



# Town News

## Island Manager's Comments

### Greetings everyone:

**Irene:** The news of the week is the weather we might get from Hurricane Irene. I have been receiving daily updates from the Cumberland County Emergency Management Agency and the National Weather Service in Gray. If the storm results in a loss of power, we have generators to keep the water system functioning; and we have portable generators to operate the ferry ramps if necessary. However, there is a distinct possibility that we will need to shutdown the ferry service if the weather gets as bad as predicted on Sunday.

Sooooo; please make your plans accordingly. If you need to be somewhere Sunday evening or Monday morning you may not make it if you wait until Sunday to leave. You might want to think about bailing out of here Saturday (no pun intended). In addition, if you have health considerations you could be stuck on the Island without a ferry for awhile. We certainly would do all we could to help but I am not even sure we could get Life Flight out here if the storm is as bad as predicted.

I have included the latest report from the NWS in Gray for your information.

#### *Hurricane Irene timing:*

*Outer banks- 2PM Sat*

*Long Island- 2PM Sun*

*Northern NH- 2AM Mon*

*John Jensenius, NWS Gray:*

*If the storm tracks east expect more rain, if it tracks west more wind.*

*Hurricane force winds to diminish if storm tracks over land.*

*Track of the storm is still uncertain.*

*Expect damaging winds to cause power outages and trees down.*

*Again, rain depends on the track. If the storm tracks east we could expect 2-5" or more.*

*If the storm continues to track west, we could have a brief break in the rain on Sunday afternoon before it picks up again on Sunday evening.*

*Rain to begin Sat PM through Sunday or early Monday.*

*Wind will be strongest Sunday afternoon and Monday AM. Hurricane force winds possible with gusts of 60 to 70 mph possible.*

*High tide will occur at 11PM Sunday; the storm may produce a 2' surge which will create 1' above flood level conditions along the coast.*

*There's a possibility that rivers could back up. Expect splash-over and waves 20-30' offshore.*

Another advisory from the NWS has Irene moving faster and as a category 2 hurricane (90-110 mph) off the New Jersey coast at 2 PM Sunday and in New Hampshire and southern Maine as a category 1 hurricane (75 – 90 mph) at 2 AM Monday. This could all change if she slows down or speeds up more. As it stands now, we expect the winds to really pick up Sunday so we are not sure how long we will be able to keep the ferries running. Safety is our primary concern. If you are planning to leave the Island and are traveling south, please make your plans well in advance, you will be heading right into the weather. Contractors, please make sure you secure your job sites well; the greatest danger in high wind situations is flying debris.

**Frye Island Inc:** The annual Frye Island Incorporated stockholders meeting will be held Saturday, September 3<sup>rd</sup>. The meeting will be held at the community center and will start at 9:00 AM. All Frye Island lot owners are entitled to one vote per owned lot at the stockholders meeting.

The current FII Board of Directors consists of 6 Islanders. They are all elected at the annual stockholders meeting to serve a one year term. The Board members are: Joe Potts, President; Nancy Donio, Secretary; Ed Charrette, Jacquie Ossi, Neill Bovaird and David Lowe. If you are interested in being a candidate for the Board of Directors, please pick up a "volunteer to serve" form at the office.

Immediately following the FII Stockholders meeting, the Town will hold Public Hearings on the following:

- First Draft of the 2012 Municipal Budget.
- Revision to the "Golf Cart Ordinance"
- New Ordinance restricting the Use of Personal fireworks.
- Presentation of a 2 tier vs. 3 tier ferry ticket pricing system

Everyone is encouraged to attend.

**Taxes:** As I mentioned last week, we have mailed the 30 day notices to all property owners that have not paid their 2011 taxes. The next step in the process is to create the liens and have them recorded at the Cumberland County Registry of Deeds. This will happen on Thursday, September 22<sup>nd</sup>. If you got a notice, please make arrangements to pay the delinquent taxes before the 22<sup>nd</sup>.

This year we sent 92 - thirty day notices totaling about \$116,500 in delinquent 2011 taxes. This is the most that we have had to do in the 10 years that I have been here. A sign of the times I guess.

**Selectmen / Executive Committee:** The Town Meeting is annually held on Columbus Day weekend. This year the meeting will be held on Saturday October 8<sup>th</sup>. In addition to the budget and other Town business, we also vote on Selectmen and Board of Island Trustee, Executive Committee Representatives. The Executive Committee consists of the three elected Selectmen and the four elected Board of Island Trustee Representatives. The three selectmen are Jim Kuiken, John Nun, and Mark Thomas. This year Mr. Kuikens 3 year term expires and he has decided not to run for re-election. In order to be a candidate for the selectmen's position a person must be a registered voter in Frye Island. If you are interested in running for this position and are a registered voter, please come into the office and complete the application papers.

The 4 Board of Island Trustee representatives are Joe Potts, Dave Bond, Bob Sutherland and Gary Donohue. This year the 3 year terms of Mr. Potts and Mr. Bond expire. Mr. Potts has decided not to run for re-election. Mr. Bond will be a candidate for re-election to another three year term. In order to become a candidate for the Board of Island Trustees Executive Committee, a person must own real property (a Cottage) on Frye Island. If you are interested in running for either of these two positions and you own a cottage on the Island, please come to the office and complete the appropriate forms.

Mr. Timothy McCarthy, 159 Leisure Lane, has completed the application papers for the position of Board of Island Trustee, Executive Committee and will be on the ballot in October.

## ***GENERATOR SAFETY***

Power outages are a strong possibility during bad weather. Gas powered generators are to be used outside, away from any open windows, do not fill gas tank while running, use a 12/3 power cord and it is not to be used in a basement or garage.

## ***HOME CANDLE FIRES***

Nearly half of home candle fires started in the bedroom, with 19 percent starting in living rooms, family rooms or dens. Thirty-six percent occurred because candles were left unattended, abandoned or inadequately controlled.

A candle is an open flame that can easily ignite nearby combustible materials. The NFPA offers the following safety tips:

- Use candles only with constant adult supervision
- Extinguish all candles when leaving a room or going to sleep
- Keep candles away from items that can catch fire, such as Christmas trees, clothing, paper or curtains
- Place candles and candle holders on a secure piece of furniture
- Make sure candleholders are non-combustible and large enough to collect dripping wax
- Do not place lighted candles in windows, where blinds or curtains can close over them
- Keep wicks trimmed to ¼ inch, and extinguish candles when they burn to within two inches of the holder
- Keep candles and all open flames away from flammable liquids
- Do not use candles in places where they can be knocked over by children or pets

## Beach #10 Incidents

Over the last four years I have been on the island I have received a number of complaints involving encounters on Beach #10 or in the immediate area of Beach #10. All of these complaints have the same common denominator, an out of control screaming man intimidating people who are lawfully trying to use the public beach. It has been communicated to the police that the beach has been represented as a private beach as people have been ordered to leave the area by this individual. On one occasion, a couple of young girls reported that they were threatened by this person with bodily harm as he threatened to release his dog on them. It has always been the Frye Island way to ignore a bully, be gracious and hope a bad experience blows over. Unfortunately, I hear about these incidents days or even weeks later. I want to tell you that these incidents are taken extremely seriously by your police department. No one wants to or has to take abuse from a neighborhood bully. The best way to deal with a bully is to meet him head on. This is unacceptable behavior and will not be tolerated, especially when threats are alleged. I ask you to report these incidents immediately after they occur. My promise to you is that we will deal with these incidents in an extremely efficient manner.

## Illegally Parked Boats

A few people on the island have complained about unauthorized boats parked in their boat slips. It is our policy that boat slips are to be treated the same as personal driveways. If an unauthorized vehicle is parked in your driveway you would first contact the police and ascertain the ownership of the vehicle. After ownership is determined, we would then attempt contact with the vehicle owner and have it removed. If contact can't be made or the vehicle is not on file with the State it would be the property owner's responsibility to have the vehicle towed. This holds true to boat slips as well. If you have a boat in your slip, call us and we will attempt contact. If contact cannot be made, it is up to the slip owner to have it removed.


## Snowmobile Wanted

## Hurricane Irene

The effects of Hurricane Irene are expected to reach Maine this Sunday afternoon and remain with us into Monday. Most storm models show Irene landing in Maine as at least a category 1 hurricane with sustained winds of 74-95 MPH. What does this mean for the island? With winds at 74-95 MPH, it would be prudent to expect a loss of electrical power. Home owners should secure all lawn furniture and other light weight items inside to avoid further damage caused by flying debris. Make sure you have fresh batteries for your flashlights as well as a couple of days' worth of provisions.

All interested Islanders and Yacht Club members are welcome to attend. This is a public meeting.

- Secure your watercraft covers tightly and with “pitch” to allow for rapid water run-off. This will prevent sagging and pooling of water and leaves, etc.; the primary cause for canvas wear and tears.
- Ensure dock bumpers/fenders are securely fastened to your watercraft and are strategically placed, so as to avoid damage to your watercraft. Dock lines should be of adequate size to safely secure your watercraft. They should be supple, free of unnecessary knots and fraying, and be in good usable condition. Dock lines need to be secure after dockage and be adequate in number. Dock lines should NOT run across docks, for safety reasons. Secure your dock lines before leaving your slip.

#### ***Sunday Ferry***

Please consider a Saturday or Saturday evening departure as Hurricane Irene may impact ferry service. The ferry **WILL NOT RUN** during the worst weather if the Captain deems it too dangerous to operate.

#### ***WATER***

Because of high use and high levels of algae in the lake, our filters have had to be changed daily and sometimes twice a day. The total budget for filters for the entire year is \$9000.00, during July alone we spent \$16,973.48 on filters. We are looking into improvements to our system to cut those filter costs.

One way you all can all help is to water your lawns in the evening after 7pm. The Public Works Department will be asking the Planning Board to draft an ordinance banning day time watering and car washing during a declared water emergency.


