Town News

Island Manager's Comments

Greetings everyone:

Water Distribution System: The crews are continuing the installation along the north end of Leisure Lane. Please be very cautious when traveling in the work zone. There could be some soft areas where the crews have been digging.

E-Tickets: We had a "bug" in the software that was discovered recently when a number of applicants were unable to validate their accounts. The way the system works, or is supposed to, is once the application information is entered into the system, an email is automatically generated and sent to the account owner. This email has two purposes: first, it confirms that the correct email address has been entered into the system, and, secondly, it allows the account owner to establish his or her password which is needed to access their account. We had about 20 accounts that were all entered about the same time that couldn't validate their email or establish their password with out getting an error. The "bug" that caused that has been fixed and a new welcome e-mail has been sent to those affected. Most of those have now validated their accounts and are ready to go. We were at a loss as to why there were only a few that were not able to validate, while most could, but the developer discovered the bug and fixed it. I apologize for the problem and any inconvenience it caused.

We have also experienced a few problems with our internet connection through Fairpoint. This is one of the weak links in our system because the software program is hosted on an off-site server which must be accessed through Fairpoint. The system is not usable without this link. We are looking into the feasibility of hosting the program on site which should increase its reliability. I met this week with the networking people to discuss the needs and the security requirements. They have assured me that this can be done and they are preparing a cost estimate to accomplish this.

Setback Reductions: The following property owner has applied to the Board of Appeals for a setback reduction. A meeting has been scheduled for 7:00 PM tonight at the Community Center:

Details of this request are available in the Town Office. This is an open meeting and the general public is invited to attend.

Water System: The public water system on the Island consists of three main parts: the raw water supply, the purification system, and the distribution system. We take water from Sebago Lake at the facility on Ridge Road and pump it to the filtration building adjacent to the Maintenance building. From there we pump it through the distribution system to supply the cottages on the island. The raw water is pumped through a series of multi media filters which remove approximately 70% of the particulate matter that may be in the water. Then the water passes through a bank of 14 bag type filters that remove the remaining particles. The water then goes through a chlorination process before it is directed into a 60,000 gallon storage tank. Another set of pumps takes water from the storage tank and delivers it through the distribution system to the cottages on the island. The water system is tested daily to insure that it complies with all of the state drinking water requirements.

We measure the water flow through the system in two ways; total flow in gallons and rate of flow in gallons per minute. They both have an impact on when we have to clean the Multi-media filters and when we need to change the bag filters. Ideally, the flow rate through the system would be 60 to 80 gallons per minute. Over the weekend of the 4th, there were times that we were pumping water through the system at a rate of 200 gallons per minute. The system will do it and the water still meets all of the water quality requirements but it does require that we clean the Multi-media filters and change the filter bags much more frequently. In a 58 hour period over the 4th of July weekend, we went through \$2966 worth of filters, not including the labor required to change them.

That is kind of a long lead in to my request; but, if you water your lawn, please do it at night, the same applies to your gardens, and do your laundry later in the evening or at night. Anything we can do to control the rate the waters flow through the system will save labor and filters and ultimately save us all money. Thanks for your help.

Speed Limits: A reminder that the speed limit on the Island is 20 Miles per hour. Please drive safely and within the speed limit. There are more and more people on the Island now and it is critical that everyone's safety be protected.

Meetings: The next scheduled Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee meeting is next Saturday, July 16. It will begin at 9:00 AM at the Community Center.

Public Hearing: There will be a Public Hearing on Saturday August 6th to discuss the Park & Ride facility being considered for the mainland.



Dialing 9-1-1 will dispatch the Frye Island Fire Department Medical First Responders and the Raymond Rescue. The Raymond Dispatch Center will also notify the Ferry Captain for the emergency run. This will occur during normal operating hours and during off hours

State your name, your location and the nature of the emergency

Stay at your location until help arrives. Medical personnel are responding to your location. If you leave that location you may bypass responding rescue personnel. Time is critical in an emergency!

Dialing 9-1-1- will dispatch the Frye Island and Raymond Fire Department's. Raymond Dispatch will also notify the ferry.

State your name, your location and the nature of the emergency. Get out of the building if there is a fire.

All owners and visitors should know the street, lot number, fire lane and a nearby pertinent landmark where they are located in the event of a fire, medical or police emergency

This information will greatly expedite the response time for the emergency service that is answering your call. Time is critical!

All streets and fire lanes on the island are clearly marked

What is a public place? All roads or infrastructure that is operated by a government entity, in our case the Town of Frye Island. In short, when moving around the island either on foot or by other means, obvious signs of open containers of alcohol will be a violation of the Drinking in Public statute.

Once again, I ask that we use a little common sense with this. It's a small island; keep the cap on it until you are getting to where you're going.

Shuttling:

Whenever we have a full ferry and leave vehicles behind, we immediately shuttle back, as opposed to making the traffic wait for the next scheduled ½ hour ferry. Sometimes this throws us off-schedule by a few minutes.

When the schedule states that there are 2 boats running, we sometimes make the decision, based on traffic, to run only one boat. We will not run 2 boats w/ only 1 or 2 cars on each; instead we shuttle one ferry non-stop.

Frye Island Marina Committee

- Milfoil/Invasive Plants Sticker—"A person may not place or operate a motor boat or personal watercraft on the inland waters of the State of Maine unless a current/valid lake and river protection sticker, issued annually, is permanently affixed to each side of the bow, above the waterline and approximately 3 inches behind the validation sticker." These stickers are available at the Town Office on Frye Island.

A Maine registered boat will have a combined registration/invasive plant sticker system.

- After a day on the water, remove any visible vegetation, animals, mud, fishing gear and all equipment exposed to the water while you are at the launch ramp. Frye Island has a wash down station at it's ramp located at Long Beach Marina.
