# Town News

## Island Manager's Comments

### Greetings everyone:

**High Season:** It is hard to believe that school has already started in many places and those that haven't will be starting next week. And, the high season at Frye Island is just about over.

Be sure to pay close attention to the ferry schedule because after Labor Day it changes. We go back to the low season schedule. Copies of the schedule are available on our web-site, at the ferry terminal on the mainland, and in the office on the Island. The ferry crews can't be responsible if you are unfamiliar with the schedule changes.

**Elections:** We will be holding a number of elections between now and the end of the season:

1. **The Frye Island Incorporated stockholders meeting** will be held Saturday September 1st. The following people have indicated a desire to be re-elected to the Board of Directors of the Corporation:

Joe Potts	Nancy Donio
Jacque Ossi	Ed Charrette
Neill Bovaird	David Lowe

If you are interested in running for a position on the Board of Directors, please notify the office. When Frye Island Incorporated (FII) was formed, each property owner was awarded one (1) share of stock in FII and therefore entitled to one vote at the annual stock holders meeting. A person that owns more than one lot will be entitled to one vote for each lot they own.

2. **Select Person:** At the Town meeting in October we will be voting for one Selectman to serve a three year term. In order to run for the selectman's position and to vote for the office of selectman you must be a registered voter in Frye Island.

John Nun's three year term will expire this year and Mr. Nun has decided to run for reelection.

3. **Board of Island Trustee Representative:** We will also be voting for a representative for the Board of Island Trustees to serve on the Executive Committee. This is a three year term. In order to run for the vacant BIT representative's position and to vote for the BIT representative a person must meet the following requirements.
  - a. He or she must be a citizen of the United States.
  - b. Must be at least 18 years of age.

- c. And, an owner or a spouse of an owner of real property located within the Town of Frye Island with a fixed home currently occupied by the person, maximum two people per fixed home.

Bob Sutherland's three year term will expire this year and Mr. Sutherland has decided to run for reelection. I apologize to Mr. Sutherland for not posting his intention last week.

If anyone else is interested in running for any of the open positions please notify the office.

In addition, the State and National elections will be held on the first Tuesday in November. The elections will be held at the Ferry Trailer and absentee ballots will be made available when we receive them. There will be more information when we get closer to the elections.

**Public Hearing:** A public hearing has been scheduled for Saturday September 1. The Public Hearing will be held at the Community Center and will begin immediately following the FII Stockholders meeting. The purpose of the Public Hearing is to discuss the following:

1. Revisions to the Frye Island Parking Ordinance.
2. Draft budget for 2013

### **Meeting Reminder: Executive Committee Meeting:**

The next regular meeting of the Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee meeting has been scheduled for Saturday September 22nd. The meeting will be held at the Community Center and will begin at 9 AM. This will be an open meeting and everyone is invited to attend.

**Taxes:** The "30 Day Notices" were sent out this week. There were 99 of them issued. If you got one it means that you have thirty days to pay the property taxes that are owed. If not, a tax lien will be placed on the property and it will be recorded at the registry of deeds. Please also remember that interest accrues daily, so by the time you receive a notice, more interest has been applied.

Labor Day typically signifies the end of the summer vacation period. We hope you had an enjoyable summer. Have a great Labor Day weekend and stay safe.

## ***Thank you***

Thank you to all of the wonderful Beach 5 and Beach 6 "Friends of the Daisy Scouts", for helping our very environmentally conscious kid. Last year she started with cleaning up any litter she found while going to and from the beach in the golf cart (Mom had to make many stops). This year, seeing recycleable items in the trash cans concerned her, so we decided to start a new summer project.

Thanks to your efforts to Recycle your \$.05 deposit Bottles and cans instead of throwing them into the beach trash cans, you have helped to raise over \$300, while diverting over 6000 containers from the landfill.

According to CLYNK's environmental impact calculations we have saved enough energy to light 12.8 lightbulbs - 24 hours a day - for a year, have saved the emissions equivalent of driving your car 2,425 miles and we are still collecting.

Skylar also pulled many of the tabs from the collected cans to donate to Shriners Hospital for Children and Cancer Research. She has approx 5 lbs of tabs collected. A special thanks to Debbie at DPW for her coffee container full of tabs. Sklyar was thrilled to receive them. She is already setting her goals for next year.

If you keep them, she will have a collection spot ready at lot 1312 in the Spring.

The money raised will be put to good use funding fun, creative events and environmentally educational outings for the troop.

Mark Savoie, volunteers, with his carpentry skills and his ferry painting skills.


Todd Voltz, volunteers with waterline work during opening and closing and fireworks preparation.

DISCLOSURE**

Dear Consumer: State law, specifically 32 M.R.S.A., Chapter 33, §2313-A, requires that chimney or fireplace installers, as of January 1, 1992, provide you with this "Disclosure" prior to the installation or construction of your chimney or fireplace. The purpose of this Disclosure is to inform you that the National Fire Protection Standard #211 (NFPA #211) is the current standard which applies to all new construction of chimneys and fireplaces. Please to note that the State of Maine does not require registration or licensure of chimney or fireplace installers. It is important to realize that many fires are caused each year from improperly constructed fireplaces and chimneys. This disclosure form should help you in making an informed decision as to the abilities of the installer and under what requirements the installation must comply.

All interested Islanders and Yacht Club members are welcome to attend. This is a public meeting.

- Age Requirements-“When operating a motorboat with more than 10 horsepower, a person under the age of 12 must be under immediate supervision of a person located in the boat who is at least 16 years of age. A person under the age of 16 years may not operate personal watercraft, which includes jet skis. **A person between 16-18 years of age may operate a personal watercraft if they have successfully completed an approved education course, or if they are accompanied by a person 18 years of age or older.** Proof of age and course must be possessed while operating a personal watercraft.” For the safety of all, please abide by the above law.
- Watercraft 16 feet or longer, must have a wearable U.S. Coast Guard approved Type I, II, or III PFD (personal flotation device) for each person on board PLUS at least one throw able device (Type IV) on board. Watercraft under 16 feet in length require one PFD for each person on board. All children 10 years of age and younger must wear a Type I, II, or III PFD while on board a watercraft.
