



Island Manager's Comments

Greetings everyone:

Elections: We will be holding a number of elections between now and the end of the season:

The annual Town Meeting will be held on Saturday October 6th. We will be open for registration at 8:15AM and the meeting will begin promptly at 9:00AM. The warrant for the meeting has been posted on the town bulletin board and on the fryeisland.com website.

1. **Select Person:** At the Town meeting in October we will be voting for one Selectman to serve a three year term. In order to run for the selectman's position and to vote for the office of selectman you must be a registered voter in Frye Island.

John Nun's three year term will expire this year and Mr. Nun has decided to run for reelection.

2. **Board of Island Trustee Representative:** We will also be voting for a representative for the Board of Island Trustees to serve on the Executive Committee. This is a three year term. In order to run for the vacant BIT representative's position and to vote for the BIT representative a person must meet the following requirements.

- a. He or she must be a citizen of the United States.
- b. Must be at least 18 years of age.
- c. And, an owner or a spouse of an owner of real property located within the Town of Frye Island with a fixed home currently occupied by the person, maximum two people per fixed home.

Bob Sutherland's three year term will expire this year and Mr. Sutherland has decided to run for reelection.

If anyone else is interested in running for any of the open positions please notify the office.

State & National Election: The State & National Elections will be held on Tuesday, November 6th. The polls will be open at the Ferry Trailer on the mainland from 10:00AM until 8:00 PM. Absentee ballots should be available soon for those that will not be able to vote in person. We were told the absentee ballots would be shipped to us by the end of this week or the first of next week at the latest. So if you call the office next week we should be able to process your request.

2013 Budget: A final draft of the 2013 budget has been posted on the Town bulletin board. A copy will be available in the office and at the Town meeting.

Executive Committee Meeting: The next meeting of the Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee has been scheduled for Saturday October 20th.

Waterline Work





10 Tips for Maintaining Your Wood Burning Fireplace

Wood burning fireplaces are works of art. The cozy hearth creates an ambiance second to none. To keep that ambiance burning bright, you need to maintain your wood burning fireplace. Many homeowners still think that they do not need to maintain their fireplaces. Whether they are wood burning, gas or electric, all fireplaces need maintenance. This is very true. Every type of fireplace needs regular maintenance so they can continue to work efficiently. You, as the homeowner can handle the everyday wood burning fireplace maintenance, however an annual fireplace inspection is recommended. Follow these suggestions for easy fireplace maintenance.

1. Clean out your firebox at least weekly if you use your wood burning fireplace on a regular basis. It's always good to leave at least an inch of ash in the bottom to act as an insulator during the months that you use it.
2. Don't use a vacuum cleaner to clean out the firebox of your wood burning fireplace. Coals can remain hot for days even after the fire has been extinguished.

3. As part of your fireplace maintenance, during the months that you are not using your fireplace, remove all ash from the firebox. Only leave your inch of ash in the firebox to act as insulation during the months that you are actually using your wood burning fireplace.
4. Before removing ash from your wood burning fireplace, always open the damper so the ash can travel up the chimney instead of being released back into the room and flying through the air.
5. When using your wood burning fireplace, burn only seasoned or hard wood to minimize soot buildup.
6. Try to burn only small hot fires in your wood burning fireplace rather than smoldering fires. This will also keep the buildup of creosote to a minimum.
7. Make sure the latch of your wood burning fireplace fits tightly to create an efficient seal.
8. Ensure that the door gasket of your wood burning fireplace is able to tolerate high temperatures.
9. Clean your wood burning fireplace screen with a mild non abrasive cleaner when it becomes dirty.
10. Call in a wood burning fireplace professional to inspect your fireplace and clean the chimney to remove creosote which can build up and cause a fire. Checking the chimney vent for debris is also important before the start of the fireplace season.

Fireplaces whether they are wood burning, gas or electric require maintenance and inspections to ensure that they remain in good working condition. If you encounter a problem with your wood burning fireplace, and you're not sure how to remedy it, do not hesitate to call in a professional for your wood burning fireplace maintenance. In addition, it is extremely important that you keep your children and pets away from a wood burning fireplace. Finally, a very important component to your fireplace maintenance routine is never use your wood burning fireplace as a storage space. Yes, people really do it!

Safe Boating Tips

- When commissioning your watercraft from storage, ensure that all hose clamps and hoses are reattached and hose clamps secured tightly. Check same periodically during the boating season. Vibrations will loosen those hoses and clamps.
- Storage Tips- Strategically place handfuls of mothballs in the bilge and compartments on your watercraft to deter field mice and nature's critters from making their homes in your boat for the winter months. Place an uncovered five gallon plastic bucket filled with loose charcoal briquettes in the center of your galley area or cockpit for winter storage. The briquettes wick away moisture and give your watercraft a clean odor after a long winter.
- During and after refueling operations, your vessel's power ventilation system should be activated for at least 4 minutes after refueling to remove all gasoline/fuel vapors from the engine compartment, **BEFORE STARTING** your engine. A fully charged fire extinguisher should be readily available for emergency use. After fueling, open the door of the engine compartment and sniff to check for evidence of gas fumes. Do this before starting the engine.
- Never use water to extinguish a gasoline fire. Water will only spread the area of the fire. Fire extinguishers should be kept full at all times and be in good condition. Ensure that nozzles are obstruction free and in good condition.
