# Town News

## Island Manager's Comments

### Greetings everyone:

**Water Distribution System:** The DPW crew is continuing the installation along the south end of Leisure Lane. The Island is getting very busy so please be very cautious when traveling in the work zone. There could be some soft areas where the crews have been digging.

**Lake Level:** There has been no change with the status of SD Warren's permit application, and the revised Lake Level Management Plan. However the Bureau of Environmental Protection has agreed to consider the request to reopen the Water Quality Certification process on August 16. I would urge everyone to view the Save Our Sebago website at, [www.saveoursebago.com](http://www.saveoursebago.com), for information. I will let you know as soon as there is more to report.

**Ferry:** Please check the ferry schedule now that we are into the high season. The traffic is surely going to increase so you can save yourself a lot of frustration if you know the schedule. We have decided to run the second ferry a little more around the 4<sup>th</sup> in anticipation of the holiday traffic. However, every year we try to guess when the masses will be coming and invariably we get it wrong. This year we guessed that a lot of people will be coming up on Tuesday the 3<sup>rd</sup> to make a loong weekend out of it so we scheduled the second ferry to run later Tuesday night. Let's see how we did.

**Fire Works:** The fire works are scheduled for Saturday July 7<sup>th</sup> and will begin as soon as the pyrotechnic technician feels is dark enough. The State Fire Marshall was here this week to review the area. Again this year, as is usual, a number of boats will have to be moved from their slips. Boats in the Marina from slips 84 to 104 on the beach side and slips 67 to 131 on the road side plus the Jet Ski slips and boats on all of the slips on the southern end must be removed by 5:00 PM. If you have a boat in one of these slips please move it out before 5:00PM. If you don't, we will have it moved for you at your expense. The fire works display can not be set up with boats in those slips.

Speaking of fire works; we know that the State of Maine recently passed a law allowing personal fireworks. However, the State law also allowed municipalities to establish ordinances to prohibit the sale and use of personal fire works and we did.

Not only can unauthorized fire works be a noise nuisance to friends and neighbors, but they can be extremely dangerous. A fire on this Island could be devastating to say nothing of the personal injury that could result. So there will be no warnings or second chances. If anyone is caught exploding unauthorized fire works on the Island they should expect to be fined which could be up to \$500.00.

**Beano / Bingo:** The Hodges, John & Theresa, have volunteered to run the BINGO this year. However, they have to do it on Sunday night instead of Monday. The first night will be Sunday July 15<sup>th</sup> so as not to interfere with the Bob Marley Comedy night. I have applied for the permit so we should have it in time.

**Taxes:** A friendly reminder that the second installment of the property tax is due on June 30. All taxes outstanding after that date will accrue interest.

**Frye Island Inc. Board Meeting:** The meeting of the FII Board has been scheduled for 8:00AM on Saturday July 7<sup>th</sup> at the Community Center.

**Meeting Reminder: Executive Committee Meeting:** The next Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee meeting has been scheduled for Saturday July 14. The meeting will be held at the Community Center and will begin at 9 AM. This is an open meeting and I encourage everyone to attend.

The Public Works Department will aggressively pursue, fine and if need be prosecute any illegal dumping at the transfer station or the beach barrels.

Please purchase a good quality trash barrel with a locking lid, also many stores carry rodent and raccoon resistant trash bags.

**Waterline Work**

Waterline work is ongoing please drive slowly through the construction areas. A reminder! Please remove any plants, ornaments etc that you wish to keep from between your lot pins and the road. The waterline is continuing along the “one back” side of Leisure Lane, as the crew installs the new waterline, roadside ditching and culvert replacement also takes place. In the fall we will retrace our route and neaten up areas and install needed drainage on the lake side of Leisure.

**Cumberland County Soil and Water Conservation**

Your Public Works Department has been working with the Cumberland County Soil and Water Conservation District on several island projects. As time allows we have been supplying labor and materials on these projects. Currently we are working on drainage issues and planting on Beach #3. The CCSWCD has provided grant funds and engineering, Frye Island is providing labor, materials and some matching funds.

## ROAD, FIRE LANE AND LOT NUMBERS

All owners and renters should know the road, fire lane and lot number where they are located in the event of a fire, medical or police emergency.

This information will greatly expedite the response time for the emergency service that is answering your call. Time is critical!

All road signs and fire lanes signs on the island are clearly marked.

Every house, by town ordinance, shall have a lot number in large, contrasting colors that can be seen by emergency responders approaching from either direction.

If possible, a person should meet the emergency responders on the street and at night turn on all outdoor lighting.

If you have any questions or concerns regarding your road, fire lane or lot number, they can be addressed by any member of the fire department.



# Marina News

## Safe Boating Tips

- Age Requirements-“When operating a motorboat with more than 10 horsepower, a person under the age of 12 must be under immediate supervision of a person located in the boat who is at least 16 years of age. A person under the age of 16 years may not operate personal watercraft, which includes jet skis. **A person between 16-18 years of age may operate a personal watercraft if they have successfully completed an approved education course, or if they are accompanied by a person 18 years of age or older.** Proof of age and course must be possessed while operating a personal watercraft.” For the safety of all, please abide by the above law.
- Watercraft 16 feet or longer, must have a wearable U.S. Coast Guard approved Type I, II, or III PFD (personal flotation device) for each person on board PLUS at least one throw able device (Type IV) on board. Watercraft under 16 feet in length require one PFD for each person on board. All children 10 years of age and younger must wear a Type I, II, or III PFD while on board a watercraft.


