Island Manager's Comments

Greetings everyone:

Water Distribution System: The crews are continuing the installation along the north end of Leisure Lane. Please be very cautious when traveling in the work zone. There could be some soft areas where the crews have been digging.

Taxes: You have one more week to pay the second half of the 2011 taxes if you haven't already. Interest will start to accrue on July 1st for all unpaid taxes.

E-Tickets: We are still accepting applications for the EZ Ride system. Our goal is to eventually have all Islanders enrolled in the system. If you haven't yet applied please consider it. Applications are available on the Frye Island web site or in the office. If you still have last years bar-coded tickets please consider turning them in for credit. Some of them I have seen are wrinkled and folded and don't scan well requiring the ferry mate to key in the ticket number to verify its authenticity so you can help us save time by turning them in at the office. If you have an EZ Ride account we can credit your account the value of the tickets; if not, we can issue the new tickets.

Setback Reductions: The following property owner has applied to the Board of Appeals for a setback reduction. A meeting has been scheduled for 7:00 PM July 15th at the Community Center:

Details of this request are available in the Town Office. This is an open meeting and the general public is invited to attend.

Fire Works: The fire works are scheduled for Saturday July 2nd and will begin as soon as the pyrotechnic technician feels is dark enough. I want to remind those people that have boats in the Marina that some will have to be moved before the fireworks display can take place. Boats in the Marina from slips 84 to 130 on the beach side and slips 67 to 131 on the road plus the Jet Ski slips and boats on all of the slips on the southern end must be removed by 5:00 PM. If you have a boat in one of these slips please move it out before 5:00PM. If you don't, we will have it moved for you at your expense. The fire works display can not be set up with boats in those slips.

Bingo: Neill Bovaird has volunteered to run the Bingo this year. We have them every Monday at the Community Center beginning at 7:00PM. I believe they plan to have soft drinks and snack food available. Please remember, State law states: "Persons under the age of 16 years shall not be permitted to take part in the conduct of, nor participate in, the game of "Beano" or "Bingo," nor shall such minor be admitted to the playing area unless accompanied by parent, guardian or other responsible person". Violation of this law could result in a fine to Frye Islanders Corp and jeopardize any future bingo. The recreation department holds "candy bar" bingo for the younger folks.

Meeting Reminder: The next Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee's meeting has been scheduled for Friday June 24th at the Community Center. **It will begin at 6 PM.** I believe I told a couple of people that the meeting started at 7:00 PM but that is wrong. Please note that the meeting will begin at 6:00 PM.



Fire Department Notice

Rules pertaining to the use of open fires in screened enclosures and chimeneas.

Open fires in a screened enclosure designed for such use or chimenea are permitted under the following conditions:

- The device must be used only on an acceptable permit-required burn day within the state. (A permit will not be necessary to use the device, but it can only be used on a day on which burning is allowed.)
- The device must stand on sand or dirt in a wide-open area to prevent any spread of fire.
- The device must be placed away from any structure and **cannot** be situated on a porch, deck, or other similar area.
- The device must be continuously monitored by an adult.
- A fire hose or bucket of water must be nearby.

Anyone using one of these devices accepts **full responsibility** for their actions if a mishap occurs.

Late Night Noise Reports

I would like to clear up an issue with reporting incidents to the police, especially noise complaints. In order for the police to deal with a noise complaint we need to be made aware of the complaint in real time or as the noise is on going. We are in high season with a police officer on duty every day for the overnight shift. If you are annoyed with the volume of a gathering you should call **207-893-2810**. This dispatch center is manned by several employees 24/7. Your information will be taken and a Frye Island police officer will be dispatched to the area of the complaint to investigate. The police officer will determine if the noise is reasonable for the time of day, per Maine State law. If the noise is unreasonable contact will be made with the offending party and a warning issued, per Maine State law. If the noise starts up after a warning has been issued, a second call to the police has to be made. The police officer responding to the second complaint will meet with the caller and request a written statement be filled out before making contact with the offending party. If the statement is filled out a criminal summons or arrest for Disorderly Conduct will occur. If the statement is not filled out, a second contact may not be made with the offending party.

For those of you who make complaints about loud gatherings and parties the next day or in some cases days later, demanding something be done, we can offer you nothing more than a sympathetic ear as you air your grievance.

Illegal Fireworks

Possession of fireworks in the State of Maine is illegal. This topic also runs hand in hand with the ongoing problem with late night noise, not to mention the obvious fire and personal injury implications. Let's exercise some common sense with this topic.
