# Town News

## Island Manager's Comments

### Greetings everyone:

**Water Distribution System:** The crews are continuing the installation along the north end of Leisure Lane. Please be very cautious when traveling in the work zone. There could be some soft areas where the crews have been digging.

**E-Tickets:** We now have 260 EZ Ride account owners and 650 total users. As I said last week, the system is really taking shape. I get very few problems or complaints now. Once in a while, a transaction gets lost in space somewhere and the actual posting gets delayed but they have all been posted accurately. This has only happened a few times in the thousands of transactions the system has processed so it is a very minor issue.

I have ordered the new server and the necessary support equipment. We haven't received it yet but anticipate delivery soon. We will get it installed as soon as it comes in.

Hosting the program in house will actually be less expensive than hosting it remotely when we add in all of the other expenses that we would have had to make in order for the system to be faster and more reliable.

**Navy Day on Frye Island (USS Spruance):** I want to thank everyone for helping to make the day a great one for the men and women serving on the USS Spruance last Saturday. We hosted a couple of young men for dinner that night and they couldn't have been more pleased with everything. This was a true testament to the character and the generosity of the residents of Frye Island.

**Condolences:** We have learned that Tom Burgess' mother passed away on Wednesday. Tom and his wife Judy are long time Islanders. We send our deepest sympathy to Tom and his family during this difficult time.



### ***Jet Ski Operation***

In the last couple of weeks I have received a number of complaints from residents on the west shore complaining about jet skis operating too fast within the 200' shoreline zone. State law states that one can only operate a watercraft using headway speed within 200' of any shoreline. Headway speed is only enough speed to steer your watercraft. The area of Beach #10 in particular has been mentioned several times. I want the jet skiers in that area to know that we will be paying particular attention to that area for fast and erratic operation.

### ***Alcohol in Public Places***

As we all know, back in 1998 Frye Island Seceded from the Town of Standish and became its own town. This brought many changes to the way laws are interpreted and enforced. Alcohol violations are one of the many interpretations that need to be addressed. First, consumption of alcohol or being in possession of an open container of alcohol in a public place is illegal. What is a public place? All roads or infrastructure that is operated by a government entity, in our case the Town of Frye Island. In short, when moving around the island either on foot or by other means, obvious signs of open containers of alcohol will be a violation of the Drinking in Public statute.

Once again, I ask that we use a little common sense with this. It's a small island; keep the cap on it until you are getting to where you're going.

## Shuttling:

Whenever we have a full ferry and leave vehicles behind, we immediately shuttle back, as opposed to making the traffic wait for the next scheduled ½ hour ferry. Sometimes this throws us off-schedule by a few minutes.

When the schedule states that there are 2 boats running, we sometimes make the decision, based on traffic, to run only one boat. We will not run 2 boats w/ only 1 or 2 cars on each; instead we shuttle one ferry non-stop.

We save not only fuel, but also wear and tear on the boats. Please allow yourselves a few extra minutes when making off-island appointments or plans.

## Please Take Note:

Every Wednesday during High Season, we will not be running 2 ferries from 8:30AM-10:30AM as stated in the schedule; however, we will be shuttling with one ferry during this time. We will be doing maintenance work on the ferry in the lay-up slip.

## Safe Boating Tips

- **Boating Supplies:** The following boating supplies checklist, may be used as a guide for the items that you should have with you on all boating trips. For boats 16 feet and over, you must have an additional throw-able device:
  - ❖ U.S. Coast Guard approved PFDs (personal flotation devices)
  - ❖ visual distress signaling device
  - ❖ anchor and line
  - ❖ bail bucket
  - ❖ flashlight
  - ❖ approved boating fire extinguishers
  - ❖ bell or whistle
  - ❖ paddle or oars
  - ❖ tool kit, spare parts
  - ❖ navigation charts & navigation equipment
- **Boating Operation-Safe operation of a watercraft** depends on proper maintenance and preparation before, during and after use. The following items will assist you, the boater, and help assure you and your passengers of a safe trip:
  - ❖ full fuel tank
  - ❖ lights and horn working
  - ❖ weather & water conditions suitable
  - ❖ PFDs checked for proper fit
  - ❖ operator alert, ready, and sober
  - ❖ transom plug in, bilge bailed out/dry
  - ❖ fuel lines and tanks checked for leaks
  - ❖ all gear properly stowed and secured
  - ❖ propeller and lower unit free of debris
  - ❖ passengers briefed on emergencies


