



Island Manager's Comments

Greetings everyone: I would like to welcome everyone back to the Island. Hopefully we will have a nice weekend and a great summer.

Long Beach Marina & Quail Circle Canal: The docks at the Long Beach Marina are in. We do have quite a few Islanders on the waiting list this year so if you do not plan to renew your rental slip, please call the office ASAP so that we can assign your slip to someone on the waiting list. The fees for 2011 are the same as last year:

- Marina Equity Slips \$225.00
- Marina Rental \$900.00
- Quail Circle \$200.00

DON'T FORGET: These Yacht Club fees must be paid by the time the office closes on Saturday, May 28th or you could lose your spot.

Note: Proof of insurance must be presented when registering your boat as is the case with Motor Vehicles in accordance with the Yacht Club Policy.

If you are installing a dock at Quail Circle, please make sure you install it correctly so that it doesn't infringe upon your neighbors space. The center of the dock should be located at the numbered pipe and pointed at the corresponding pipe on the opposite side of the channel. In addition, it has been brought to my attention that some people at Quail do not secure the outboard (the end in the water) end of the dock and wave action and wind can cause the dock to swing into their neighbor's space. So, in addition to getting the dock in the right location, please consider this swinging potential when installing your docks.

Reminder: Parking for Quail Circle is at Quail Circle, the two areas on either side are intended as 5 minute pick-up, drop-off, so if you are taking your boat out for the day, please park accordingly.

SAD 6 Budget Meeting: The SAD 6 budget meeting will be held on Thursday evening June 2nd at the Bonny Eagle Middle School in Buxton. All Frye Island registered voters are invited to attend. The MSAD #6 budget committee has proposed a budget for the 2011 – 2012 fiscal year of \$41,407,750. This is a reduction of \$1,182,261 from the previous budget. Frye Island's share of the budget, if passed as proposed, would decrease from \$1,198,596 to \$1,119,986. There are 17 Articles on the warrant for the budget meeting. Each Article will be discussed and voted on during this meeting. There is no absentee voting for the budget

meeting. If any of the warrant articles are to be amended it will be done at this meeting. The warrant for this meeting will be posted on our web site and has been posted at the town office.

The referendum election to validate this budget will be held on Tuesday, June 14th. (The notice of this referendum election has been posted on the Town bulletin board). The polls will open at the Frye Island Community Center at 10:00 AM and will remain open until 8:00 PM. All registered voters can participate in this referendum election by voting in person at the Community Center, or by absentee ballot. A copy of the "Specimen Ballot" has been posted on the bulletin boards

I will post the results of the meeting on the Town bulletin board and on our website as soon as they are available from SAD 6.

E-Tickets: As I have said, the EZ Ride software seems to be performing well. We find a "bug" now and then but they get resolved quite quickly. We also have some speed issues with the transmission of data but that is being worked on also, so we are ready to accept applications for EZ Ride passes. You can get an application on the fryeisland.com web site under the "ferry" drop down menu or you can pick one up in the office. On the application, you will be able to designate one person as the owner of the account. That person will complete the application and determine the trigger balance which is the dollar amount when the account will be replenished (\$30.00 is the minimum), and the amount to replenish (\$75.00 is the minimum). That person will also determine the method to be used to replenish the account. **We can not** accept credit or debit cards. Your choices are Option #1 which is to replenish by check which means you must deliver a check to the office either in person or by mail. Or, you can select option #2 which will transfer the replenishment amount from your account to our account automatically when your account reaches the trigger balance. We prefer you select option #2 because it makes everything easier but the choice is yours to make. In either case, you must include a check for \$150.00 to open an account. If you select option #2 please include a voided check with the application as well as the initial deposit. The account owner can also designate the additional users of that account. Keep in mind, that everyone identified as a user will be charged to that account. Also keep in mind that once you establish an account you will be able to access your account and generate a paper ticket that can

be printed and mailed to a friend or family member or you can attach a ticket to an e-mail and the recipient can print the ticket themselves. Once we receive the application we will process it as soon as we can. We will try to have the EZ Ride cards available by the weekend following the applications receipt in the office. When we have processed the application you will receive an e-mail from the system. This is the important part...the email will be sent to the email address you provide on the application. **This email address is also your user name.** The email will include a link which validates your email address and allows you to set your password. Your account will not be activated until this email is returned. If you have tickets that were purchased prior to your account being activated you can continue to use them or you can return them to the office for credit on your account.

Sad News

Steven Orszag, Pioneer in Fluid Dynamics Study, Dies at 68.

Steven A. Orszag, a mathematician who performed pioneering work in the field of fluid dynamics and whose research had wide-ranging applications in airplane and auto design, meteorology and astrophysics, died May 1 in New Haven. He was 68.

The cause was chronic lymphomic leukemia, said his son Peter.

Fluid dynamics, a subject that concerns the physics of what happens when a cup of coffee is stirred, when moisture from the sides of a rain-soaked truck flies into the windshield of a trailing car, when air passes over an airplane wing or when a storm front passes through a mountain range, is the study of how liquids and gases behave in motion. Dr. Orszag, who had taught at Yale since 1998 and before that at Princeton and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, was especially interested in problems of turbulent flow — that is, the complications that result when the flow is especially rapid and irregular, for example when a brisk stream encounters a bridge pillar.

It is a field both fundamental to life on earth — not to mention the rest of the universe — and devilishly complicated, but the practical applications are both huge and timely. To name just one, simulation models of air and water flow over the chassis of cars and trucks can give designers clues for reducing drag — and thus saving vast amounts of fuel.

“To explain the pattern of a vigorously stirred cup of coffee, to express mathematically, in detail, how all the fluid particles move around in the cup, something that is apparently banal, is a major scientific feat,” said John S. Wettlaufer, a colleague of Dr. Orszag’s at Yale, where he is a professor of geophysics, physics and applied mathematics.

The mathematical expressions that underlie the dynamics of fluids, turbulent or otherwise, comprise a set of differential equations for fluid velocity that are reliant on factors like viscosity, density and gravity. Known as the Navier-Stokes equations, they reflect Newton’s second law of motion — that is, force equals mass times acceleration — and their generality allows them to describe a vast range of liquid behaviors, “from pouring honey on your toast,” Dr. Wettlaufer said, “to feeling a gust of air on your face on a windy day.”

Dr. Orszag greatly advanced the study of these equations by developing new methods for solving them, known as spectral methods. The complexities of the work led him to the development of new methods of computing, which were specifically devised to help with the difficulties of creating mathematical models of turbulent flow situations. Dr. Orszag’s advances made problem-solving in the field exponentially faster and more accurate.

Steven Alan Orszag was born in Manhattan on Feb. 27, 1943, and grew up in Forest Hills, Queens. His father was a lawyer. A precocious intellect, he entered M.I.T. at 16 and graduated at 19. He attended St. Johns College at Cambridge, in England, and earned a Ph.D. in astrophysics from Princeton at 23.

“The joke about him was that he was the youngest person ever to turn 40,” said his son Peter, a vice chairman of global banking at Citibank who is a former budget director for President Obama and a former contributing columnist to The New York Times’s Op-Ed Page.

After a year at the Institute for Advanced Study in Princeton, N.J., Dr. Orszag joined the faculty at M.I.T. in 1967 before returning to Princeton in 1984. He was the author of a number of books, including a widely used textbook, written with Carl Bender, “Advanced Mathematical Methods for Scientists and Engineers.” And his research led him to help found or become chief scientific adviser to a number of companies, including Ibrix, a data storage company that was bought by Hewlett-Packard in 2009, and Exa, which develops simulation software for fluids engineering companies. Dr. Orszag lived in New Haven, Princeton, and Frye Island. In addition to his son Peter, who lives in New York and Washington, he is survived by his wife, the former Reba Karp, whom he married in 1964; a sister, Myrna Baron of Scottsdale, Ariz.; two other sons, Jonathan, of Los Angeles, and Michael, of London; and two grandchildren.

Fire Department Notice

Rules pertaining to the use of open fires in screened enclosures and chimeneas.

Open fires in a screened enclosure designed for such use or chimenea are permitted under the following conditions:

- The device must be used only on an acceptable permit-required burn day within the state. (A permit will not be necessary to use the device, but it can only be used on a day on which burning is allowed.)
- The device must stand on sand or dirt in a wide-open area to prevent any spread of fire.
- The device must be placed away from any structure and **cannot** be situated on a porch, deck, or other similar area.
- The device must be continuously monitored by an adult.
- A fire hose or bucket of water must be nearby.

Anyone using one of these devices accepts **full responsibility** for their actions if a mishap occurs.

The fire department has the authority to extinguish any fire that constitutes a hazard.

Violators of these rules will be reported to the Maine Forest Service, Forest Protection Division, for disciplinary action.

If there are any questions or concerns regarding the use of a screened enclosure or a chimenea, please contact the Town Fire Warden or Frye Island Fire Department.

Marina News

Safe Boating Tips

- The Frye Island Marina Committee recommends that all boaters take a boating safety course. The U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary offers these nationwide. Even the most experienced boater can benefit from taking a course. Check your nearest “adult evening education” facilities in your school district. Also, The Boat U.S. Foundation for Boating Safety and Clean Water offers a free online course that may be taken from the comfort of your own home.
- Registration-All motorboats of any size, including airboats and personal watercraft, must be registered in Maine or reciprocal state. State of Maine registrations may be processed at the Town Office, here on Frye Island. Any boat principally used in Maine should be registered in Maine. Out of State reciprocity is only good for 60 calendar days. This is a problem here on Frye Island and the Maine Wardens Service will be checking.
- Milfoil/Invasive Plants Sticker-“A person may not place or operate a motor boat or personal watercraft on the inland waters of the State of Maine unless a current/valid lake and river protection sticker, issued annually, is permanently affixed to each side of the bow, above the waterline and approximately 3 inches behind the validation sticker.” These stickers are available at the Town Office on Frye Island. **A Maine registered boat will have a combined registration/invasive plant sticker system.**
- Try to be vigilant for unsightly trash and hazards (small stumps, brush, logs, discarded or lost boating equipment, etc.) Some of our boaters utilize our docking facilities during the hours of darkness. Early in the season, an unlighted stump or piece of winter “slash” could cause a serious injury. PLEASE take the time to remove these items and take them out of harms way, by making an effort to dispose of them in the proper manner. If we all pitch in, our marinas will be kept in a condition that we can all be proud of.
