Island Manager's Comments

Greetings everyone:

Elections: We will be holding a number of elections between now and the end of the season:

1. **The Frye Island Incorporated stockholders meeting** will be held Saturday September 1st. The following people have indicated a desire to be re-elected to the Board of Directors of the Corporation:

Joe Potts	Nancy Donio
Jacque Ossi	Ed Charrette
Neill Bovaird	David Lowe

If you are interested in running for a position on the Board of Directors, please notify the office. When Frye Island Incorporated (FII) was formed, each property owner was awarded one (1) share of stock in FII and therefore entitled to one vote at the annual stock holders meeting. A person that owns more than one lot will be entitled to one vote for each lot they own.

2. **Select Person:** At the Town meeting in October we will be voting for one Selectman to serve a three year term. In order to run for the selectman's position and to vote for the office of selectman you must be a registered voter in Frye Island.

John Nun's three year term will expire this year and Mr. Nun has decided to run for reelection.

3. **Board of Island Trustee Representative:** We will also be voting for a representative for the Board of Island Trustees to serve on the Executive Committee. This is a three year term. In order to run for the vacant BIT representative's position and to vote for the BIT representative a person must meet the following requirements.

- a. He or she must be a citizen of the United States.
- b. Must be at least 18 years of age.
- c. And, an owner or a spouse of an owner of real property located within the Town of Frye Island with a fixed home currently occupied by the person, maximum two people per fixed home.

If you are interested in running for any of the open positions please notify the office.

In addition, the State and National elections will be held on the first Tuesday in November. The elections will be held at the Ferry Trailer and absentee ballots will be made available when we receive them. There will be more information when we get closer to the elections.

Meeting Reminder: Executive Committee Meeting:

The Executive Committee has scheduled a special meeting for the purpose of entering into an Executive Session to discuss personnel issues. This meeting has been scheduled for Saturday, August 25th at 8AM at the Community Center. The next regular meeting of the Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee meeting has been scheduled for Saturday September 22nd. The meeting will be held at the Community Center and will begin at 9 AM. This will be an open meeting and everyone is invited to attend.

Public Hearing: A public hearing has been scheduled for Saturday September 1. The Public Hearing will be held at the Community Center and will begin immediately following the FII Stockholders meeting. The purpose of the Public Hearing is to discuss the following:

1. Revisions to the Frye Island Parking Ordinance.
2. Draft budget for 2013

Taxes: We are getting ready to mail out the "30 Day Notices". State law requires that we send a notice to all property owners who have delinquent taxes 30 days before the Town applies a lien on the property. The State has very specific time lines and procedures for the lien / foreclosure process. Once the 30 day notices are prepared and mailed, the property owner has 30 days to pay the outstanding balance. If that balance is not paid by then, tax liens will be placed on the property and recorded at the Registry of Deeds at Cumberland County. So, if you have outstanding taxes please pay them before we have to go through this process. Please also remember that interest accrues daily, so by the time you receive a notice, more interest has been applied.


The Trench Monkey's have made a right turn and are now on Birch Road heading to Highpoint. Please drive slowly through the construction work zone.

STOP, DROP AND ROLL

Each year more than 15,000 people are seriously burned when their clothes catch fire. Burns are among the most painful of injuries and the third leading cause of unintentional death in the United States. The hands, groin, face and lungs are at particular risk and are easily injured. The healing process is slow and painful resulting in enormous personal suffering.

STOP, DROP and **ROLL**, is a highly recommended tactic if your clothes catch fire. When a person's clothes catch fire, they may instinctively attempt to run for help. Running may actually "fan" the clothes that are on fire and cause them to burn at a higher rate. The act of running can actually increase the risk of a burn to a person whose clothes are on fire.

By stopping, dropping to the ground, and rolling, the clothes that are on fire may actually be smothered or burn at a lesser rate. Although there are no guarantees that burns will not occur, this tactic may help a person survive a clothing fire with less severe burns and have a better chance at survival without major injury.

Remember, the principles of **STOP, DROP** and **ROLL** are simple:

- **STOP** – do not run if your clothes catch on fire
- **DROP** – to the ground and cover your face
- **ROLL** – continue to roll to smother the fire

If you are near someone whose clothing catches on fire, be sure to stop him or her from running and make them **STOP, DROP** and **ROLL**.

Once the fire is out call **9-1-1** or your local emergency number; if someone is nearby while you are assisting ask them to make the call. Cool a burn with water.


Thank You


SMOKE ALARMS

Dear Frozen Love,

This doesn't give me much to work with, so let's start from the beginning. Open the fridge door to make sure the interior light works. Next, put in the fridge a home thermometer, like the kind to take a person's temperature and close the fridge door. After a few minutes check the temperature. If the temperature is above 40 degrees, there is your problem! Now the fix, remove your toe kick and inspect the condenser coil for lint and dirt, clean as needed. The water filter cartridge should also be inspected and changed as needed. Lastly, the thermostatically controlled damper will need a continuity test to assure suitable operation. When the condenser coil is cleaned and all other discussed parts check out as ok you should be good. Now for the best part, call your wife at her mother's and break the good news, the fridge is fixed!! Soon she'll be serving up your favorite cold beverage and all will be right in the world. Don't Feed the Ducks

Feeding ducks also makes them dependent on hand-outs and makes them tame. Ducks are wild birds that should not rely on humans to feed them. They also need to learn how to get their own food.

When ducks become tame and use to humans they may not be able to protect themselves from predators.

Another reason not to feed ducks is because of the waste that is left behind. Duck droppings can contain bacteria that is not healthy for humans. Too much bacteria in the water and on the land where the ducks are attracted to can be detrimental to your health.

Don't forget, in many areas ducks are suppose to migrate to different areas at different times of the year. If you feed ducks you may be delaying their migration.

Ducks are cute little critters that are fun to watch and great to photograph. Most ducks can fend for themselves. If there are ducks in a pond or lake near you that have always seemed to be there chances are someone is taking care of them if they cant take care of themselves.
