Town News

Island Manager's Comments

Greetings everyone:

Water Distribution System: The crews are continuing the installation along the north end of Leisure Lane. Please be very cautious when traveling in the work zone. There could be some soft areas where the crews have been digging.

E-Tickets: We are still accepting applications for the EZ Ride system. Our goal is to eventually have all Islanders enrolled in the system. If you haven't yet applied please consider it. Applications are available on the Frye Island web site or in the office. If you still have last years bar-coded tickets please consider turning them in for credit. Some of them I have seen are wrinkled and folded and don't scan well requiring the ferry mate to key in the ticket number to verify its authenticity so you can help us save time by turning them in at the office. If you have an EZ Ride account we can credit your account the value of the tickets; if not, we can issue the new tickets. If you have applied for an EZ Ride account you will be sent an e-mail to validate your e-mail address and set your password. Again, your user name is your full e-mail address. You can establish any password you want. Some applicants have complained about not receiving the validation e-mail. These are sent by the system...ferrysystem@fryeisland.com...as such they may be intercepted by your Spam folder so please check that out. If you didn't receive the email and there is no e-mail in the "spam" folder let me know and I will re-send it. You will not have access to your account with out validating your email and establishing your password.

Ferry Tickets: As a courtesy, the ferry service has been accepting ferry tickets from Islanders to post on the bulletin board. The requirement is that the tickets be in an envelope, with a name clearly marked on the front of the envelope. Unfortunately, a few folks have just left a ticket with no envelope and they have gotten mixed up with other tickets the mates have collected. So the ferry crews will no longer accept tickets to be posted on the bulletin board unless they are in an envelope; nor will they be responsible if the ticket does not get to the intended party. The office does not supply envelopes. Remember, if you own an EZ Ride account, you can send an electronic ticket to any one you like and not have to worry about posting it on the bulletin board.

Setback Reductions: The following property owner has applied to the Board of Appeals for a setback reduction. A meeting has been scheduled for 7:00 PM July 15th at the Community Center:

Details of this request are available in the Town Office. This is an open meeting and the general public is invited to attend.

Bingo: Neill Bovaird has volunteered to run the Bingo game this year. We have them every Monday through July and August at the Community Center beginning at 7:00PM. I believe they plan to have soft drinks and snack food available. Please remember, State law states: "Persons under the age of 16 years shall not be permitted to take part in the conduct of, nor participate in, the game of "Beano" or "Bingo," nor shall such minor be admitted to the playing area unless accompanied by parent, guardian or other responsible person". Violation of this law could result in a fine to Frye Islanders Corp and jeopardize any future bingo.

Beaches: We have been publishing the ordinance for the use of the beaches. This ordinance allows dogs on the beaches before 10:00 AM in the morning and after 5:00 PM in the evening. However, State law requires that dogs be "under control" at all times. This generally means they must be on a leash. Please be considerate of all the people using the beaches and keep your dogs off the beaches between 10:00 AM and 5:00 PM and under control when they are allowed. One of the more common complaints we hear is about dogs on the beach during the restricted hours but when questioned, no one seems to want to call the police to report any complaint. If you have any complaints requiring police action that is not an emergency, please call 207-893-2810. This will accomplish 2 things; 1- it gets the complaint recorded and, 2 – the dispatcher can contact the police officer on duty.

Speed Limits: A reminder that the speed limit on the Island is 20 Miles per hour. Please drive safely and within the speed limit. There are more and more people on the Island now and it is critical that everyone's safety be protected.

Meetings: The next scheduled Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee meeting is next Saturday, July 16. It will begin at 9:00 AM at the Community Center.



Maine Forest Service to Conduct “Wildfire Risk Assessments” on Frye Island

The Maine Forest Service’s Forest Protection Division has developed a program to help communities reduce the risk of wildfires near their homes. Throughout Maine, an average of 550 wildfires is reported annually. Out of those fires, nearly three-quarters threaten, damage or destroy structures. In order to get started with the program, a small, random sample of homes (approximately 20-25) will be assessed on **Tuesday, July 12 and Wednesday, July 13, 2011** on Frye Island.

These wildfire risk assessments will be completed randomly. The assessment is designed to be completed without invading the privacy of the homeowner. Basically, the forest ranger doing the assessment completes a form with 23 questions. They range from the width of access roads and sizes of street signs, address numbers to types of shingles, siding materials and the distance of the “defensible spaces” (an area with minimal vegetation between the house and a forested area). We prefer to also work with several community members and the local fire department when we conduct these assessments.

The assessment forms do not list the name or specific address of the homeowner. Instead, a global positioning satellite (GPS) point is used. That way, the location of all the individual assessments can be viewed on a GPS map to show that most of the community has been sampled. The information gathered from the assessments and from several discussions with the Fire Chief will be summarized in a report that will be given during a presentation to the community, most likely at the annual meeting.

Please let Fire Chief Steve Persson at spersson346@gmail.com know if you do not wish to have your home and property assessed for the risk of wildfire and he will provide a list for the Forest Ranger and fire department officials who will be conducting the assessments. There is no cost or obligation to participate in this program. Any questions may be directed to Kent Nelson, Fire Prevention Specialist, Maine Forest Service at 207-287-4989.

What is a public place? All roads or infrastructure that is operated by a government entity, in our case the Town of Frye Island. In short, when moving around the island either on foot or by other means, obvious signs of open containers of alcohol will be a violation of the Drinking in Public statute.

Once again, I ask that we use a little common sense with this. It's a small island; keep the cap on it until you are getting to where you're going.

Parking:

Despite multiple road signs and warnings in the FINS, many people continue to park incorrectly here at the mainland. Cars must be parked parallel to the road to avoid encroaching on the abutting property. They must be parked 1 foot off the pavement. If a car is parked over onto the pavement, the line of cars awaiting boarding is pushed over into the other lane, making us unable to get Emergency vehicles either on or off the ferry. While we know it must be very upsetting to return from the island to find your car gone (Cost to you is \$100. plus \$25. / day storage), imagine in the case of a medical emergency or fire, our failure to ensure passage of an ambulance or fire truck could result in the loss of lives. Please take time to park correctly at the ferry landing.



Shuttling:

Whenever we have a full ferry and leave vehicles behind, we immediately shuttle back, as opposed to making the traffic wait for the next scheduled ½ hour ferry. Sometimes this throws us off-schedule by a few minutes.

When the schedule states that there are 2 boats running, we sometimes make the decision, based on traffic, to run only one boat. We will not run 2 boats w/ only 1 or 2 cars on each; instead we shuttle one ferry non-stop.

We save not only fuel, but also wear and tear on the boats. Please allow yourselves a few extra minutes when making off-island appointments or plans.

Annual Frye Island Fourth of July Walk/Run



More than 225 participants turned out this year for the Frye Island Walk/Run – 25 more than last year and 75 more than the year before. Due to the larger number of registrations and very strong t-shirt sales we raised approximately \$2000 which will be used to fund recreational activities on the Island.

A big thank you to everyone who volunteered their time to make the event possible – Ed Charrette and Bill Fitzgerald for lining the race course, Phil and Nancy Perry for hosting a water stop at mile 2.5, Anne Johnson, Reba Orzag, Pat Karpacz and Maria Charrette for t-shirt sales, Linda Tabris, Lenore Rosenthal, Paula and Cindy Ross and Cecelia Charrette for registration and Amy Wagner for crowd control and race timing. It was a real team effort

John Cassidy was the overall winner in the 1 mile race and Elizabeth Karpacz finished fifth and was the first female finisher. Both runner are 15yrs old and bested a field of over 125 runners of all ages – quite an accomplishment. Due to the large number of runners, it was very difficult to time the race and next year we will look into electronic timing.

In the 5 miler, a lead pack of five runners emerged not too far into the race and ran together for most of the first 4 miles. Around mile 4, Matthieu Nadeau put the pedal to the metal and flew across the finish line with a time of 29:53 – setting a new course record by almost a minute (video of his finish can be seen on facebook - <http://tinyURL.com/FryeRace-FB>). Jamey Epstein crossed the line 15 seconds later, thus continuing his string of strong finishes - 1st or 2nd place in each of the last three races. Kara Waters finished third and was the first female finisher with a time of 31:07 – crushing Courtney Baker previous female course record of 33:34 by almost 2 ½ minutes.

This year only one runner, Bob Sansonetti, participated in the Dennis Stafford Memorial Marathon. Bob first crossed the line at 4hrs 42min – not content with that; rumor has it that he kept running additional laps around the island. If that is true, I think that qualifies him for first, second and third place finishes across all divisions.
