Island Manager's Comments

Greetings everyone:

Lake Level: There has been no change with the status of SD Warrens permit application and the revised Lake Level Management Plan. I would urge everyone to view the Save Our Sebago website at www.saveoursebago.com for information. I will let you know as soon as there is a change to report.

Transfer Station: We are still trying to get the new compactors up and running at the transfer station. We have also notified the supplier to install the additional fencing on the left hand side of the existing fence. This will prevent people from accessing the transfer station when it is closed. This is required in order for us to comply with the State issued permit. I know this will create an inconvenience for some of us but it is necessary. Your understanding and cooperation will really be appreciated.

We have already had people throwing trash and debris over the gate. I want to remind everyone that the State of Maine has a law against littering with a substantial fine for those offenders. If this practice continues we will be forced to prosecute.

SAD 6 Budget Meeting: The SAD #6 budget hearing was held last night at the Bonny Eagle Middle School. There were 18 articles on the warrant for the meeting. The meeting started at 7:00PM. Unfortunately, I had to leave the meeting at 10:00PM to catch the 11 o'clock ferry and they were still trying to finish the first article. Needless to say there was a considerable amount of debate on the first article which provided the budget for general instruction. I will try to get the results of the meeting today and will post them on the bulletin boards and on the website for your review. State law does require a referendum election to validate the budget which will be held on Tuesday, June 12th. This is a *Yes* or *No* vote. Yes to approve the budget that was supposed to be passed at last night's hearing and No to reject it. (The notice of this referendum election has been posted on the Town bulletin board). The polls will open at the Frye Island Community Center at 10:00 AM and will remain open until 8:00 PM. All registered voters can participate in this referendum election by voting in person at the Community Center, or by absentee ballot which is available at the Town Office. The following table compares the town's shares for the 2011/2012 and the 2012/2013 fiscal years as proposed by the School Board.

Primary Elections: State wide primary election and SAD #6 validation referendum elections will be held on Tuesday June 12, 2012. The polls will open at the Community Center at 10:00 AM and close at 8:00 PM. If you are a registered Town voter, and enrolled in one of the recognized political parties (Democrat, Green, Republican) you will be able to vote for the candidates in the party you are enrolled in and on any referendum articles. If you are registered to vote in the Town, and

are not enrolled in any of the recognized political parties, (Unenrolled), you will be able to vote on referendum articles only. Absentee ballots are available now in the Town Office. If you will be unable to vote at the polls, please request an absentee ballot from the office.

Ferry: If you were trying to get to the Island last Friday night you no doubt had to wait for the ferry. I know some had to wait as long as a couple of hours. As you know, Friday night was extremely foggy; actually, it was dangerously foggy. Consequently we shut down the second ferry for fear of a mid channel collision. We have purchased some new electronic navigational equipment for the ferries which should help during times like we experienced last Friday. We will commence some additional training for the ferry crews as soon as this equipment is installed. This equipment will minimize the risk but it won't eliminate it. In situations like we experienced Friday night we defer to the Captains judgment to determine when the conditions pose a safety hazard. If you were on the lake Friday night I am sure you can understand the danger and the actions taken by the ferry staff. I want to thank the ferry crews for sticking with it until all of the vehicles had been transported to the Island and to all of you that got stuck in the line. I know it is not very pleasant after driving for hours only to have to wait for the ferry. Unfortunately, living on an Island sometimes presents some unique situations.

Executive Committee Meeting: The next Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee meeting has been scheduled for Saturday June 16th. The meeting will be held at the Community Center and will begin at 9 AM.

Wednesdays (high season only) 10am to 6pm

Holiday weekends, open 10am to 6pm, Saturday, Sunday and Monday

For those times when the Transfer Station is closed, please purchase a good quality trash barrel with a locking cover, also Home Depot and Lowe's all carry trash bags made to repel rodents and raccoons.

Safe Boating Tips

- Watercraft towing a person or persons on water-skis, surfboards, aquaplanes, or similar devices shall not operate within water safety zones (area of water within 200 feet of any shoreline, mainland or island). Exception: to drop-off or pickup passengers, while ensuring that persons and property are not endangered in the process.
- Any person being towed on water skis, surfboards, or similar devices must wear a life jacket, life belt, or similar life saving device. No watercraft operator shall tow anyone involved in the aforementioned activities unless the person being towed has complied with this requirement.
- Watercraft towing a person on water skis, surfboard, or other similar devices must have a person in the watercraft who is at least 12 years of age, in addition to the operator, who is in a position to continually observe the person/s being towed.

The dense fog prohibited the safe use of 2 ferries, so we had to begin shuttling one boat non-stop around 8 PM. We were scheduled to shut down at midnight, however, the crew had to stay until after 1:30 AM to get everyone safely to the island. We safely transported 394 vehicles to the island on Friday, despite Mother Nature!

We greatly appreciate the patience and understanding that almost everyone showed - we realize that many people were stuck waiting in line for well over 2 hours.

Kudos and thanks to Captains Pete Gaughan and Bob De Felice, Mates Cody Ventresca and A.J. Bennett, and a special thanks to Deb Edwards, our Ticket Agent, who worked from 3 PM until almost 12:30 AM!
