Greetings everyone:

Elections: We will be holding a number of elections between now and the end of the season:

1. **The Frye Island Incorporated stockholders meeting** will be held Saturday September 1st. The following people have indicated a desire to be re-elected to the Board of Directors of the Corporation:

If you are interested in running for a position on the Board of Directors, please notify the office. When Frye Island Incorporated (FII) was formed, each property owner was awarded one (1) share of stock in FII and therefore entitled to one vote at the annual stock holders meeting. A person that owns more than one lot will be entitled to one vote for each lot.

At the Town meeting in October we will be voting for a Selectman and a BIT representative for the Executive Committee. In order to run for the selectman's position and to vote for the selectman you must be a registered voter in Frye Island.

In order to run for the vacant BIT representatives position and to vote for the BIT Representative a person must meet the following requirements. He or she must be a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age, and an owner or a spouse of an owner of real property located within the Town of Frye Island with a fixed home currently occupied by the person, maximum two people per fixed home.

2. If you are interested in running for any of the open positions please notify the office.
3. The State and National elections will be held on the first Tuesday in November. The elections will be held at the Ferry Trailer and absentee ballots will be made available when we receive them. There will be more information when we get closer to the elections.

Medical Emergency Procedure

Dial 9-1-1

Your 9-1-1 call will be received at the Raymond Dispatch Center.

State your name, your location, and the nature of the emergency.

The Raymond Dispatch Center will dispatch the Frye Island Fire Department medical First Responders and Raymond Rescue. The Raymond Dispatch Center will also notify the ferry captain for an emergency run. This will occur during normal operating hours and during off-hours.

Time is critical in an emergency! Stay at your location until help arrives. Medical personnel are responding to your location. If you leave that location, you may bypass responding rescue personnel.

Fire Emergency: Dial 9-1-1

Your 9-1-1 call will be received at the Raymond Dispatch Center.

State your name, your location, and the nature of the emergency. Then **get out of the building if there is a fire.**

The Raymond Dispatch Center will dispatch the Frye Island and Raymond Fire Departments. Raymond Dispatch will also notify the ferry.

Note that all streets and fire lanes on the island are clearly marked. All owners and visitors should know the street, lot number, fire lane, and a nearby landmark where they are located in the event of a fire, medical, or police emergency. This information will greatly expedite the response time for the emergency service that is answering your call. Time is critical!

Permit required

Clear Cutting

1. Prohibition

After the effective date of this Section, clear cutting of a lot is prohibited except as shown on an approved building permit

2. Remediation

If a lot is clear cut after the effective date of this Section, no Building Permit shall be granted for that lot until Remediation has been completed. If more than 5 trees are required, no one species shall make up more than 50% of the number of trees planted.

The Code Enforcement Officer may issue a conditionally approved Building Permit showing the Remediation which is required, but construction may not be commenced until completion of the Remediation.

Clearing of Vegetation for Development

1. Within a shoreland area zoned for Resource Protection abutting Sebago Lake, there shall be no cutting of vegetation within the strip of land extending seventy-five (75) feet, horizontal distance, inland from the normal high-water line, except to remove safety hazards. Elsewhere, in any Resource Protection District the clearing of vegetation shall be limited to that which is necessary for uses expressly authorized in that district.

2. Except in areas as described in ¶ N.1. above, and except to allow for the development of permitted uses, within a strip of land extending one hundred (100) feet, horizontal distance, inland from the normal high-water line of Sebago Lake and seventy-five (75) feet, horizontal distance, from any tributary stream or the upland edge of a wetland, a buffer strip of vegetation shall be preserved as follows:

a. There shall be no cleared opening greater than two-hundred-fifty (250) square feet in the forest canopy as measured from the outer limits of the tree crown. However, a footpath not to exceed ten (10) feet in width as measured between tree trunks is permitted provided that a cleared line of sight to the water through the buffer strip is not created. Adjacent to Sebago Lake or a stream flowing to it, the width of the foot path shall be limited to six (6) feet.

b. Cutting of trees

i. Selective cutting of trees within the buffer strip is permitted, provided that a well-distributed stand of trees and other vegetation is maintained. For the purposes of this section, a "well-distributed stand of trees and other vegetation" adjacent to: Sebago Lake or a stream flowing to it shall be defined as maintaining a rating score

Safe Boating Tips

- Ensure that all hose clamps and hoses are attached and hose clamps secured tightly. Check same periodically during the boating season. Vibrations will loosen those hoses and clamps.
- Secure your watercraft covers tightly and with “pitch” to allow for rapid water run-off. This will prevent sagging and pooling of water and leaves, etc.; the primary cause for canvas wear and tears.
- Registration-All motorboats of any size, including airboats and personal watercraft, must be registered in Maine or reciprocal state. State of Maine registrations may be processed at the Town Office, here on Frye Island. Any boat principally used in Maine should be registered in Maine. Out of State reciprocity is only good for 60 calendar days. This is a problem here on Frye Island and the Maine Wardens Service will be checking.


