



Town News

Island Manager's Comments

Greetings everyone: We have had an awful lot of rain lately and the roads are wet and the shoulders are soft so please be very careful driving on the roads.

E-911 Addresses: As I have reported a number of times, we are going to establish a different street numbering system to comply with the E-911 conventions. The first step in the process is to review all of the street names to identify which ones have names that are so similar that they could cause confusion. We have done this and have received a number of suggestions. I will be reviewing these suggestions with our emergency response personnel and with Raymond Fire & Rescue personnel to get their input. I will then submit our suggestions to the Executive Committee for approval.

Ring Road: We held a public hearing to present the progress we have made on the ring road project two weekends ago. Last weekend, at the scheduled Executive Committee meeting, the ExCom members decided to continue the application review process with the Town of Raymond. I have informed Raymond of this but it is too late to get on their agenda for the June meeting so it looks like the best we can do is get on the July agenda. I will let you know how we make out.

Meeting Reminder: Executive Committee Meeting: The next meeting of the Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee has been scheduled for 8:00 AM Saturday June 22nd at the Community Center. This is an open meeting and everyone is welcome to attend.

MAINE EMS: The final step was taken last Saturday to satisfy the Maine EMS requirements to convert the Frye island EMS from a non-transport-first responder service to an Emergency Medical Technician, Basic Life Support license level. We had 14 volunteers attend an AVOC (Ambulance Vehicle Operators Course) to become certified to drive the Rescue Unit. The Town of Raymond will continue to be our primary medical service; they have the Advanced Life Support staff, but we want to compliment them as best we can. During a recent training session we were told by a Raymond EMT that their typical response time to most locations in Raymond was 7 – 8 minutes. That is about what our response time is for the Island also. The new license will allow us to legally transport a patient to the mainland when and if the situation dictates we should. The average times last year for Raymond to respond to a patient on the Island was 25 - 30 minutes. The transit from the mainland to the patient contributed a significant amount of time to that average. Our goal is to get a patient to advanced care as soon as possible. If that means transporting the patient to the mainland to meet Raymond EMS we can now do that.

SAD 6: The validation election was held last Tuesday. We had 10 registered voters cast a vote on the SAD #6 budget. The results of the vote for the five communities that make up SAD #6 are listed below. Article 1 was a yes or no vote to approve the budget that was finalized at the budget hearings held on May 30th. It is this budget that will increase our school payment approximately \$90,000 from July through December.

Heart Attack Warning Signs

Some heart attacks are sudden and intense, but most heart attacks start slowly, with mild pain or discomfort. Here are signs that can mean a heart attack is happening:

- **Chest discomfort.** Most heart attacks involve discomfort in the center of the chest that lasts more than a few minutes, or that goes away and comes back. It can feel like uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness or pain.
- **Discomfort in other areas of the upper body.** Symptoms can include pain or discomfort in one or both arms, the back, neck, jaw or stomach.
- **Shortness of breath.** This feeling often comes along with chest discomfort. But it can occur before the chest discomfort.
- **Other signs.** These may include breathing out in a cold sweat, nausea or lightheadedness.

If you or someone you're with has chest discomfort, especially with one or more of the other signs, Call 9-1-1 - Get to a hospital right away.

If you're the one having symptoms, and you can't access the emergency medical services (EMS), have someone drive you to the hospital right away. Don't drive yourself, unless you have absolutely no other option.

Did you know that....

Code Enforcement Officer: John Thompson
Fences: Fence permit required!

1. Purpose

The purpose of this paragraph is to regulate the placement of fencing on Frye Island properties.

2. Fence permit required; standards

The property owner shall obtain a permit from the Code Enforcement Officer to erect a fence on their property. Said fence shall be at least twelve (12) inches from the abutting property line and shall be maintained by the owner of the property on which the fence stands. Fences may be erected at any distance less than 12 inches from the property line in the event written consent from the affected abutter (s) is provided to the Town.

3. Preexisting fences

Existing fences in place on the date of enactment of this Ordinance shall be considered grandfathered and may remain in place.

4. Fence violations and penalties

Any person found to have committed a violation of this Ordinance shall be fined an amount equal to twice the permit fee set forth from time to time by resolution of the Board of Selectment.

Canadian Geese Update

As reported in last weeks FINS, we had two adult Canadian Geese and six goslings (pictured above) living on the Golf Course. On Thursday **June 6th** an Islander was found on the Golf Course property in a golf cart with a high powered pellet rifle fitted with a scope. This person was questioned about his motives with the rifle, and he claimed he was not shooting the geese but he did state that they were a nuisance and needed to be eradicated. The Frye Island Police were notified and Chief Beaulieu came to the scene. The Chief inspected the pellet gun and warned the Islander not to shoot the geese. He informed the Islander that there are legal 7 ways to relocate them. The Chief did file a Police Report and called the Game Warden about the incident.

On **June 7th** only three of the goslings and none adult geese were seen.

On **June 8th** there were no geese at all seen and daily checks since then have produced no sightings. As these goslings were newly hatched they can not fly. One or both of the parents are always with them. Goslings enter the “fledging” stage anywhere from six to nine weeks of age and do not leave their parents until the following spring migration. Canadian Geese are monogamous meaning couples stay together all of their lives which in the wild is typically ten to fourteen years.

Killing Canadian Geese out of season is a Federal offense. Agent Eric Holmes of the US Fish and Wildlife Service has been contacted. He will follow up with Chief Beaulieu, and Sergeant Jason Luce of the Maine Wardens Service.

A reminder.... It is illegal to discharge any firearm on Frye Island. In addition, the town ordinance also prohibits the use of gas fired pellet guns.

Safe Boating Tips

- Ensure dock bumpers/fenders are securely fastened to your watercraft and are strategically placed, so as to avoid damage to your watercraft. Dock lines should be of adequate size to safely secure your watercraft. They should be supple, free of unnecessary knots and fraying, and be in good usable condition. Dock lines need to be secure after dockage and be adequate in number. Dock lines should NOT run across docks, for safety reasons. Secure your dock lines before leaving your slip.
- Always check your watercraft's "capacity plate" and adhere to it's guidance. Overloading your boat can lead to capsizing and the potential for loss of life.
- Secure your watercraft covers tightly and with "pitch" to allow for rapid water run-off. This will prevent sagging and pooling of water and leaves, etc.; the primary cause for canvas wear and tears.
- Get into the habit of cleaning your boating gear every time that you travel from one body of water to the next. Invasive water species are so small, you may not realize that they're "hitching a ride".


