# Town News

## Island Manager's Comments

### Greetings everyone:

**E-911 Addresses:** As I have reported a number of times, we are going to establish a different street numbering system to comply with the E-911 conventions. The first step in the process is to review all of the street names to identify which ones have names that are so similar that they could cause confusion. We have done this and have received a number of suggestions. I will be reviewing these suggestions with our emergency response personnel and with Raymond Fire & Rescue personnel to get their input. I will then submit our suggestions to the Executive Committee for approval. If you haven't submitted a suggestion and want to you'd better do it quickly. I will be meeting with Raymond next week.

**Ring Road:** We held a public hearing to present the progress we have made on the ring road project two weekends ago. Last weekend, at the scheduled Executive Committee meeting, the ExCom members decided to continue the application review process with the Town of Raymond. I have informed Raymond of this but it is too late to get on their agenda for the June meeting so it looks like the best we can do is get on the July agenda. I will let you know how we make out.

**Webmaster:** We have advertised for the past couple of weeks for a volunteer to take over as webmaster to replace Joe Potts who will be taking some well deserved time off. I want to thank the people that did respond and let you know that Michael Torra, a software developer, was selected to fill this position. He will be working with Joe to transition into this position

**MAINE EMS:** We have been in the process of reorganizing our emergency medical response service. We rely on the Town of Raymond as our primary medical response service but we feel it is very important to the Island residents to provide a local service in order to reduce the response time to an emergency situation. In order to help accomplish this we felt it necessary to be able to legally and safely transport a patient to the mainland to intercept Raymond when and if warranted. In order to do this we had to apply to MAINE EMS to upgrade our license to the Basic Emergency Medical Technician license level. This required that we advertise this for 30 days to allow people to comment directly to the Maine EMS. This comment period is now over and our license was upgraded as of June 3<sup>rd</sup>. We have had the rescue unit repaired, inspected and equipped so the unit is now ready for that level of response.

The next step is to train the drivers to the AVOC level. This will be accomplished this Saturday. We have a certified instructor that will be at the Community Center with 10 -12 volunteers that will be taking the course.

**SAD 6:** The hearing on the proposed budget for SAD 6 was held last week at the Bonny Eagle Middle School. The school budget, as proposed, passed as presented. What does this mean for Frye Island? There are two components that determine what each of the 5 communities in SAD 6 pay to the School district. One obviously is the amount of money the district needs to operate the school system. For the 2013 – 2014 fiscal year, the budget approved at last weeks hearing raises \$21,928,000 from local assessments. This is an increase of \$1,226,548 over the previous year. The second component determines what portion of this budget each community in the school district is going to be responsible for. This is based on each of the community's State property value and how each community's value relates to the total. In 2012, the year this budget is based on, Frye Island's State property value increased by \$7,200,000, Frye Island was the only community in the district that had an increase in State property value; all of the others decreased. What this means is that we have to pay a larger portion of the tax assessment. Last year we paid 5.58%, this year we will have to pay 6.06%. Frye Island's total proposed school assessment for the 2013 – 2014 fiscal year is \$1,329,992, an increase of \$175,079.

The final step in the budget process is the budget validation referendum. This vote validates or approves the budget that was approved at the budget hearing. It will be held on Tuesday, June 11<sup>th</sup> at the Frye Island Community Center. The vote is conducted by secret ballot. The polls will open at 10:00AM and close at 8:00PM. All registered voters are urged to vote. If you can not attend in person, absentee ballots are available in the office.

Assuming the proposed budget passes the validation process as presented our taxes will increase by about \$90,000 for the 2013 – 2014 fiscal year.

## ***Did you know that***

Code Enforcement Officer: John Thompson  
Setback Reduction Appeals is Not a Variance Appeal

Non-Conforming Setbacks [amended October 11, 2008]

A. Setback Reduction Appeals: The Board of Appeals may grant reductions from the minimum setback requirements according to all of the following criteria:

1. Setback reduction appeals are only available to reduce the minimum requirements for setbacks of structures from Lot boundary lines. Setback reduction appeals shall not be used, and are not available, to reduce required minimum setbacks of structures from bodies of water as provided in this ordinance.
2. The Board of Appeals shall grant a setback reduction appeal if the Board finds that granting the setback reduction will not result in unreasonable interference with the privacy interests of the abutting landowners.

3. In granting a setback reduction the Board of Appeals may attach reasonable conditions which it may deem necessary to serve the purpose of this ordinance.
4. A setback reduction appeal shall not be granted to enable construction or renovation that will result in more than one garage on the lot that is the subject of the appeal.
5. Setback reduction appeals may only be granted to the minimum extent necessary to accomplish the purpose of the appeal. Setbacks may not be reduced by appeal to less than the following absolute minimum setbacks:
 

Side yard	10 feet
Front yard	30 feet for a dwelling unit and 20 feet for an accessory building
Rear yard	15 feet



**Unlicensed Golf Cart Operation**

As a result of the October 2011 Town Meeting, the town voted to add to the golf cart ordinance a provision that gives authority to summons people who allow unlicensed operation of a golf cart. Typically, we stop a kid driving a golf cart without a license and their typical response is "my parents said it was ok" I honestly don't have it in me to give a ticket to a 14 year old kid for doing what their parents said was ok. On the other hand, I don't know what some parents are thinking. I'm going to let my kid play in traffic on a motorized golf cart on the same roads construction equipment and full size vehicles operate on. Often complaints are made about island speed, especially in the area of the ferry landing. So letting the 12 year old kid take the golf cart to the store for an ice cream, makes zero sense to me.



**Illegal Parking**

Just a reminder, the Town recently passed a parking ordinance restricting parking in certain locations. I ask that everyone familiarize themselves with the ordinance so that the recently purchased parking tickets can sit in the Police Department and never to see the light of day.

**Ambulance Drivers Course**

The instructor will be Chief Brent Libby of the Standish Fire/EMS Department. I ask that all who have committed to taking the course be on time as the course will start promptly at 8:00am. **Marina News**  
**Safe Boating Tips**

- Boaters must always consider the effects of the wash or waves created by their watercraft to piers, floats, shorelines, or property of others. The operator is civilly responsible for any damage incurred.
- When commissioning your watercraft from storage, ensure that all hose clamps and hoses are reattached and hose clamps secured tightly. Check same periodically during the boating season. Vibrations will loosen those hoses and clamps.
- During and after refueling operations, your vessel's power ventilation system should be activated for at least 4 minutes after refueling to remove all gasoline/fuel vapors from the engine compartment, BEFORE STARTING your engine. A fully charged fire extinguisher should be readily available for emergency use. After fueling, open the door of the engine compartment and sniff to check for evidence of gas fumes. Do this before starting the engine.


