Island Manager's Comments

Greetings everyone:

Water Distribution System: We have experienced a glitch in the water line installation. Last week we had the tub grinder at the transfer station to grind the brush and branches which we do annually. When we do this we use the excavator to feed the tub. Unfortunately, some of the wood chips got on the muffler of the excavator and caught fire. The fire damaged some of the hydraulics and some of the wiring. We are in the process of getting it repaired but the installation of the water line will be delayed until the repairs are complete.

Frye Island Inc: The annual Frye Island Incorporated stockholders meeting will be held Saturday, September 3rd. The meeting will be held at the community center and will start at 9:00 AM. All Frye Island lot owners are entitled to one vote per owned lot at the stockholders meeting.

The current FII Board of Directors consists of 6 Islanders. They are all elected at the annual stockholders meeting to serve a one year term. The Board members are: Joe Potts, President; Nancy Donio, Secretary; Ed Charrette, Jacque Ossi, Neill Bovaird and David Lowe. If you are interested in being a candidate for the Board of Directors, please pick up a "volunteer to serve" form at the office.

Immediately following the FII Stockholders meeting, the Town will hold Public Hearings on the following:

- First Draft of the 2012 Municipal Budget.
- Revision to the "Golf Cart Ordinance"
- New Ordinance restricting the Use of Personal fireworks.
- Presentation of a 2 tier vs. 3 tier ferry ticket pricing system

Everyone is encouraged to attend.

Taxes: Every year after the municipal budget is approved at the October Town meeting we determine what the tax rate will be. We then calculate the tax for each property based on that property's assessed value and then "commit" those taxes and issue tax bills. The first half of the tax is due on December 31st and the second half is due on June 30th. Interest starts to accrue on the unpaid portion of the first half of the taxes January 1st and the unpaid portion of the total tax on July 1st. In accordance with State statutes, we have a window in which we can place liens on properties for unpaid taxes. That window is 8 to 12 months after the taxes are

"committed". For Frye Island that window typically falls between the middle of July to the middle of October. Prior to placing a lien on a property for unpaid taxes we issue a 30 day notice. That gives the property owner 30 days to pay their taxes before the lien is applied. If the delinquent taxes are not paid in the 30 day period, a tax lien is placed on the property and recorded in the Cumberland County Registry of Deeds. If you are wondering why I am getting into this now, it is because we are sending out about 100 of the 30 day notices today.

Selectmen / Executive Committee: The Town Meeting is annually held on Columbus Day weekend. This year the meeting will be held on Saturday October 8th. In addition to the budget and other Town business, we also vote on Selectmen and Board of Island Trustee, Executive Committee Representatives. The Executive Committee consists of the three elected Selectmen and the four elected Board of Island Trustee Representatives. The three selectmen are Jim Kuiken, John Nun, and Mark Thomas. This year Mr. Kuikens 3 year term expires and he has decided not to run for re-election. In order to be a candidate for the selectmen's position a person must be a registered voter in Frye Island. If you are interested in running for this position and are a registered voter please come into the office and complete the application papers.

The 4 Board of Island Trustee representatives are Joe Potts, Dave Bond, Bob Sutherland and Gary Donohue. This year the 3 year terms of Mr. Potts and Mr. Bond expire. Mr. Potts has decided not to run for re-election. Mr. Bond will be a candidate for re-election. In order to become a candidate for the Board of Island Trustees Executive Committee a person must own real property (a Cottage) on Frye Island. If you are interested in running for either of these two positions and you own a cottage on the Island, please come to the office and complete the appropriate forms.

Mr. Timothy McCarthy, 159 Leisure Lane, has completed the application papers for the position of Board of Island Trustee, Executive Committee and will be on the ballot in October.

Meetings: The next scheduled Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee meeting is Saturday, September 17th. It will begin at 9:00 AM at the Community Center.

HOME CANDLE SAFETY TIPS

A candle is an open flame that can easily ignite nearby combustible materials. The NFPA offers the following safety tips:

- Use candles only with constant adult supervision
- Extinguish all candles when leaving a room or going to sleep
- Keep candles away from items that can catch fire, such as Christmas trees, clothing, paper or curtains
- Place candles and candle holders on a secure piece of furniture
- Make sure candleholders are non-combustible and large enough to collect dripping wax
- Do not place lighted candles in windows, where blinds or curtains can close over them
- Keep wicks trimmed to ¼ inch, and extinguish candles when they burn to within two inches of the holder
- Keep candles and all open flames away from flammable liquids
- Do not use candles in places where they can be knocked over by children or pets

ROAD, FIRE LANE AND LOT NUMBERS

All owners and renters should know the road, fire lane and lot number where they are located in the event of a fire, medical or police emergency.

This information will greatly expedite the response time for the emergency service that is answering your call.

Time is Critical!

All road signs and fire lanes signs on the island are clearly marked.

Every house, by town ordinance, shall have a lot number in large, contrasting colors that can be seen by emergency responders approaching from either direction.

If possible, a person should meet the emergency responders on the street and at night turn on all outdoor lighting.

If you have any questions or concerns regarding your road, fire lane or lot number, they can be addressed by members of the fire department at the central station on Sundays, between 1030 and 1230.

Illegally Parked Boats

A few people on the island have complained about unauthorized boats parked in their boat slips. It is our policy that boat slips are to be treated the same as personal driveways. If an unauthorized vehicle is parked in your driveway you would first contact the police and ascertain the ownership of the vehicle. After ownership is determined, we would then attempt contact with the vehicle owner and have it removed. If contact can't be made or the vehicle is not on file with the State it would be the property owner's responsibility to have the vehicle towed. This holds true to boat slips as well. If you have a boat in your slip, call us and we will attempt contact. If contact cannot be made, it is up to the slip owner to have it removed.

Shuttling:

Whenever we have a full ferry and leave vehicles behind, we immediately shuttle back, as opposed to making the traffic wait for the next scheduled ½ hour ferry. Sometimes this throws us off-schedule by a few minutes.

When the schedule states that there are 2 boats running, we sometimes make the decision, based on traffic, to run only one boat. We will not run 2 boats w/ only 1 or 2 cars on each; instead we shuttle one ferry non-stop.

We save not only fuel, but also wear and tear on the boats. Please allow yourselves a few extra minutes when making off-island appointments or plans.

Please Take Note:

Every Wednesday during High Season, we will not be running 2 ferries from 8:30AM-10:30AM as stated in the schedule; however, we will be shuttling with one ferry during this time. We will be doing maintenance work on the ferry in the lay-up slip.

- Milfoil/Invasive Plants Sticker—"A person may not place or operate a motor boat or personal watercraft on the inland waters of the State of Maine unless a current/valid lake and river protection sticker, issued annually, is permanently affixed to each side of the bow, above the waterline and approximately 3 inches behind the validation sticker." These stickers are available at the Town Office on Frye Island.
- Watercraft 16 feet or longer, must have a wearable U.S. Coast Guard approved Type I, II, or III PFD (personal flotation device) for each person on board PLUS at least one throw able device (Type IV) on board. Watercraft under 16 feet in length require one PFD for each person on board. All children 10 years of age and younger must wear a Type I, II, or III PFD while on board a watercraft.

Waterline Work

Waterline line work will be delayed until repairs of the excavator are complete. Our next goal will be reaching the Leisure Lane/Birch Road split. Please watch out for our road crew while traveling the island.

WATER

During July the Public Works crew had a very hard time keeping up with water demand. Because of high use and high levels of algae in the lake, our filters had to be changed daily and sometimes twice a day. The total budget for filters for the entire year is \$9000.00, during July alone we spent \$16,973.48 on filters. We are looking into improvements to our system to cut those filter costs.

One way you all can all help is to water your lawns in the evening after 7pm. The Public Works Department will be asking the Planning Board to draft an ordinance banning day time watering and car washing during a declared water emergency.


