# Town News

## Island Manager's Comments

### Greetings everyone:

**Irene:** A final comment on the storm that rolled through here on August 28<sup>th</sup>. I tried to thank everyone that was involved in the Island safety patrol during the storm and in the clean-up afterwards. Especially John Crosby and the Public Works crew, Chief Persson and the volunteer fire fighters and Chief Beaulieu and the police officers involved. A group that I didn't include but also deserves a great deal of thanks is the crew from Central Maine Power Co. / Evergreen Electric. They responded on Tuesday, worked from dawn until dark through Thursday and had most of the power restored on the Island before I thought they would even be here. They also had crews out here Friday and Saturday to finish up the individual homes that required additional work. And, as typically happens when I try to thank individuals, I leave someone out and I did this time as well. But; this individual wasn't shy in letting me know so I offer a belated thanks to Willie for being there during the storm and the clean-up.

**FII:** The Frye Island Incorporated stockholders meeting was held as scheduled on Saturday September 3<sup>rd</sup>. The meeting was opened by President Joe Potts. The proposed budget for 2012 was reviewed and approved. In addition, the following officers were elected to the Board of Directors:

**Public Hearing:** Immediately following the FII Stockholders meeting, the Town held a Public Hearings on the following:

- First Draft of the 2012 Municipal Budget.
- Revision to the "Golf Cart Ordinance"
- New Ordinance restricting the Use of Personal fireworks.
- Watering Ban Ordinance
- Presentation of a 2 tier vs. 3 tier ferry ticket pricing system

Other than the Budget, the "Watering Ban Ordinance" and the ferry ticket pricing system caused the greatest discussion. The Watering Ban Ordinance was proposed because of the impact the water flow has on the rate the system filters need to be changed and the resultant cost to the tax payers. The biggest complaint was the hours the ban could be in place and the potential duration of a

ban. These concerns are understandable and will be presented to the Executive Committee for its consideration. It is hoped that a proposed project to extend the water intake pipe into deeper water would minimize / eliminate the need for a water ban.

The majority of the discussion of the ticket pricing system included an explanation of the two pricing proposals. I have attached the 2 proposals for your review. The Executive Committee will review the proposals for inclusion on the warrant for the Town meeting. Any vote on ferry ticket pricing at the Town meeting will be by the Board of Island Trustees per the Town Charter.

### 2 Tier Ticket Pricing System: (Draft)

- There will be 2 ticket prices...Full price and discount price.
- Frye Island property owners with an EZ Ride account will pay the approved discount price for ferry passage. ( Automobile ticket currently \$15)
- In addition, property owners with EZ Ride account will be able to purchase discount tickets for their family and friends etc.
- Non - Property owners will be able to establish EZ Ride account but ticket purchases will cost full price. (Automobile ticket currently \$30).
- All ferry tickets sold in the office and on the mainland will cost the full price

### 3 Tier Ticket Pricing System:(Draft)

- There will be 3 ticket prices...Full price, discount price and full price plus an additional percentage.
- Frye Island property owners with an EZ Ride account will pay the approved discount price for ferry passage. ( Automobile ticket currently \$15)
- In addition, property owners with EZ Ride account will be able to purchase discount tickets for their family and friends etc.
- Non - Property owners will be able to establish EZ Ride account but ticket purchases will cost full price. (Automobile ticket currently \$30).
- All ferry tickets sold in the office will cost the full price.
- All ferry tickets sold on the mainland will cost the full price plus an additional percentage. (This cost needs to be established).

---

**USS Spruance (DDG 111):** As most of you know we hosted the sailors from the USS Spruance on July 23 and treated them to a day of recreation on the Island. Later some of us were fortunate to be invited to meet the CO, CMDR Tate Westbrook, and tour the ship. The day spent on the Island was one of the highlights of the time spent in Maine for the crew of the ship.

The Spruance sailed from Bath on September 1<sup>st</sup>. She will be commissioned in Key West Florida and then proceed to her home port of San Diego, California.

CMDR Westbrook wrote a letter that was published in the Times Record on August 24th, in which the day on the Island was mentioned. In addition, channel 6 did a news piece when the Spruance sailed. I will see if we can get these links on our web site if you would like to view them.

8/28/2011 Irene EOC (emergency operation center) at the fire barn was in full operation for 15 hours with 6 personnel on hand. Two stayed in the office to receive phone calls and keep track of where the downed power lines were, trees blocking roads and cooking lunch for everyone present. A crew of 2 - 4 were out spotting trees and wires down and cutting any trees blocking roads not near the power lines in an effort to keep roads open for any emergencies.

8/29/2011 The EOC was again open to the public to charge their cell phones, connect to the internet, use the freezer/refrigerator/stove/micro and get information.

8/30/2011 EOC open to the public from 10 - 1 and 3 - 5:30

- Fire alarm sounding, install 2 batteries
- Pick up cones that were put out for downed trees/wires
- Town office set up at EOC for important business matters

8/31/2011 Medical

All in all we survived Irene in pretty good shape. The DPW, Police and Fire crews out working in the storm kept Frye Island as safe as was possible with no injuries or catastrophes.

### Roads:

Please travel slowly and carefully on the island roads. Since Hurricane Irene we have had several heavy rain storms, we have been patching and potholing when possible. The road shoulders are particularly soft, with much running water. We have exhausted our liquid calcium dust control budget so if and when the roads dry out they will be dusty. Waterline work is continuing along Leisure Lane in the Beach 8 area, the road in this area is extremely soft, please go slowly. Our waterline crew is near their goal of reaching the Leisure/Birch split, the “Trench Monkeys” (as we here in DPW affectingly call them) have done a great job under difficult working conditions.

## ***Lock up your canoes and kayaks***

It is not uncommon at this time of year to see vehicles driving off the island with canoes and kayaks in the back of trucks or on trailers. The problem, some of the canoes and kayaks do not belong to the people leaving the island. Too often I take a report from a person that states they left their kayak on beach X when they left on Labor Day only to find it gone when they returned on Columbus Day. It would be naive of us to think those criminal opportunists that come onto the island aren't capable of taking anything in a public place that isn't locked or chained, especially this time of year. It is always a good idea to take in valuable lawn furniture, secure expensive grills and always have the make, model and serial number available if anything comes up missing.

During the August 19<sup>th</sup> edition of the *FINS* I wrote a piece about what was reported as gunshots in the area of Beach #5. I went onto to describe the incident as an inconsiderate annoyance to the neighborhood as it was reported to me as gunshots, waking up several islanders at 3:30am. After speaking with a number of angry complainants who described the person(s) involved as an @\$h01e, which I agreed with, I stated that I would address the incident in the next edition of the *FINS*. In the August 19<sup>th</sup> edition I did just that with my "Report of Gunshots" piece. Not wanting to use the word @\$h01e, I instead used a phrase that replaced the description I received of the complainants. In an email I received from our friends at EqualityMaine, it was brought to my attention that the phrase used could be viewed as an insensitive slur against a particular group of people. I can assure you that the phrase used was in no way meant to insult anyone other than the person(s) involved in the fireworks display, especially not the good people at EqualityMaine.
