



Island Manager's Comments

Greetings everyone: It doesn't sound like Mother Nature is going to provide a very nice weekend but hopefully we will still be able to enjoy the long weekend with family and friends. Let us not forget that Memorial Day, is a day of remembrance for those who have died in our nation's service.

Long Beach Marina: This is the last weekend to pay your Marina / Quail Circle fees. Please get them in so you don't face the possibility of losing the slip.

The fees for 2013 are the same as last year:

- Marina Equity Slips \$225.00 *
- Marina Rental \$900.00 *
- Quail Circle \$200.00
- Xtra wide slips add \$100.00

PUBLIC HEARING: Don't forget the Executive Committee has scheduled a Public Hearing to discuss the development of the Ring Road on the mainland and the E - 911 house numbering system. This hearing will be held at 9:00AM on Saturday May 25th at the Community Center.

In last weeks FINS I mentioned that we were looking at having to change the names of a few of the roads on the Island because of the similarities in names. At the time, I asked for some suggestions and have received a few:

- Birch Road and Birch Circle...we do not plan to change Birch Circle because the circles are named alphabetically going from north to south. So if you have a suggestion for "Birch Road" please let me know.
- Leisure Lane north of Sunset and Leisure Lane south of Sunset... Suggestions include
 - North side of Leisure Lane change to "Paradise Drive"
 - North side of Leisure Lane change to "North Shore Drive"
 - South side of Leisure Lane change to "South Shore Drive"
 - South side of Leisure Lane change to "West Shore Drive" or "Western Shore Road"
- Harbor Lane... change to "Wayne's Way" (Not because my name is Wayne but for "Wayne" Hingston. Wayne and Kathy are the only residents on Harbor Lane.
- Hill Crest, Hill Side and HilltopNo suggestions,
- Leap View and Lake View...No suggestions.

SAD 6: The hearing on the proposed budget for SAD 6 has been scheduled for Thursday, May 30th at 7:00PM. The hearing will be held at the Bonny Eagle Middle School. All registered voters are invited to attend. The hearing is the first step in the approval process. Any changes to the proposed budget will be as a result of the hearing.

The second and final step in the budget process is the budget validation referendum. This validation vote will be held on Tuesday, June 11th at the Frye Island Community Center. The vote is conducted by secret ballot. The polls will open at 10:00AM and close at 8:00PM. All registered voters are urged to vote.

If the proposed budget passes as presented it appears our taxes will increase by about \$80,000 for the 2013 - 2014 fiscal year.

Executive Committee Meeting: The next meeting of the Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee has been scheduled for 8:00 AM Saturday June 1st at the Community Center. This is an open meeting and everyone is welcome to attend.

BARBECUE SAFETY

Use all barbecue grills away from the house. LP gas grills should be at least 3 feet from the building, away from doors, windows and any air intake vents.

All LP gas cylinders with a capacity between 4-40 lbs must be equipped with an overfill protection device (OPD).

We recommend LP gas cylinders be ten (10) feet away from the house, especially when in use.

LP gas is heavier than air and sinks. A leaky grill or cylinder could pose a serious hazard if leaking. Possible ignition sources include smoking materials, pilot lights, automobiles, compressors and heating or cooling units.

Make sure that all connections are tight and secure.

Supervise children whenever any type of grill is in use.

Use only charcoal lighter fluid to start charcoal grills. **NEVER** use gasoline. Once the coals are lit, never add lighter fluid to the fire – flames may travel up the stream resulting in serious burns.

BURN FIRST AID

Stop, drop and roll to extinguish a clothing fire.

Cool a burn. For minor burns, run cool water immediately over the burn.

Dial 9-1-1 to access emergency help for more serious burns.

What you CAN do under Shoreland zoning

This Story Series highlights the many activities that shoreland zoning allows, even encourages.

Often we hear comments like: "you can't cut any vegetation in the shoreland zone buffer." The purpose of this brief article is to debunk this myth.

True: The shoreland zone buffer standards that apply to areas within 100 feet of a lake or pond and within 75 feet of other water bodies and wetlands are somewhat restrictive.

True: A landowner may not cut or remove all the vegetation from an undisturbed buffer and create a new lawn extending down to the shoreline.

However, the vegetation removal standards do allow a fair amount of vegetation to be removed from within the buffer in many cases. Often, a landowner building a new home in the shoreland zone who follows the vegetation removal standards closely can end up with a great view to the water.

The "point system", so called, allows the removal of trees that are larger than 2 inches in diameter, provided a minimum number of points of trees are retained- the larger the tree the greater the point value.

The standards also allow for the pruning of all live tree branches from the bottom third of the tree. The taller the tree, the higher a landowner may prune.

For example, the lower 20 feet of a tree may be pruned completely of branches on a 60 foot tall tree, resulting in only a comparatively small tree trunk impeding a view to the water.

Between thinning the tree stand and pruning branches many properties can create an impressive view to the water.

Certainly, a sparsely vegetated property already will be very restricted in vegetation removal, but many of those properties already have a decent view.

How to contact the Frye Island Police-EMS Department

To avoid any confusion contacting your Police and EMS Department, please follow these simple rules.

1. For emergencies; always dial 911
2. For non-emergency business; dial 893-2810 in area code 207. This is the number to the dispatch center that the island contracts with. Contact will be made with Police, Fire and EMS in real time by way of radio, phone, pager or email via I Phone. A call will be returned to the complainant shortly after we receive the information from dispatch.
3. Please do not leave police messages with the folks at the Town Hall, Public Works, Fire Department or other Town departments. In the past they have all been kind enough to relay messages to the police department but this is not their responsibility.

Volunteer Ambulance Drivers Wanted

The Frye Island EMS service will be obtaining from the State of Maine a patient transport license which will enable the FI EMS service to legally transport patients to the mainland and in certain circumstances, beyond.

The one day course will be June 8th here on the island. This one day course will certify volunteers as AVOC Drivers and enable them to legally operate the ambulance during patient transport situations.

Marina News

Safe Boating Tips

- During and after refueling operations, your vessel's power ventilation system should be activated for at least 4 minutes after refueling to remove all gasoline/fuel vapors from the engine compartment, **BEFORE STARTING** your engine. A fully charged fire extinguisher should be readily available for emergency use. After fueling, open the door of the engine compartment and sniff to check for evidence of gas fumes. Do this before starting the engine.
- Trash bags(kitchen size) and gallon size zip lock bags come in handy while boating for numerous uses(especially for securing trash). Please encourage your boating passengers to use them and secure them while underway. A trash bag sucked onto a boat's outdrive, could prove fatal to the engine that picks it up.
