## Island Manager's Comments

**Greetings everyone:**

**Save Our Sebago presentation:** I have mentioned the lake level and the new Lake Level Management Plan (LLMP) proposed by S.D. Warren almost every week since the Island opened. I have also mentioned the fact that an organization called *Save Our Sebago* was established to consolidate the effort in opposition to the proposed plan. Frye Island has joined Save Our Sebago in this effort. Lake levels, as permitted by the proposed LLMP have the potential to significantly affect the operation of the ferry service. Now is your chance to get all of the information on the proposed Lake Level Management Plan. The Conservation Commission and the Garden Club are co-sponsoring a presentation from "Save Our Sebago" on Saturday evening August 4<sup>th</sup> at 7 PM. The presentation will be held at the Community Center. Charlie Frechette will be the guest speaker. Charlie has been involved in the effort to get a reasonable Lake Level Management Plan since the relicensing process began almost 9 years ago. I am sure the presentation will be very informative and Charlie will be able answer all the questions you might have. Coffee and dessert will be served.

**Community Center Tennis Courts:** By the time you read this the rebuilt tennis courts at the Community Center will be open. This morning at 8:00 o'clock we are having a very brief ribbon cutting ceremony and then we will open the gates. If you are a tennis player and you intend to use these courts there are a few things you should know.

1. The courts will be open from 8AM until 8PM. From 8PM until 8AM the gates will be locked.
2. These courts are to be used for tennis only.
3. Please wear only appropriate tennis shoes. Black soled shoes tend to scuff the courts and leave black marks.
4. The courts are for the use of Frye Island property owners, their guests and renters only.
5. There will be sign up sheets posted on the gate where you can reserve a court. There are 2 courts, the one on the right side is court #1, and the one on the left side is court #2. You can sign up 24 hours in advance of the time you want to play and no sooner.
6. You can reserve the courts for **one hour** if playing singles and **two hours** if playing doubles. Please include the names of all of the players in your group when you reserve the court.

We will be getting appropriate signage, but in the mean time, please remember these few basic rules for using these courts. The Town just spent close to \$100,000 to rebuild these courts so please use them responsibly and be considerate of others while using these facilities.



## **FRYE ISLAND FIRE DEPARTMENT EMS RESPONSE PROCEDURES**

The Frye Island Fire Department is the provider of Emergency Medical Services (EMS) for victims of illness or accident while they are on the island.

Members of the fire department provide first responder / Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) level treatment with a variety of tools and equipment carried on the ambulance. Members are trained to treat patients using Basic Life Support (BLS) skills. All members are trained annually in Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and in the use of the Automated External Defibrillator (AED).

The Raymond Rescue is the contract transport ambulance service and will provide that service to the local hospitals in the area if needed. Members of the Raymond Rescue also provide paramedic level medical care for patients needing such assistance.

On receipt of a 9-1-1 call to the Cumberland County Regional Communications Center, the Frye Island and Raymond Rescue are simultaneously notified. If the call is received on island (no telephone call to the CCRCC), the FIFD will notify the CCRCC and an incident will be generated for both departments to respond.

On arrival of the FIFD, and after a patient survey has been completed, a decision will be made as to whether the Raymond Rescue is needed or if they can be dismissed. If transport is required, and depending on the nature of the illness or accident, the patient can be loaded into the FIFD ambulance and taken to the mainland by ferry to await the arrival of the Raymond Rescue.

Frye Island Fire Department members are dispatched by the CCRCC on the receipt of a fire or medical emergency by portable radios. We maintain radio communications with the CCRCC, the Raymond Fire Department and the Raymond Rescue.

Any questions or concerns regarding these procedures should be addressed to FIFD Chief Steve Persson.

### ***Did you know that....***

Code Enforcement Officer: John Thompson

Fences: Fence permit required!

#### **1. Purpose**

The purpose of this paragraph is to regulate the placement of fencing on Frye Island properties.

#### **2. Fence permit required; standards**

The property owner shall obtain a permit from the Code Enforcement Officer to erect a fence on their property. Said fence shall be at least twelve (12) inches from the abutting property line and shall be maintained by the owner of the property on which the fence stands. Fences may be erected at any distance less than 12 inches from the property line in the event written consent from the affected abutter (s) is provided to the Town.

#### **3. Preexisting fences**

Existing fences in place on the date of enactment of this Ordinance shall be considered grandfathered and may remain in place.

#### **4. Fence violations and penalties**

Any person found to have committed a violation of this Ordinance shall be fined an amount equal to twice the permit fee set forth from time to time by resolution of the Board of Selectment.

Here's an excerpt from an e-mail I got from CDR Tom Shultz:


“The crew and I had a fantastic time on Saturday....haven't heard a negative response from any of our Sailors. My thanks to the entire island.

## Alcohol in Public Places

Alcohol violations are one of the many interpretations that need to be addressed. First, consumption of alcohol or being in possession of an open container of alcohol in a public place is illegal. What is a public place? All roads and infrastructure that is operated by a government entity, in our case the Town of Frye Island. In short, when moving around the island either on foot or by other means, obvious signs of open containers of alcohol will be a violation of the Drinking in Public statute.

Once again, I ask that we use a little common sense with this. It's a small island; keep the cap on it until you are getting to where you're going.

## Frye Island Package Delivery Procedures and Information:

The ferry crews are responsible for the safe and efficient transportation of vehicles and passengers to and from the Island, and can only address freight issues as time allows.

- Both UPS and FEDEX deliver ONLY to the ferry trailer, and not to addresses on Frye Island.

- Since there is no set delivery time, packages arrive (up to 6 different deliveries) throughout the day. They are stored at the Ferry landing, until they are moved to the Island Post Office for pick up by recipients.
- A non-paid Island volunteer transports the packages to Frye Island Post Office, and the packages are usually available for pick up by 6PM.
- If you are a renter expecting a package delivery, you will need to request a post office key from the town office the following day, during normal business hours, to pick up your package in the Island Post Office.

If you are expecting a time-sensitive delivery, and you have personally verified its arrival with the delivery company, you may travel across on the ferry as a pedestrian at no charge to pick up your delivery. DO NOT call the ferry landing for package delivery information. We handle thousands of packages each season, and cannot possibly manage to go searching for every individual's arrival.

It is very important to have current and accurate contact information regarding phone numbers and Email addresses in the Frye Island directory, in the event that you must be contacted regarding package delivery issues.

## Marina News

### Safe Boating Tips

- Watercraft may not be operated at a speed greater than "headway speed" while within a water safety zone (**200 feet of shore**), marina or approved anchorage. Headway speed is defined as the minimum speed necessary to maintain steerage and control of the watercraft while it is moving.
- Boaters must always consider the effects of the wash or waves created by their watercraft to piers, floats, shorelines, or property of others. The operator is civilly responsible for any damage incurred.
- Always check your watercraft's "capacity plate" and adhere to it's guidance. Overloading your boat can lead to capsizing and the potential for loss of life.
