# Town News

## Island Manager's Comments

### Greetings everyone:

**Water Distribution System:** The crews are continuing the installation along the north end of Leisure Lane. Please be very cautious when traveling in the work zone. There could be some soft areas where the crews have been digging.

**E-Tickets:** We now have 257 EZ Ride account owners and approximately 525 users so we are getting there. I think the system is really beginning to be what we had hoped. (I hope that didn't jinx it.) Every week now we are experiencing fewer problems. We really want to thank everyone for their patience and understanding as we have worked through the start-up. Especially the ferry crews. They have been on the front line working diligently all along as we have worked our way through all of the startup issues.

We are going to move forward with the new server so that we can host the system in house. The networking people have assured me we can do this and do it securely so that all of our records are safe and secure. We are planning to do this as soon as we can get the equipment we need so that it can be implemented this season. I want this to be our start-up season so that we can work out all of the bugs now so that next year we will have smooth sailing through the whole season (how's that for optimism).

Hosting the program in house will actually be less expensive than hosting it remotely when we add in all of the other expenses that we would have had to make in order for the system to be faster and more reliable.

**Ferry Tickets:** A few things should be said about ferry tickets.

1. We can not and will not be able to let people ride the ferry and pick up the appropriate ticket from a relative or friend once on the island. I know we did this in the past but the new eTicket system has specific sequencing involved to ticket passengers and verify the ferry load for security purposes. So please don't plan to do this and don't get all bent out of shape when the ferry crew denies it.
2. We do allow people to send tickets to the ferry trailer in advance for posting on the bulletin board. However, neither the ferry service nor the Town holds any responsibility for the tickets left there. If you do this, the tickets must be in an envelope marked clearly with the name of the intended recipient and the donor. The

office does not provide envelopes. We had a situation recently when tickets were left for some family members, but because there are more than one family with the same name on the Island the wrong people got the tickets intended for someone else. All very innocent but a family got left without tickets. The easiest and safest way, if you have an account, is to purchase a ticket against your account, save it to your desktop or document and then attach it to an email that you can send to whom ever.

3. If you still have tickets that were purchased last year, take a look because they have an expiration date on them. Some of these may be getting close. The expiration date is 18 months from the date of purchase which gives people plenty of time to use them but if you don't think you will, you should bring them in to the office and exchange them, or credit them to your account. I know this was never done in the past but periodically it is desirable to purge the system of the old tickets so please take a look at them and then take appropriate action. It could save a lot of anguish later on.

**Recreation:** I would dare say the greatest attraction of Frye Island is the recreational opportunities it affords to both young and old alike. Obviously, the fact that we are surrounded by Sebago Lake, affords us recreational opportunities that most don't enjoy. But the island itself has many outstanding assets as well including the Community Center, the ball field, tennis courts, beaches etc. Like the Golf Committee for the Golf Course and the Marina Committee for the Marina, the Recreation Committee has general over-site of the operation of these assets once the policy is approved by the Executive Committee. This committee has recently been re-organized and is becoming very active, which I feel will be a great asset to the Island. The Committee members are currently in the process of reviewing all of the facilities we have, including some we don't but they think we should, so that a plan and a policy can be developed to present to the Town Executive Committee for review and approval. It is doubtful that any major changes in the facilities will take place this season because of the time required to put the plan together for Executive Committee approval but the Rec. Committee members are working in full force to accomplish this. A meeting of the Rec. Committee has been scheduled for Sunday morning July 31. If you have questions or thoughts to share, this meeting, like all meetings of Town organizations is open to the public.





# Fire Department

## Open Fires

Open fires in a screened enclosure designed for such use or a chimeneas are permitted with the following conditions:

It must be used only on an acceptable permit required burn day within the state. (A permit will not be necessary to use the device but it must be a day in which burning is allowed).

The device must be on sand or dirt in a wide open area to prevent any spread of fire. It must be placed away from any structure and CAN NOT be situated on a porch, deck or other similar area. It must be continuously monitored by an adult. A fire hose or bucket of water must be nearby. The fire department has the authority to extinguish any fire that constitutes a hazard.

**A camp fire is not permitted or is any burning of slash, leaves, branches or tree trunks. A person using one of these devices accepts full responsibility for their action if a mishap occurs.**

The Forest Service determines the class day every morning. They broadcast this information over the radio to notify all the fire departments. The Frye Island Fire Department gets this information over their portable radios. In addition, local fire departments, like Raymond, give out this information in their morning radio announcement. They give the class day and whether or not permits will be issued. If conditions are extremely dry or if there are high winds, there probably will be no permits issued. A call to the Raymond Fire Department dispatcher or asking one of our own members should give you the answer.

Class Days are grouped into five (5) categories.

Class 1 is when there is very little potential danger.

Class 2 is when there is some danger.

Class 3 is when there is danger present.

Class 4 is when there is moderate danger.

Class 5 is when there is extreme danger or fire threat.

### ***Jet Ski Operation***

State law states that one can only operate a watercraft using headway speed within 200' of any shoreline. Headway speed is only enough speed to steer your watercraft. The area of Beach #10 in particular has been mentioned several times. I want the jet skiers in that area to know that we will be paying particular attention to that area for fast and erratic operation.


## Successful Dinner and Auction

## Shuttling:

Whenever we have a full ferry and leave vehicles behind, we immediately shuttle back, as opposed to making the traffic wait for the next scheduled ½ hour ferry. Sometimes this throws us off-schedule by a few minutes.

When the schedule states that there are 2 boats running, we sometimes make the decision, based on traffic, to run only one boat. We will not run 2 boats w/ only 1 or 2 cars on each; instead we shuttle one ferry non-stop.

We save not only fuel, but also wear and tear on the boats. Please allow yourselves a few extra minutes when making off-island appointments or plans.

Frye Island Marina Committee

- Age Requirements-"When operating a motorboat with more than 10 horsepower, a person under the age of 12 must be under immediate supervision of a person located in the boat who is at least 16 years of age. A person under the age of 16 years may not operate personal watercraft, which includes jet skis. **A person between 16-18 years of age may operate a personal watercraft if they have successfully completed an approved education course, or if they are accompanied by a person 18 years of age or older.** Proof of age and course must be possessed while operating a personal watercraft." For the safety of all, please abide by the above law.
- Watercraft may not be operated at a speed greater than "headway speed" while within a water safety zone (**200 feet of shore**), marina or approved anchorage. Headway speed is defined as the minimum speed necessary to maintain steerage and control of the watercraft while it is moving.
