# Town News

## Island Manager's Comments

**Greetings everyone:**

**Island Notifications:** In trying to notify Islanders of the potential Hurricane last week a number of E-mail addresses I had bounced back as undeliverable. If your E-mail address has changed or you just haven't given it to us yet, and wish to receive information electronically please send me your address and I will include you on my list. Once the Island closes for the season, we rely heavily on E-Mail to notify Islanders of events and issues. If you don't want it published just let me know and we will keep it private. When I send out bulk notices I send them BCC for your privacy.

**FINS:** We recently had problems with our printers and copiers and were unable to print many copies of the FINS. However, every week we put a copy on our web site so it can be viewed or printed. I was surprised to learn that a lot of people were not aware of that.

**Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee:** The next scheduled Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee meeting is scheduled for Saturday September 18th. The meeting will be held at the Community Center and will begin at 9 AM. Copies of the agenda will be made available at the meeting or can be sent electronically to those that want one. **FII Stockholders Meeting:** The FII Stockholders meeting was held last Saturday. President Joe Potts reviewed the current year's expense report and presented the budget for 2011. A motion was made by Dave Lowe and seconded by Ed Charrette to accept the budget as presented. The motion passed unanimously. Following the budget presentation the stockholders elected Joe Potts, Dave Lowe, Ed Charrette, Nancy Donio, Jacquie Ossi, and Neill Bovaird to serve one year terms on the FII Board of Directors.

**Budget Meeting:** Following the FII Stockholders meeting I presented the first draft of the 2011 budget. I thought there was a good turn out and there were a number of questions regarding the proposed budgeted expenditures. A copy of the first draft has been posted on the website. I will continue to update the 2010 year end projections and tweak the budget for the October Town Meeting. Updates will be made available on our web site.

**Town Meeting:** The annual Town / BIT meeting will be held on Saturday October 9 (Columbus Day Weekend). In addition to the budget, we will be electing a Select-Person and a Representative to the BIT Executive Committee. These are both three year terms. To become a Select-Person you must be a registered voter in Frye Island. To become a BIT representative on the Executive Committee you must own real property (a house) on the Island. If you are interested in either of these positions please come into the office and complete the volunteer form.

**Lyme disease:** I spoke this morning with an Islander who recently was diagnosed with Lyme disease and he is certain he got it while on the Island. I am certainly not an expert on Lyme disease but the information I was given by this gentleman makes it very clear that the disease is a result of a bite from a deer tick. And, the deer tick depends on the white-tailed deer for successful reproduction. And we definitely have an abundance of white-tailed deer on the Island this year. Lyme disease symptoms vary widely but some of the symptoms are: Rash, Flu-like symptoms, Migratory joint pain, Neurological problems, and other symptoms like severe fatigue, eye inflammation irregular heartbeat and hepatitis. Only a minority of deer tick bites result in Lyme disease but if you feel any combination of these symptoms you should see your doctor and let him know that you have been on the Island where people have been diagnosed with the disease. It is important to identify the disease and get treatment during the early stage of the disease. The longer it persists in your system, the more difficult it is to treat. Believe me; I am not trying to scare anyone, but only trying to make you aware. Again, the documents say only a small minority of deer tick bites end up causing Lyme disease but if you feel any of these symptoms and they seem to persist, you should contact your physician. We will be working with the State Biologists' office to survey the deer population on the Island to determine if there are more deer on the Island than it can support.

### TIPS FOR MAINTAINING WOOD STOVES AND FIREPLACES

Being educated about fireplaces and wood stoves before accidents happen can prevent serious loss of property and life. These safety tips can help you keep your fireplace or wood stove in safe operating condition during the cold weather.

Have the fireplace or wood stove professionally installed according to the manufacturer's guidelines and clearance requirements. Stoves and manufactured fireplaces should pass the test of a nationally recognized testing lab, such as Underwriter's Laboratories, or pass testing equal to UL testing standards.

Purchase a UL listed smoke detector for your house and have it properly installed.

Hopefully your house is already hard-wired for smoke detectors. Purchase a UL listed multipurpose fire extinguisher.

Use the proper fuel for the stove or fireplace. Burn only logs in a wood burning stove, not paper or building material wood.

Make sure the ashes are completely cool before removal. Place them in a **noncombustible container** for disposal, preferably one not kept inside the house or garage.

Have a professional chimney sweep regularly clean the chimney to reduce creosote buildup.

Don't place furniture or household items on or near the stove during operation

### **Safe Boating Tips**

As a member of the Raymond Marine One Operations, while stopping off at the Cafe for a cup of coffee Sunday evening (4Sept.), we encountered a grandfather, with 2 sons and several very small grandchildren boarding their pontoon boat to return to their home on the island. Since you have such good articles about boater safety I thought I'd share the experience.

The time of departure from the Cafe was considerably after sunset (time for navigation lights). The grandchildren (mostly under the age of 10), did not have life jackets on. We asked them to put them on and they did so. We asked about the navigation lights.....neither the white all around light, nor the red/green nav. lights worked.

We agreed to assist/escort them to their destination. This was at the south end of the island, and a few cottages west of Long Beach Marina. When asked the destination, the answer was "just around the corner". The two sons seemed shocked when they were told it was 2.5+ miles.

A large express cruiser sped past us, heading North, as we progressed Southward along the east side of FI. He may not have even seen the pontoon boat had we not been along. The grandfather and passengers arrived safely at their home dock and thanked us as we departed. We parted suggesting that he repair his navigation lights before venturing out again.


