## Island Manager's Comments

### Greetings everyone:

**Lake Level:** There has been no change with the status of SD Warren's permit application, and the revised Lake Level Management Plan. However, the Bureau of Environmental Protection has agreed to consider the request to reopen the Water Quality Certification process on August 16. I would urge everyone to view the Save Our Sebago website at, [www.saveoursebago.com](http://www.saveoursebago.com), for information. I will let you know as soon as there is more to report. I heard through the grapevine that the Garden Club is going to get a speaker from "Save Our Sebago" to address the Lake Level Management Plan and the associated issues. I am sure this will be very informative. Stay tuned for further information.

**Volunteer needed:** We employ a certified diver to remove milfoil from the affected areas around the Marina. He has asked if we could get a volunteer to help him. You don't need to dive, he does that, but he would like someone to handle the bags of milfoil that he removes etc. It saves him having to get out of the water which saves time. This isn't an everyday task but is done when needed. If anyone is interested please call the office.

**Beano / Bingo:** The Hodges, John & Theresa, have volunteered to run the BINGO this year. However, they have to do it on Sunday night instead of Monday. The first night will be this Sunday July 15<sup>th</sup>

**Community Center Tennis Courts:** Keep up the faith the end is in sight. We have had a number of weather delays that have caused the completion of the tennis courts to drag on but I recently spoke with Vermont Tennis and they plan to be here Monday to start installing the new fence. Once the fence is in they will paint the courts and the lines. Then we need to wait three days for the paint to cure so we should be able to use them on the 28<sup>th</sup>. Lets hope there are no more delays.

**Michael Murphy Day:** I was privileged to meet some of the young men of the USS Michael Murphy recently and was extremely impressed. They were all very dedicated to our country, committed to their duty, and exceptionally proud of their ship and her namesake; Lt. Michael Murphy

Michael Patrick Murphy was a Navy SEAL from Long Island, New York who gave his life trying to save his SEAL team in Afghanistan in 2005. For his heroic effort, he was posthumously awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor.

A book, *SEAL of Honor*, documents the history of this action and offers a biography of Michael Murphy, an American hero. Another book *Lone Survivor*, by Marcus Luttrell, tells of the effort required to become a Navy SEAL, and very graphically tells of the firefight on Hindu Kush when Michael Murphy died. If you like reading of military history and heroic efforts, I would recommend them both.

On Saturday, July 28<sup>th</sup> Frye Island will provide a day of recreation for the men and women that will proudly serve on the USS Michael Murphy. Thanks to the efforts of Dick Norris, this will be the third Bath built ships crew we will have treated to a day on the Island. I urge everyone to get involved to make this a memorable day for these young men and women before they sail.

I would urge you to consider inviting a couple (more if you want) of the crew members to share dinner with you and your family that evening. It is an opportunity to meet some truly remarkable young men and women. If you haven't already volunteered, I would urge you to contact Dick Norris.

**E-911:** For a number of years we have been pressured by Cumberland County to conform to the conventional street numbering system. As you probably know we have always used the lot numbers as the address and I am not sure if they conform to anything. If you are unfamiliar with the Island, finding a cottage by the lot number is almost impossible without time and a map.

The time it takes to find a lot on the map and get an emergency vehicle to that location could mean the difference between life and death. Because of this we have always relied on a member of the volunteer fire department to escort all emergency vehicles but there will be days when we don't have that person. Therefore, we are looking into developing a conventional street numbering system. I realize that some people have very elaborate, and expensive signs using the lot number. That lot number won't change and you can still use your sign. However, with the conventional numbering system you will also have to display a second sign with the new street number. We still have a long way to go and I will keep you informed as to our progress.

**Piers, Docks, Wharves, Bridges and Other Structures and Uses Extending Over or Below the Normal High-Water Line of Sebago Lake or Within a Wetland**

**101-3 General Rules**

- (1) Access from shore shall be developed on soils appropriate for such use and constructed so as to control erosion.
- (2) The location shall not interfere with existing developed or natural beach areas.
- (3) The facility shall be located so as to minimize adverse effects on fisheries.
- (4) The facility shall be no larger in dimension than necessary to carry on the activity and be consistent with the surrounding character and uses of the area. A temporary pier, dock or wharf in Sebago Lake shall not be wider than six feet for non-commercial uses.
- (5) No new structure shall be built on, over or abutting a pier, wharf, dock or other structure extending beyond the normal high-water line of Sebago Lake or within a wetland unless the structure requires direct access to Sebago Lake or wetland as an operational necessity.
- (6) New permanent piers and docks on Sebago Lake shall not be permitted unless it is clearly demonstrated to the Planning Board that a temporary pier or dock is not feasible, and a permit has been obtained from the Department of Environmental Protection, pursuant to the Natural Resources Protection Act.
- (7) No existing structures built on, over or abutting a pier, dock, wharf or other structure extending beyond the normal high-water line of Sebago Lake or within a wetland shall be converted to residential dwelling units in any district.
- (8) Except in the General Development Districts and Commercial Fisheries/Maritime Activities District, structures built on, over or abutting a pier, wharf, dock or other structure extending beyond the normal high-water line of Sebago Lake or within a wetland shall not exceed twenty (20) feet in height above the pier, wharf, dock or other structure.

**NOTE:** New permanent structures, and expansions thereof, projecting into or over Sebago Lake shall require a permit from the Department of Environmental Protection pursuant to the Natural Resources Protection Act, 38 M.R.S.A. section 480-C. Permits may also be required from the Army Corps of Engineers if located in navigable waters.

## FRYE ISLAND FIRE DEPARTMENT EMS RESPONSE PROCEDURES

The Frye Island Fire Department is the provider of Emergency Medical Services (EMS) for victims of illness or accident while they are on the island.

Members of the fire department provide first responder / Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) level treatment with a variety of tools and equipment carried on the ambulance. Members are trained to treat patients using Basic Life Support (BLS) skills. All members are trained annually in Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and in the use of the Automated External Defibrillator (AED).

The Raymond Rescue is the contract transport ambulance service and will provide that service to the local hospitals in the area if needed. Members of the Raymond Rescue also provide paramedic level medical care for patients needing such assistance.

On receipt of a 9-1-1 call to the Cumberland County Regional Communications Center, the Frye Island and Raymond Rescue are simultaneously notified. If the call is received on island (no telephone call to the CCRCC), the FIFD will notify the CCRCC and an incident will be generated for both departments to respond.

On arrival of the FIFD, and after a patient survey has been completed, a decision will be made as to whether the Raymond Rescue is needed or if they can be dismissed. If transport is required, and depending on the nature of the illness or accident, the patient can be loaded into the FIFD ambulance and taken to the mainland by ferry to await the arrival of the Raymond Rescue.

Soon after I left I noticed my golf cart was beginning to run funny, sputtering to the point where it almost stalled. I knew I had to turn around as I would never have made it to the course. As I sputtered the golf cart up the driveway to my cottage, I could see through my picture window my significant other, with the neighbor, in what some would consider a romantic embrace. I was horrified and confused!! I'm crushed, and I just don't know what to do. Please help; I don't know where to turn.

Dear sputtered,

I'm not going to tell you this is a good thing, but it's not all that bad either. You see today's gas contains 10% ethanol. What I suspect is your problem is that when you parked your golf cart at the end of last year you forgot to add a stabilizer. You see, with the 10% ethanol, if left untreated for long periods of time the ethanol will tend to varnish the inside of your carburetor, causing the sputtering problems. No need to worry, this can be fixed with a simple carburetor cleaning and some fuel additive. Take the carb off and spray with carb cleaner and reassemble. Next, drain all the old gas out of the tank and replace with 93% octane. Run a tank of 93% through the cart along with a good carb cleaning and I'm willing to bet your cart will be just fine. ## Frye Island Package Delivery Procedures and Information:

The ferry crews are responsible for the safe and efficient transportation of vehicles and passengers to and from the Island, and can only address freight issues as time allows.

- Both UPS and FEDEX deliver ONLY to the ferry trailer, and not to addresses on Frye Island.
- Since there is no set delivery time, packages arrive (up to 6 different deliveries) throughout the day. They are stored at the Ferry landing, until they are moved to the Island Post Office for pick up by recipients.

- A non-paid Island volunteer transports the packages to Frye Island Post Office, and the packages are usually available for pick up by 6PM.
- If you are a renter expecting a package delivery, you will need to request a post office key from the town office the following day, during normal business hours, to pick up your package in the Island Post Office.

If you are expecting a time-sensitive delivery, and you have personally verified its arrival with the delivery company, you may travel across on the ferry as a pedestrian at no charge to pick up your delivery. DO NOT call the ferry landing for package delivery information. We handle thousands of packages each season, and cannot possibly manage to go searching for every individual's arrival.

It is very important to have current and accurate contact information regarding phone numbers and Email addresses in the Frye Island directory, in the event that you must be contacted regarding package delivery issues.

# Marina News

## Safe Boating Tips

- Watercraft towing a person or persons on water-skis, surfboards, aquaplanes, or similar devices shall not operate within water safety zones (area of water within 200 feet of any shoreline, mainland or island). Exception: to drop-off or pickup passengers, while ensuring that persons and property are not endangered in the process.
- Any person being towed on water skis, surfboards, or similar devices must wear a life jacket, life belt, or similar life saving device. No watercraft operator shall tow anyone involved in the aforementioned activities unless the person being towed has complied with this requirement.
- Watercraft towing a person on water skis, surfboard, or other similar devices must have a person in the watercraft who is at least 12 years of age, in addition to the operator, who is in a position to continually observe the person/s being towed.
