# Town News

## Island Manager's Comments

**Greetings everyone:**

**Water Distribution System:** The crews are continuing the installation along the north end of Leisure Lane. Please be very cautious when traveling in the work zone. There could be some soft areas where the crews have been digging.

**Taxes:** Don't forget the second half of the 2011 property tax is due June 30<sup>th</sup>. Interest will start to accrue on July 1<sup>st</sup> for all unpaid taxes. We will not be sending a second billing.

**Fire Works:** The fire works are scheduled for Saturday July 2<sup>nd</sup>. We always get a number of inquires about what time they will start and the best info we have is when the pyrotechnic technicians think it is dark enough.

The budget passed results in the following shares for each of the communities in the school district.

**SAD 6 Budget Validation Election:** The Budget Validation Election was held Tuesday June 14<sup>th</sup>. The polls were open at the Community Center from 10:00AM until 8:00 PM. We had 2 voters that voted in person and 0 absentee voters. The election validated the budget that was passed at the Budget Hearing on June 2<sup>nd</sup>. When reviewing this table, remember that the school operates on a fiscal year (July 1 – June 30) and we operate on a calendar year (Jan. 1 – Dec 30). What that means to us is that we will only save ½ of the \$43,295 this year. That is \$21, 650 for the July through December period. The budget for 2012 will include the new monthly rate through June 2012 and our best guess for the July through December period.

**Frye Island:** I have heard Frye Island called a number of things since I've been here but a couple of things have come to the fore front recently. One of those is "unique" and Frye Island certainly is unique, especially in its form of governance. We have three separate voting groups on the Island with very distinct requirements. They are as follows:

- **Frye Island Incorporated (FII):** In truth, FII has nothing to do with the governance of Frye Island. When the original developer suffered through bankruptcy, the vast majority of the assets on the Island were transferred to the existing property owners doing business as Frye Island Incorporated. A for-profit property management corporation registered with the State of Maine. The bi-laws of FII established the operating parameters for the corporation and awarded a single voting share in the corporation to the owner of each lot on the Island. Therefore, every lot owner on the Island is a stock holder in FII and is eligible to vote at the FII stockholders meeting which is normally held on Labor Day weekend. If a person owns more than one lot, they are entitled to a vote for each lot they own. All that being said, the Town does have a very close business relationship with FII.
- **Board of Island Trustees (BIT):** When Frye Island became a Town in 1998, a charter commission developed the charter which details the processes to be used to govern the Town. In order to provide the most representation possible the commission established the BIT. The details to qualify as a member of the BIT are in the charter which can be reviewed on line. However, very basically the charted gives the BIT three main functions:
  - To review and approve the Town budget before it is presented to the town for ratification at the annual town meeting.
  - To review and approve land use ordinances before they are presented to the Town for ratification at the annual town meeting, and
  - To establish the rates to be charged for the use of the ferry.All owners of a dwelling on the Island are entitled to two (2) votes in BIT business.
- **Town Voters:** Islanders that can prove residency on Frye Island and are willing to sign an oath produced by the State of Maine are able to register to vote in Maine and are allowed to vote in all Municipal, State and Federal elections as a voting resident of Frye Island. If a person registers to vote in Frye Island they can not be registered in any other state or municipality. A person must be register to vote in Frye Island in order to be considered a candidate for selectmen or to vote for Selectmen at the annual

town meeting, to vote to ratify the budget and other issues presented by the BIT, and on SAD #6 issues. This also qualifies a person to vote in State and federal elections.

**Recreation:** The other thing I frequently hear is that Frye Island is a Recreational Community. We know that other communities have recreational facilities, but the primary reason that many, if not most, Frye Islanders are here is because of the recreational opportunities that are available. Where else can one be surrounded by the pristine waters of Sebago Lake and the water activities that the lake affords? We are truly blessed with many beautiful beaches, a marina, and boat ramps to provide and support water related activities and we also have a very challenging golf course, tennis courts, basket ball court, a ball field, a play ground and a community center. Unfortunately, at least in my opinion, we haven't maintained some of these facilities as we should have nor are we utilizing them to their maximum potential. Consequently, we are reforming the Recreation Committee to review all of these facilities and to develop plans, both short term and long term, so that we can best utilize all of these wonderful assets. If you agree and are willing to help the folks that are still on the Committee please see their article in this weeks FINS.

**E-Tickets:** We are still accepting applications for the EZ Ride system. Our goal is to eventually have all Islanders enrolled in the system. If you haven't yet applied please consider it. Applications are available on the Frye Island web site or in the office.

**Meeting Reminder:** The next Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee's meeting has been scheduled for Friday June 24th at the Community Center. It will begin at 6 PM.

## **Chapter 113 Dog Control Ordinance**

### **Section 1, Purpose:**

The purpose of this ordinance is to control dogs throughout the Town of Frye Island in the interest of health, safety and general welfare of its residents.

### **Section 2, Violations:**

- Barking dogs: No person shall own, keep or harbor any dog which, by loud, frequent or habitual barking, howling or yelping, shall disturb the peace of any person or persons for more than 30 minutes.
- Dogs running at large: No person shall allow a dog to run at large. At large shall be defined as "off the premises of the owner and not under the control of any person whose presence and attention would reasonably control the conduct of the dog."
- Dangerous dogs: A dog which bites a human being in an unprovoked situation shall be considered a dangerous dog and defined as such per state animal welfare laws.
- Beaches: No person shall allow a dog on any of the public beaches on Frye Island between the hours of 10:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M.

It shall be a violation of this chapter for any person who owns a dog, or anyone having a dog under his or her control, to fail to immediately remove and lawfully dispose of any feces left by the dog on any of the public beaches on Frye Island.

### **Section 3, Enforcement:**

- Any person, who shall violate the provisions of this ordinance, shall upon the first occasion thereof, be given a written warning, which shall include the date and time it was issued.
- Upon conviction of any subsequent violations within a period of six (6) months from such warning, the person found to be in violation shall be punished by a civil penalty according to the following schedule:
  - First Offence \$50.00
  - Second Offence \$100.00
  - Third and Subsequent Offences \$200.00

Any Police Officer, Animal Control Officer, Cumberland County Sheriff or Constable within the Town of Frye Island shall have the authority to enforce this ordinance.

### **Section 4, Impounding:**

Any Police Officer, Animal Control Officer, Cumberland County Sheriff, or Constable within the Town of Frye Island may seize, impound, or restrain any dog violating this ordinance or State law.

1. For emergencies always dial 911
2. For non emergency business dial 893-2810 in area code 207. This is the number to the dispatch center that the island contracts with. Contact will be made with the police department in real time by way of radio, phone, pager or email via BlackBerry. A call will be returned to the complainant shortly after we receive the information from dispatch.
3. Please do not leave police messages with the folks at the Town Hall, Public Works, Fire Department or other Town departments. In the past they have all been kind enough to relay messages to the police department but this is not their responsibility.

## Safe Boating Tips

### Quail Circle Clean-up Day June 25<sup>th</sup> at 8:30 AM

Any and all members and slip holders in the Quail Circle Tie-up Facility are invited to participate in Quail Circle Clean-up day on Saturday, June 25<sup>th</sup>.

Bring a pair of gloves, a weed whacker, brush cutters and your muscles.

Work will consist of a general cleaning of the area, cutting brush, removing old downed brush and cutting grass.

Many hands make light work, so bring a friend or fellow boater and pitch in. It will only take a couple of hours of your time.

Marina Committee member Tony Kurgan will be providing beverages upon completion of work.

- After a day on the water, remove any visible vegetation, animals, mud, fishing gear and all equipment exposed to the water while you are at the launch ramp. Frye Island has a wash down station at it's ramp located at Long Beach Marina.
- Get into the habit of cleaning your boating gear every time that you travel from one body of water to the next. Invasive water species are so small, you may not realize that they're "hitching a ride".
- The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service recommends: "Do not release unused bait into the waters that you are fishing; dump it into a proper trash receptacle on land far away from any water body." This will help in reducing the number of invasive species from our precious water resources.
- Milfoil/Invasive Plants Sticker-"A person may not place or operate a motor boat or personal watercraft on the inland waters of the State of Maine unless a current/valid lake and river protection sticker, issued annually, is permanently affixed to each side of the bow, above the waterline and approximately 3 inches behind the validation sticker." These stickers are available at the Town Office on Frye Island.
