# Town News

## Island Manager's Comments

### Greetings everyone:

**Water Distribution System:** The crews have finished the installation of the new water line on the north end of Leisure Lane and are continuing down the south end now. The cottages on the north end have not been connected yet, that won't happen until we shutdown the water system after the Island closes. If you go to the west end of Sunset and turn left you will see the work area. Please be very cautious when traveling in this area. The crew could be working there and / or there could be some soft areas where they crews have been digging.

We are now investigating the possibility of extending the water intake pipe that goes into the lake. The end of the pipe is in about 25 – 30 feet of water and we are having a very difficult time with algae. According to our friends at the Portland Water District, we need to be in at least 65 – 75 feet of water. We draw water from the lake and feed it through the filtration and chlorination stations before distributing it to the Island. The system was designed with continuous monitoring equipment to insure we comply with all of the water quality standards, which we do, but the cost of the filter media is already more than twice what was budgeted already this year. According to the Water District, we can expect an algae bloom similar to the one we are now experiencing periodically so we do need to prepare for it. The Water District indicated that they had similar issues too until they extended their intake into deeper water.

**Frye Island Inc:** The annual Frye Island Incorporated stockholders meeting will be held Saturday, September 3<sup>rd</sup>. The meeting will be held at the Community Center and will start at 9:00 AM. All Frye Island property owners are entitled to one vote at the stockholders meeting for per lot they own. It seems that there is still some confusion between Frye Island Inc. (FII) and the Town of Frye Island. In truth, they are two completely separate entities. Frye Island Incorporated was established as a Business Corporation by the property owners in August 1975. When the original developer of the Island suffered through bankruptcy FII was awarded the assets that were owned by the developer. The purchase of a lot on the Island was worth one share of stock in FII. When Frye Island became a Town in 1998, FII transferred some of the critical assets such as the water system and the ferry service to the Town. But, FII remains as a totally separate "Business Corporation" and continues to own and manage real estate on the Island.

The FII Board of Directors consists of 6 Islanders. They are all elected at the annual stockholders meeting to serve a one year term on the Board. The current officers are: Joe Potts, President; Nancy Donio, Secretary; Ed Charrette, Jacque Ossi, Neill Bovaird and David Lowe. If you are interested in being a candidate for the Board of Directors, please pick up a "volunteer to serve" form at the office.

Immediately following the FII Stockholders meeting, the Town will hold Public Hearings on the following:

- First Draft of the 2012 Municipal Budget.
- Revision to the "Golf Cart Ordinance"
- New Ordinance restricting the Use of Personal fireworks.

Everyone is encouraged to attend.

**E-Tickets:** The new server has been installed at the ferry trailer. There was a delay in getting some of the required hardware but the contractor is planning to start installing that equipment today. The software program has not been loaded on the new server yet and we need to develop the plan to transition to the new server without adversely affecting the ticketing process. We are in hopes of having that ready next week. I also hope to run the old and new in parallel to make sure all goes as planned during the transition.

I want to remind everyone again that the bar-coded tickets have an expiration date on them so keep that in mind when you purchase and use these tickets. If you still have some of the older colored tickets you need to turn them in at the office for a credit.

**Planning Board:** The Planning Board is looking for a volunteer to help coordinate and collate the sections of the Comprehensive Plan that are being prepared by other volunteers. If you are interested please call the office at 655-4551.

**Meetings:** The next scheduled Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee meeting is Saturday, August 13. It will begin at 9:00 AM at the Community Center.

## **Medical Emergency Procedure Dial 9-1-1**

Your 9-1-1 call will be received at the Raymond Dispatch Center.

State your name, your location, and the nature of the emergency.

The Raymond Dispatch Center will dispatch the Frye Island Fire Department medical First Responders and Raymond Rescue. The Raymond Dispatch Center will also notify the ferry captain for an emergency run. This will occur during normal operating hours and during off-hours.

Time is critical in an emergency! Stay at your location until help arrives. Medical personnel are responding to your location. If you leave that location, you may bypass responding rescue personnel.

## **Fire Emergency: Dial 9-1-1**

Your 9-1-1 call will be received at the Raymond Dispatch Center.

State your name, your location, and the nature of the emergency. Then **get out of the building if there is a fire.**

The Raymond Dispatch Center will dispatch the Frye Island and Raymond Fire Departments. Raymond Dispatch will also notify the ferry.

Note that all streets and fire lanes on the island are clearly marked. All owners and visitors should know the street, lot number, fire lane, and a nearby landmark where they are located in the event of a fire, medical, or police emergency. This information will greatly expedite the response time for the emergency service that is answering your call. Time is critical!

The Town has always requested quiet time between the hours of 10:00pm to 8:00am.

I know everyone is trying to squeeze every hour out of the day for productive purposes. Let me ask for a little common sense from the time your contractors get off the ferry at 7:10/7:40. Let's use the lead up time to 8:00am as non-equipment run time. There are always plenty of things to be done at any construction site that does not require running equipment or hammering.

## Shuttling:

Whenever we have a full ferry and leave vehicles behind, we immediately shuttle back, as opposed to making the traffic wait for the next scheduled ½ hour ferry. Sometimes this throws us off-schedule by a few minutes.

When the schedule states that there are 2 boats running, we sometimes make the decision, based on traffic, to run only one boat. We will not run 2 boats w/ only 1 or 2 cars on each; instead we shuttle one ferry non-stop.

We save not only fuel, but also wear and tear on the boats. Please allow yourselves a few extra minutes when making off-island appointments or plans.

## Please Take Note:

Every Wednesday during High Season, we will not be running 2 ferries from 8:30AM-10:30AM as stated in the schedule; however, we will be shuttling with one ferry during this time. We will be doing maintenance work on the ferry in the lay-up slip.

All interested Islanders and Yacht Club members are welcome to attend. This is a public meeting.

- Age Requirements-“When operating a motorboat with more than 10 horsepower, a person under the age of 12 must be under immediate supervision of a person located in the boat who is at least 16 years of age. A person under the age of 16 years may not operate personal watercraft, which includes jet skis. **A person between 16-18 years of age may operate a personal watercraft if they have successfully completed an approved education course, or if they are accompanied by a person 18 years of age or older.** Proof of age and course must be possessed while operating a personal watercraft.” For the safety of all, please abide by the above law.
- After a day on the water, remove any visible vegetation, animals, mud, fishing gear and all equipment exposed to the water while you are at the launch ramp. Frye Island has a wash down station at it’s ramp located at Long Beach Marina.

### ***Frye Island Public Works Dept.***

#### ***Waterline Work***

Waterline work on Leisure Lane started on April 14<sup>th</sup> of this year. On August 1<sup>st</sup> our crew arrived at the intersection of Sunset Road. This stretch of Leisure from Sunset to Sunset is 1.2 miles. This is a great milestone for our crew. This stretch has been most difficult, with ledge, rock, sewer lines, septic systems, existing live waterline and a very narrow roadway with many house connections. Thanks goes out to our entire Public Works Crew for a fine job under difficult conditions.

Waterline line work is continuing, with our next goal of reaching the Leisure Lane/Birch Road split. Please watch out for our road crew while traveling the island.

#### ***WATER***

During July the Public Works crew had a very hard time keeping up with water demand. Because of high use and high levels of algae in the lake, our filters had to be changed daily and sometimes twice a day. The total budget for filters for the entire year is \$9000.00, during July alone we spent \$16,973.48 on filters. We are looking into improvements to our system to cut those filter costs.

One way you all can all help is to water your lawns in the evening after 7pm. The Public Works Department will be asking the Planning Board to draft an ordinance banning day time watering and car washing during a declared water emergency.

## **Garden Club News**

Many thanks to Barbara Holt, Master Gardener, for her informative program. Did you know that a pile of shredded leaves layered with manure will provide compost in 6 months to a year without adding the odor of garbage? The island is not lacking in leaves! Leave the pile over the winter and there's the compost in the spring. One inch of compost on top of a garden applied spring and fall is enough to amend the soil or double it for a fall only application. As for the deer, in addition to the plants they don't like too much, any very strong odor especially a human odor on or near the plants will serve to deter the deer unless they are starving. Switching the odor from time to time also helps. A square of fine mesh netting over individual plants will work to repel the deer. Covering the whole garden can capture birds and chipmunks.

While most of this area is a Zone 4, the Island is probably a Zone 5. Planting near rocks ensures it because the rocks absorb any heat provided by the sun. Some perennials relatively safe from deer are peonies, foxglove, lupine, dianthus, artemesia, blue hyssop, cat mint, iris, ornamental grasses, and sage. As you can see, she brought plants for purchase as well as pamphlets of information to keep. Check the library at the Community Center.
