Island Manager's Comments

Greetings everyone: It is hard to believe that we are already into the month of August. The weather so far this season has been very nice; we hope you have enjoyed your summer.

Water Distribution System: The crews have finished the installation of the new water line on the north end of Leisure Lane and are continuing down the south end of now. The cottages on the north end have not been connected yet, that won't happen until we shutdown the water system after the Island closes. If you go to the west end of Sunset and turn left you will see the work area. Please be very cautious when traveling in this area. The crew could be working there and / or there could be some soft areas where they crews have been digging.

E-Tickets: We now have 270 EZ Ride account owners and over 660 total users. The number of applications we are processing has slowed down to a trickle but I do encourage everyone that doesn't have an EZ Ride account to consider it. It makes everything easier for everyone.

The new server to host the program is at the programmer's shop in North Windham. It is being configured as we speak and should be installed next week. I am told the transition should be easy and seamless. I guess we'll see shortly.

Hosting the program in house will actually be less expensive than hosting it remotely when we add in all of the other expenses that we would have had to make in order for the system to be faster and more reliable.

Planning Board: The Planning Board is looking for a volunteer to help coordinate and collate the sections of the Comprehensive Plan that are being prepared by other volunteers. If you are interested please call the office at 655-4551.

Public Hearing: There will be a Public Hearing on Saturday August 6th at 9:00 AM in the Community Center to discuss the Park & Ride facility being considered for the mainland. If you have questions, or want to learn more about the project, please attend.

Meetings: The next scheduled Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee meeting is Saturday, August 13. It will begin at 9:00 AM at the Community Center.

FII Stockholders meeting: Saturday Sept 3, at 9:00 AM in the Community Center.

Bicycle Safety: I continue to see a number of people, young and old, riding their bikes on the island without helmets. There aren't many roads on the island that I haven't seen from the saddle of my mountain bike and I can tell you that there are times and places where danger lurks. Depending on the time of day, there can be a number of walkers, golf carts and cars on the roads. And there is always the ever present pot hole. If the Public Works crew has worked on the roads recently there could be loose gravel and stones that make these areas treacherous until the repair has been packed down by traffic. So.....please make sure that you and yours wear helmets when riding on the island roads. It could mean the difference between a crash that requires a little TLC from Mom & Dad or an emergency ride in an ambulance. Speed isn't the issue, it's what you hit when falling.

Frye Island Beach Ordinance

118 – 3 Requirements.

- a. No open fires on beaches. (*)
- b. No camping overnight on beaches.
- c. No personal items left on beaches overnight.
- d. NO DOGS on beaches between the hours of 10:00 am and 5:00 pm. (Must clean up after your dogs).
- e. No powered watercraft is to be left or tied up on Frye Island Public beaches. Pick up and drop-offs only. No power boats are to enter swimming areas. All power boats accessing Frye Island Public beaches must have a current resident or a temporary rental Frye Island sticker.
- f. Canoes, kayaks, rowboats and paddleboats must be pulled up beyond sandy area, racked, or in designated areas only.
- g. No littering. Use trash containers provided.
- h. Moorings must be out beyond swimming areas, and must not interfere with swim areas. Noncompliance with mooring placement will result in the mooring being removed.



FRYE ISLAND FIRE DEPARTMENT EMS RESPONSE PROCEDURES

The Frye Island Fire Department is the provider of Emergency Medical Services (EMS) for victims of illness or accident while they are on the island.

Members of the fire department provide first responder / Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) level treatment with a variety of tools and equipment carried on the ambulance. Members are trained to treat patients using Basic Life Support (BLS) skills. All members are trained annually in Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and in the use of the Automated External Defibrillator (AED).

The Raymond Rescue is the contract transport ambulance service and will provide that service to the local hospitals in the area if needed. Members of the Raymond Rescue also provide paramedic level medical care for patients needing such assistance.

On receipt of a 9-1-1 call to the Cumberland County Regional Communications Center, the Frye Island and Raymond Rescue are simultaneously notified. If the call is received on island (no telephone call to the CCRCC), the FIFD will notify the CCRCC and an incident will be generated for both departments to respond.

On arrival of the FIFD, and after a patient survey has been completed, a decision will be made as to whether the Raymond Rescue is needed or if they can be dismissed. If transport is required, and depending on the nature of the illness or accident, the patient can be loaded into the FIFD ambulance and taken to the mainland by ferry to await the arrival of the Raymond Rescue.

Frye Island Fire Department members are dispatched by the CCRCC on the receipt of a fire or medical emergency by portable radios. We maintain radio communications with the CCRCC, the Raymond Fire Department and the Raymond Rescue.

Any questions or concerns regarding these procedures should be addressed to FIFD Chief Steve Persson or Captain Paul Bourque.

Frye Island New Fire Truck

FIFD has a replacement fire truck for engine 1 and engine 5, from Hopkinton, MA. It is a unit very familiar with our firefighter, Doug Lewis, a Hopkinton and FIFD firefighter whose hard work made this acquisition possible. It is a 1990 Pierce with a 1000 gallon poly tank, deck gun and built in foam tank. Fire truck is in excellent condition with light use in Hopkinton. Thank you Doug for getting this much needed truck onto the island.

Let's use the lead up time to 8:00am as non-equipment run time. There are always plenty of things to be done at any construction site that does not require running equipment or hammering.

Shuttling:

Whenever we have a full ferry and leave vehicles behind, we immediately shuttle back, as opposed to making the traffic wait for the next scheduled ½ hour ferry. Sometimes this throws us off-schedule by a few minutes.

When the schedule states that there are 2 boats running, we sometimes make the decision, based on traffic, to run only one boat. We will not run 2 boats w/ only 1 or 2 cars on each; instead we shuttle one ferry non-stop.

We save not only fuel, but also wear and tear on the boats. Please allow yourselves a few extra minutes when making off-island appointments or plans.

Please Take Note:

Every Wednesday during High Season, we will not be running 2 ferries from 8:30AM-10:30AM as stated in the schedule; however, we will be shuttling with one ferry during this time. We will be doing maintenance work on the ferry in the lay-up slip.

Safe Boating Tips

- Age Requirements-“When operating a motorboat with more than 10 horsepower, a person under the age of 12 must be under immediate supervision of a person located in the boat who is at least 16 years of age. A person under the age of 16 years may not operate personal watercraft, which includes jet skis.
- A person between 16-18 years of age may operate a personal watercraft if they have successfully completed an approved education course, or if they are accompanied by a person 18 years of age or older. Proof of age and course must be possessed while operating a personal watercraft.” For the safety of all, please abide by the above law.

Waterline Work

Waterline work on Leisure Lane started on April 14th of this year. On August 1st our crew arrived at the intersection of Sunset Road. This stretch of Leisure from Sunset to Sunset is 1.2 miles. This is a great milestone for our crew. This stretch has been most difficult, with ledge, rock, sewer lines, septic systems, existing live waterline and a very narrow roadway with many house connections. Thanks goes out to our entire Public Works Crew for a fine job under difficult conditions.

Waterline line work is continuing, with our next goal of reaching the Leisure Lane/Birch Road split. Please watch out for our road crew while traveling the island.

Thanks to Eric Tetler for his generous donation of reflective caution signs to the Public Works Department, these signs would have been very expensive if purchased by the town.

Pool

In case you didn't know, Steve Kaplan volunteers at the swimming pool. He checks the chemicals, cleans the pool and surrounding area, all on his own, at no cost to the town. A difficult job at best, which is compounded by our “new” paint job which is peeling. Thanks to Steve!

Note: The contractor who painted the pool is warranting his work and will be sandblasting and repainting with a different product.



WATER

During July the Public Works crew had a very hard time keeping up with water demand. Because of high use and high levels of algae in the lake, our filters had to be changed daily and sometimes twice a day. The total budget for filters for the entire year is \$9000.00, during July alone we spent \$16,973.48 on filters. We are looking into improvements to our system to cut those filter costs.

One way you all can all help is to water your lawns in the evening after 7pm. The Public Works Department will be asking the Planning Board to draft an ordinance banning day time watering and car washing during a declared water emergency.
