Town News

Island Manager's Comments

Greetings everyone:

Water Distribution System: We have resumed the installation of the new water distribution line on the north end of Leisure Lane. We hope to get as far around Leisure as we can this summer, we're not sure we can finish it this summer but we will try.

We will suspend the installation for the weekend but I urge you to be very cautious when traveling in the work zone. There could be some soft areas where the crews have been digging.

Long Beach Marina & Quail Circle Canal: The time to renew your slip rental at both Long Beach Marina and Quail Circle has come and gone. We will begin reassigning the slips that are available this week.

Marina & Quail Stickers: In order to monitor use of slips, all boats occupying any slip in Quail Circle and the Marina shall display a Sticker issued by the Town office at the time of the slip renewal, rental or other authorized slip use. The slip owner/renter is responsible for ensuring the sticker is placed in a visible location. The fee is \$5.00. There shall be an administrative fee of \$100 assessed to the owner having the slip assignment if a boat occupies the slip **without** a sticker. This fee shall not apply if the use is without the slip owner's knowledge or permission, although the owner of said boat will be subject to towing and storage charges/fees.

Boat Registrations: If you have a Maine boat that you need to re-register I would urge you to use the service provided by the Inland Fisheries and Wildlife Department. I recently re-registered my boat from my home computer and it only took me about 5 minutes. I was really impressed with the service. I printed a temporary registration and within a few days I had my permanent registration and the appropriate stickers. You can access this service from a link on our web-site.

Taxes: I realize that it is a bit early but I want to remind everyone that the second half of the 2011 property tax is due June 30th. Interest will start to accrue on July 1st for all unpaid taxes.

SAD 6 Budget Meeting: The SAD #6 budget hearing was held last night at the Bonny Eagle Middle School. There were 17 articles on the warrant for the meeting and all of the articles passed as presented. State law requires a referendum election to validate the budget. This will be held on Tuesday, June 14th. This is a *Yes* or *No* vote. Yes to approve the budget that was passed at last night's hearing and No to reject it. (The notice of this referendum election will be posted on the Town bulletin board). The polls will open at the Frye Island Community Center at 10:00 AM and will remain open until 8:00 PM. All registered voters can participate in this referendum election by voting in person at the Community Center, or by absentee ballot which is available at the Town Office. E-Tickets: We now have 124 accounts set-up with multiple users of these accounts. The developers have tweaked the system a few times but things appear to be going much better as we all gain more experience with both the hardware and the software. We also improved the security of the system for those of us that have selected the ACH option by limiting visibility of the routing and account numbers in the system. I continue to urge everyone to apply for an account. Our goal is to have all of the property owners set up with accounts and to reduce the barcoded paper tickets to the very minimum. Speaking of paper tickets, I want to remind everyone that the old gold & blue tickets are not compatible with the new electronic system so please don't use them at the ferry terminal. It just bogs down the whole process. You can turn these tickets in at the office for credit on your EZ Ride account if you have one or for the barcoded tickets if you don't.

Protection Against Mosquitoes

- Avoid places and times when mosquitoes bite. Generally, peak biting periods for the type of mosquitoes capable of transmitting WNV occur just before and after sunset and just before dawn.
- Apply insect repellent containing 25-35% DEET when you're outdoors.
- Assure door and window, patio and porch screens are tight-fitting and in good repair.
- Wear long-sleeved tops, long pants, socks and shoes and clothing made of tightly woven materials to keep mosquitoes away from skin. Light colored clothing is best.
- Eliminate stagnant water in bird baths, ponds, flower pots/trays/saucers, water fountains and water features and get rid of tires, buckets or other receptacles that could serve to contain water where mosquitoes might breed.
- Be sure to check clogged gutters and flat roofs that may have poor drainage.
- Make sure cisterns, cesspools, septic tanks, rain barrels and trash containers are covered tightly with a lid or with 16-mesh screen.
- Level the ground around residence so water can run off and not collect in low spots. Fill in holes or depressions near the building that accumulate water.
- Fill in tree rot holes and hollow stumps that hold water.
- Stock ornamental water gardens with fish (e.g. minnows, "mosquito fish" or goldfish) that eat mosquito larvae.
- Treat small pools of water with "Bti", a bacterial insecticide. Many hardware stores carry doughnut-shaped Bti briquettes (Mosquito Dunks) for this purpose. Be sure to follow the insecticide label exactly.
- Keep weeds and grass cut short; adult mosquitoes look for these shady places to rest during the hot daylight hours.
- Bird and wild game hunters should follow the usual precautions when handling wild animals and birds. They should wear gloves when handling and cleaning birds or animals to prevent blood exposure to bare hands.

Golf Carts

As we all know the island has an island exemption from the State of Maine to utilize golf carts as a form of transportation on the island. Simply, what this means is that due to our unique situation, being island residents, we can operate golf carts on public ways. This is a privilege, not a right, and with all privileges from the State this is governed by State Law. All golf cart operation must meet the following standards.

1. All golf carts must be registered through the Town Hall with the lot number displayed at the rear of the golf cart, (\$12.00)
2. All golf carts have to be insured the same as any motor vehicle, (\$50.00 to \$75.00).
3. All operators of golf carts must have a valid driver's license. There is no exception.
4. Golf carts that are operated after dark must have lights turned on.

Safe Boating Tips

- Turn-off all electrical equipment when docking your watercraft after a days activities. When accidentally left in the "on" position, they could drain your battery. "Lock" your battery switch in the off position to avoid theft and as another way in which to save your battery life.
- Secure your watercraft covers tightly and with "pitch" to allow for rapid water run-off. This will prevent sagging and pooling of water and leaves, etc.; the primary cause for canvas wear and tears.
- Ensure dock bumpers/fenders are securely fastened to your watercraft and are strategically placed, so as to avoid damage to your watercraft. Dock lines should be of adequate size to safely secure your watercraft. They should be supple, free of unnecessary knots and fraying, and be in good usable condition. Dock lines need to be secure after dockage and be adequate in number. Dock lines should NOT run across docks, for safety reasons. Secure your dock lines before leaving your slip.

4th of July Frye Island Road Race 1 mile, 5 mile & Marathon

The Recreation Department will be hosting its annual walk/run at the Frye Island Community Center at 10am on Sunday, July 3rd. There will be a \$5 entry fee and commemorative t-shirts will be available for \$10. All proceeds from the race will be used to fund recreational activities on the Island. Please arrive 30min early to allow time to register, select a T-shirt and stretch.

This year we will experiment with two different pre-registration options.

- 1) Pre-event registration in front of the Post Office from 1 – 5pm on Saturday, July 2, and
- 2) online registration at <http://tinyurl.com/FryeRace>. If you register online by Friday night, you can pick-up your event packet either at the Post Office on July 2 or the express checkout line on event day.

The Routes

The 1 mile course goes down Highpoint Dr, right on Sunset, up White Way to Independence Way and then right on South Beach Road.

The 5 mile course runs from the Community Center, down Highpoint, right onto Sunset, left onto Leisure, past the marina, then left onto Ridge and back to the Community Center.

This is the third year we'll be offering a marathon option. The marathon course will be 4 loops along the 5 mile course (before the other races begin), then the 1 mile fun run and lastly the 5 mile race. The marathon runners will be self-starting and self-timing and should begin their run at whatever time allows them to arrive at the start of the 1 mile race at 10am.

If you live along the course and could offer to host a water stop, please let me know. I'd also welcome any help people could provide with race preparation, registration and timing.
