VILLAGE TRIP

On August 11th, fourteen Frye Islanders were treated to a very special tour of the Shaker Village at Sabbathday Lake. The trip, sponsored by the Frye Island Garden Club included a tour of the herb gardens led by Betsey Golon, master herbalist. She explained why herbs were planted in a certain pattern to discourage deer and other animals. She then took us through the ages-old process they use for drying and processing the herbs for sale. They package dried herbs for gift shops and museums across the nation.

Brother Lennie then gave us a tour of the rest of the buildings, including the meeting house. We learned that this Shaker Village is now the only active one in the world. We also heard about the many inventions by the Shakers – including the mouse trap, the clothes pin, permanent press cloth, etc. The Shakers got their name from their belief that one should let the Spirit move them; thus singing and dancing are an integral part of their faith.
