Town News

Island Manager's Comments

Greetings everyone:

Water Distribution System: The crews are continuing the installation along the north end of Leisure Lane. Please be very cautious when traveling in the work zone. There could be some soft areas where the crews have been digging.

Taxes: Yesterday was the final day to pay the second half of the 2011 property tax without accruing interest. Interest at 7% of the outstanding balance will begin accruing on all taxes received from this point on. Liens on unpaid taxes will be issued during the 3rd week of September.

E-Tickets: We are still accepting applications for the EZ Ride system. Our goal is to eventually have all Islanders enrolled in the system. If you haven't yet applied please consider it. Applications are available on the Frye Island web site or in the office. If you still have last years bar-coded tickets please consider turning them in for credit. Some of them I have seen are wrinkled and folded and don't scan well requiring the ferry mate to key in the ticket number to verify its authenticity so you can help us save time by turning them in at the office. If you have an EZ Ride account we can credit your account the value of the tickets; if not, we can issue the new tickets.

Ferry Tickets: As a courtesy, the ferry service has been accepting ferry tickets from Islanders to post on the bulletin board. The requirement is that the tickets be in an envelop, with a name clearly marked on the front of the envelop. Unfortunately, a few folks have just left a ticket with no envelope and they have gotten mixed up with other tickets the mates have collected. So the ferry crews will no longer accept tickets to be posted on the bulletin board unless they are in an envelope; nor will they be responsible if the ticket does not get to the intended party. The office does not supply envelopes. Remember, if you own an EZ Ride account, you can send an electronic ticket to any one you like and not have to worry about posting it on the bulletin board.

Saturday Office Hours: Please note that the office will be opening at 8:00AM Saturday morning and closing at 12 noon on Saturday so plan your business accordingly.

Roadway safety: Please be very careful on the roads. This tends to be one of the busiest weekends of the season and there will be a lot of folks walking, bicycling and driving on the roads. So please stay alert and drive, ride or walk with care not only this weekend but all season.

Setback Reductions: The following property owner has applied to the Board of Appeals for a setback reduction. A meeting has been scheduled for 7:00 PM July 15th at the Community Center:

Details of this request are available in the Town Office. This is an open meeting and the general public is invited to attend.

Fire Works: The fire works are scheduled for Saturday July 2nd and will begin as soon as the pyrotechnic technician feels is dark enough. I want to remind those people that have boats in the Marina that some will have to be moved before the fireworks display can take place. Boats in the Marina from slips 84 to 104 on the beach side and slips 67 to 131 on the road plus the Jet Ski slips and boats on all of the slips on the southern end must be removed by 5:00 PM. If you have a boat in one of these slips please move it out before 5:00PM. If you don't, we will have it moved for you at your expense. The fire works display can not be set up with boats in those slips.

Bingo: Neill Bovaird has volunteered to run the Bingo this year. We have them every Monday at the Community Center beginning at 7:00PM this coming Monday. I believe they plan to have soft drinks and snack food available. Please remember, State law states: "Persons under the age of 16 years shall not be permitted to take part in the conduct of, nor participate in, the game of "Beano" or "Bingo," nor shall such minor be admitted to the playing area unless accompanied by parent, guardian or other responsible person". Violation of this law could result in a fine to Frye Islanders Corp and jeopardize any future bingo.

The recreation department holds "candy bar" bingo for the younger folks.

Frye Island Beach Ordinance

Chapter 118--- Ordinance for use of Public Beaches in the Town of Frye Island, Maine, Providing Penalties for Violation.

118 – 1 Title.

This Ordinance shall be known as the “Ordinance for the use of Public Beaches in the Town of Frye Island, Maine.”

118 – 2 Purpose.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to provide rules for the use of Public Beaches.

118 – 3 Requirements.

- a. No open fires on beaches. (*).
- b. No camping overnight on beaches.
- c. No personal items left on beaches overnight.
- d. NO DOGS on beaches between the hours of 10:00 am and 5:00 pm. (Must clean up after your dogs).
- e. No powered watercraft is to be left or tied up on Frye Island Public beaches. Pick up and drop-offs only. No power boats are to enter swimming areas. All power boats accessing Frye Island Public beaches must have a current resident or a temporary rental Frye Island sticker.
- f. Canoes, kayaks, rowboats and paddleboats must be pulled up beyond sandy area, racked, or in designated areas only.
- g. No littering. Use trash containers provided.
- h. Moorings must be out beyond swimming areas, and must not interfere with swim areas. Noncompliance with mooring placement will result in the mooring being removed.

118 – 4 Violations and Penalties.

Any person who violates any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a civil violation and, upon conviction, shall be fined not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) and not more than five hundred (\$500.00), with each incident being considered a separate violation: all fines accrue to the Town. A warning may be issued for a first offense.

118 – 5 Enforcement.

This Ordinance shall be enforced by the Town of Frye Island Police Department, the Cumberland County Sheriff’s Department, or their designees.

The 2011 Fireworks

The 2011 fireworks are scheduled for Saturday evening, July 2nd at dusk.

Reminder: This year, like all others, we will have to move some of the boats out of the Marina for the fire works. The boats to be removed are slip numbers:

**SLIP(S) #84 THROUGH #130 LAKE SIDE
AND SLIP(S) #67 THROUGH #131 ROAD SIDE**



Maine Forest Service to Conduct “Wildfire Risk Assessments” on Frye Island

The Maine Forest Service’s Forest Protection Division has developed a program to help communities reduce the risk of wildfires near their homes. Throughout Maine, an average of 550 wildfires is reported annually. Out of those fires, nearly three-quarters threaten, damage or destroy structures. In order to get started with the program, a small, random sample of homes (approximately 20-25) will be assessed on **Tuesday, July 12 and Wednesday, July 13, 2011** on Frye Island.

These wildfire risk assessments will be completed randomly. The assessment is designed to be completed without invading the privacy of the homeowner. Basically, the forest ranger doing the assessment completes a form with 23 questions. They range from the width of access roads and sizes of street signs, address numbers to types of shingles, siding materials and the distance of the “defensible spaces” (an area with minimal vegetation between the house and a forested area). We prefer to also work with several community members and the local fire department when we conduct these assessments.

The assessment forms do not list the name or specific address of the homeowner. Instead, a global positioning satellite (GPS) point is used. That way, the location of all the individual assessments can be viewed on a GPS map to show that most of the community has been sampled. The information gathered from the assessments and from several discussions with the Fire Chief will be summarized in a report that will be given during a presentation to the community, most likely at the annual meeting.

Please let Fire Chief Steve Persson at spersson346@gmail.com know if you do not wish to have your home and property assessed for the risk of wildfire and he will provide a list for the Forest Ranger and fire department officials who will be conducting the assessments. How to contact the Frye Island Police Department

To avoid any confusion contacting your police department, please follow these simple rules.

1. For emergencies always dial **911**
2. For non emergency business dial 893-2810 in area code 207. This is the number to the dispatch center that the island contracts with. Contact will be made with the police department in real time by way of radio, phone, pager or email via BlackBerry. A call will be returned to the complainant shortly after we receive the information from dispatch.
3. Please do not leave police messages with the folks at the Town Hall, Public Works, Fire Department or other Town departments. In the past they have all been kind enough to relay messages to the police department but this is not their responsibility.

Illegal Fireworks

Possession of fireworks in the State of Maine is illegal. This topic also runs hand in hand with the ongoing problem with late night noise, not to mention the obvious fire and personal injury implications. Let's exercise some common sense with this topic.

Safe Boating Tips

- Age Requirements-“When operating a motorboat with more than 10 horsepower, a person under the age of 12 must be under immediate supervision of a person located in the boat who is at least 16 years of age. A person under the age of 16 years may not operate personal watercraft, which includes jet skis. **A person between 16-18 years of age may operate a personal watercraft if they have successfully completed an approved education course, or if they are accompanied by a person 18 years of age or older.** Proof of age and course must be possessed while operating a personal watercraft.” For the safety of all, please abide by the above law.
- Watercraft may not be operated at a speed greater than “headway speed” while within a water safety zone (**200 feet of shore**), marina or approved anchorage. Headway speed is defined as the minimum speed necessary to maintain steerage and control of the watercraft while it is moving.
- Boaters must always consider the effects of the wash or waves created by their watercraft to piers, floats, shorelines, or property of others. The operator is civilly responsible for any damage incurred.
- Watercraft 16 feet or longer, must have a wearable U.S. Coast Guard approved Type I, II, or III PFD (personal flotation device) for each person on board PLUS at least one throw able device (Type IV) on board. Watercraft under 16 feet in length require one PFD for each person on board. All children 10 years of age and younger must wear a Type I, II, or III PFD while on board a watercraft.
