Town News

Island Manager's Comments

Greetings everyone:

Water Distribution System: We plan to work on the water line through out the summer in order to get it finished as soon as we can. There just isn't enough time at the beginning and end of the season so please bear with us. We will suspend the installation on the weekends but I urge you to be very cautious when traveling in the work zone as workers are in and out of the trenches and we have moving equipment in the roadway. Also there could be some soft areas where the crews have been digging.

Boat Registrations: If you have a Maine boat that you need to re-register I would urge you to use the service provided by the Inland Fisheries and Wildlife Department. I recently re-registered my boat from my home computer and it only took me about 5 minutes. I was really impressed with the service. I printed a temporary registration and within a few days I had my permanent registration and the appropriate stickers. You can access this service from a link on our web-site.

Taxes: I realize that it is a bit early but I want to remind everyone that the second half of the 2011 property tax is due June 30th. Interest will start to accrue on July 1st for all unpaid taxes.

SAD 6 Budget Meeting: State law requires a referendum election to validate the school budget that was passed on June 2nd. This election will be held on Tuesday, June 14th. This is a *Yes* or *No* vote. Yes to approve the budget that was passed at the budget hearing and No to reject it. The polls will open at the Frye Island Community Center at 10:00 AM and will remain open until 8:00 PM. All registered voters can participate in this referendum election by voting in person at the Community Center, or by absentee ballot. The absentee ballots are available at the Town Office. All absentee ballots must be returned before the polls close at 8PM on the 14th to be counted. Any ballot received after that time will be disqualified. The following table compares the towns shares for the 2010/2011 and the 2011/2012 fiscal years.

When reviewing this table, remember that the school operates on a fiscal year (July 1 – June 30) and we operate on a calendar year (Jan. 1 – Dec 30). What that means to us is that we will only save ½ of the \$43,295 this year. That is \$21, 650 for the July through December period. The budget for 2012 will include the new monthly rate through June 2012 and our best guess for the July through December period.

E-Tickets: We are now up to 140 accounts with quite a lot more users of these accounts. Knock on wood.....things appear to be going quite well. We had very few problems this past week. We have had a couple of account holders experience difficulty setting up their user name and password. We haven't been able to figure the reason for that yet but most have been successful. As a reminder, once I have entered an account in the system, the system will generate an e-mail to the email address I enter into the system. I know that I miss-read one of the emails so please if you are completing an application print very clearly. If I put the wrong email address in the system you won't get the email to validate your account and it will not work. The reason we do it this way is because the system will automatically generate an email when your account goes below the trigger balance. If you selected option 1 you will need to come into the office to replenish your account. If you selected option 2 it will notify you that an ACH transfer has been initiated. It will also send a statement to your email at the end of the month. So it is important that we have the correct email address in the system. When the system prompts you for a user name, it is your email address; right down to and including the .com or .net or .whatever else. It is not your name or anything else. The user name is not case sensitive but the password is. The validation email will also allow you to establish the password to access your account. This can be anything you want but it is case sensitive. We did have a little glitch last week when a couple of ID Cards wouldn't scan but that was fixed quite quickly. I think, and hope, that everyone that has used the EZ Ride system is pleased with it. We still have quite a few EZ Ride cards in the office so if you applied for an account but don't have your card you can stop in and get it.

ROAD, FIRE LANE AND LOT NUMBERS

All owners and renters should know the road, fire lane and lot number where they are located in the event of a fire, medical or police emergency.

This information will greatly expedite the response time for the emergency service that is answering your call. Time is critical!

All road signs and fire lanes signs on the island are clearly marked.

Every house, by town ordinance, shall have a lot number in large, contrasting colors that can be seen by emergency responders approaching from either direction.

If possible, a person should meet the emergency responders on the street and at night turn on all outdoor lighting.

If you have any questions or concerns regarding your road, fire lane or lot number, they can be addressed by any member of the fire department.

Safe Boating Tips

Quail Circle Clean-up Day June 25th at 8:30 AM

Any and all members and slip holders in the Quail Circle Tie-up Facility are invited to participate in Quail Circle Clean-up day on Saturday, June 25th.

- Watercraft towing a person or persons on water-skis, surfboards, aquaplanes, or similar devices shall not operate within water safety zones (area of water within 200 feet of any shoreline, mainland or island). Exception: to drop-off or pickup passengers, while ensuring that persons and property are not endangered in the process.
- No person shall operate any watercraft for the purpose of towing a person on water-skis, surfboards, or similar devices on any waterway between the hours of ½ hour after sunset until ½ hour before sunrise.
- Any person being towed on water skis, surfboards, or similar devices must wear a life jacket, life belt, or similar life saving device. No watercraft operator shall tow anyone involved in the aforementioned activities unless the person being towed has complied with this requirement.
- Watercraft towing a person on water skis, surfboard, or other similar devices must have a person in the watercraft who is at least 12 years of age, in addition to the operator, who is in a position to continually observe the person/s being towed.
