# Town News

## **Island Manager's Comments**

**Greetings everyone:** As we approach July 4<sup>th</sup> and Independence Day, let's remember the reason for the celebration. In 1776 we claimed our independence from Britain and the Democratic Republic known as the United States of America was born. In addition, on July 4<sup>th</sup> 1998 the Town of Frye Island was born. As we celebrate this special day let's make sure we celebrate safely.

### **Fire Department / Emergency Medical Services**

**Reorganization:** I struggled a bit trying to figuring out where to start with this so I decided to start at the beginning. If you don't know, you should understand that Frye Island relies very heavily on volunteers to provide our Fire and our Emergency Medical Services (EMS). Up until recently, the EMS was a part of the FIFD and relied on many of the same volunteers. For the most part, we had 2 or 3 out of State professional EMS responders that were also certified to serve in Maine. Most of the time, we relied on Paul and Ruth Ann Bourque to provide the first response when these professional fire fighters were unavailable.

Unfortunately, Paul and Ruth Ann resigned from the FIFD last year leaving a huge void in our first response coverage. We still had the professional responders when they were on Island but we had to depend on Raymond Fire & Rescue as our primary EMS responders. Raymond Fire & EMS provides us with excellent service, but they are 20 to 30 minutes away from the time a 911 call is placed until they arrive on scene. The Executive Committee felt this time was unacceptable. In some extreme situations it could mean the difference between life and death. In order to help reduce this void after the Bourques resigned, we equipped qualified members of the Police Department to help fill this void on an interim basis. The Executive Committee felt it serious enough to place an article on the October 2012 town meeting warrant to provide 24 / 7 coverage for the entire 2013 season. We also solicited for volunteers to take the "first responder" course to help fill these voids. The warrant article was narrowly defeated. As a matter of fact, it passed the BIT vote but was defeated by the Town voters.

As we approached the end of the 2012 we had no additional volunteers. We did have some folks who said they would like to help in a pinch...as a second line if no first line responders were available. While we appreciate their desire to help, this approach wouldn't be

very helpful. By the time we tracked these folks down; it is very likely that Raymond Fire & EMS would be here. The whole purpose of the "on Island" volunteers is to provide the best patient care we can as soon as we can until Raymond EMS arrives.

As the winter months dragged on it became painfully obvious that we were not going to have any additional volunteers certified for the up coming season. (The first responder course is a fairly intense course that takes a minimum of 6 months to complete). That prompted us to look into options that might be available to satisfy our needs for the up coming season. Paramount to these considerations was the need to provide the best possible service we could to Frye Island and its residents. It was obvious, as we reviewed the whole response process, that the ferry could cause delays in this process. To minimize this potential delay, we determined that in some cases it would be beneficial to transport a patient to the mainland to get the advanced life support that Raymond EMS could provide. We were told that Maine EMS would allow this even though we had a non-transport license. However, when we asked Maine EMS to document this they wouldn't. Without this document the Town could potentially be exposed to a law suit; so, we applied for and received a license to transport at the Basic Life Support level. During this time we also became aware of electronic reporting requirements; mandatory training requirements and some other things that we were not sure had been completed. Among them, we know that the State does not require island use vehicles to pass safety inspections but we felt that all emergency vehicles should be properly registered and inspected. In most cases the vehicles were capable of passing these inspections but we insisted on going the extra step to have these vehicles inspected and stickered. As we plowed through some of these items, it was not our intention to step on toes but we did want to insure that we moved forward as quickly as we could as the busy season was rapidly approaching. Again, we wanted to provide the Islanders with the best service that we could while also protecting the Town from potential law suits. It is now obvious that we did step on a few toes and bruised some feelings which were not intentional. However, when you consider that we have a relatively short season and a limited amount of preparation time we pushed our volunteers quite hard; too hard apparently because a number of them resigned. One of the people that resigned was Chief Persson. I think it unfortunate, and I think Steve deserves a tremendous amount of

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credit for building the FIFD into one of the best equipped volunteer departments around.

As a result of all of this, the Executive Committee asked Chief Beaulieu to insure that his police officers, (who were already scheduled to cover about 80% of the high season), be qualified and certified to provide Emergency Medical Services during the up coming season. It was also determined that for an additional \$4500 we could provide 24 /7 EMS coverage through out the high season. The Executive Committee authorized this additional coverage. In addition, 12 Islanders agreed to attend the driver training course and are now certified to drive the ambulance. So, going forward we will have a minimum of a basic EMT on duty through the high season with a certified ambulance driver working with them.

We also lost a number of the volunteer fire department personnel along the way which again is very unfortunate and in time we hope a number of them will return. In the mean time, Dave Bond has agreed to step in as acting Chief. Dave has 35 years experience with the Topsfield Mass Fire Department, with 28 years as a lieutenant. He also has 34 years as an EMT. One of the positives that has come out of this whole episode is the number of Islanders that have stepped up to help out. Dave will be working with the new volunteers and some of those who have recently resigned but are considering returning in hopes we can build a stronger service for all the Islanders.

The new Police / EMS service and the volunteer fire fighters did experience a bit of “Baptism under Fire” this weekend. On Saturday, we had a medical call which the Police/ EMT and the volunteer driver responded to. On Sunday a severe wind, rain and thunder/ lightning storm blew through the Island. The heavy winds caused a tree to fall on some power lines and in a separate incident, the lightning ignited a shed. The Frye Island Police / EMS and the volunteer fire fighters performed extremely well in all of these incidents.

One area we did discover that needs to be addressed as we move forward is the communications system. There are a number of locations on the Island where the portable radios don't work well. We will be working with the Town of Raymond to improve this.

**ADS:** We need help:

- I still need a Planning Board / Appeals Board Secretary – Inez “Smitty” Kaplan has served these two boards for a number of years and we really appreciate her help. She has decided to resign from this position so we need someone to take meeting minutes. If there is anyone interested please call the office. We will compensate the right individual for his / her services.

**Fire Works:** The fire works will be held on Saturday July 6th. Again this year, as is usual, a number of boats will have to be moved from their slips. Boats in the Marina from slips 84 to 104 on the beach side and slips 67 to 131 on the road side plus the Jet Ski slips and boats on all of the slips on the southern end must be removed by 5:00 PM. If you have a boat in one of these slips please move it out before 5:00PM. If you don't, we will have it moved for you at your expense. The fire works display can not be set up with boats in those slips.

**Office Closure:** The office will be closed on Thursday July 4th.

**Quail Circle:** If you are installing a dock at Quail Circle, please make sure you install it correctly so that it doesn't infringe upon your neighbors space. The center of the dock should be located at the numbered pipe and pointed at the corresponding pipe on the opposite side of the channel. In addition, it has been brought to my attention that some people at Quail do not secure the outboard (the end in the water) end of the dock and wave action and wind can cause the dock to swing into their neighbor's space. So, in addition to getting the dock in the right location, please consider this swinging potential when installing your docks.

Reminder: Parking for Quail Circle is at Quail Circle, the two areas on either side are intended as 5 minute pick-up, drop-off, so if you are taking your boat out for the day, please park accordingly.

**Meeting Reminder: Executive Committee Meeting:** The next meeting of the Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee has been scheduled for 8:00 AM Saturday July 27th at the Community Center. This is an open meeting and everyone is welcome to attend.

A lightning strike at a home on Lancaster Loop ignited a structure fire in a detached shed/garage approximately 20 feet from the house. The FIFD was on scene within minutes and extinguished the fire. As is our protocol, Raymond Fire responded as well to assist us.

## **ROAD, FIRE LANE AND LOT NUMBERS**

All owners and renters should know the road, fire lane and lot number where they are located in the event of a fire, medical or police emergency.

This information will greatly expedite the response time for the emergency service that is answering your call. Time is critical!

All road signs and fire lanes signs on the island are clearly marked.

Every house, by town ordinance, shall have a lot number in large, contrasting colors that can be seen by emergency responders approaching from either direction.

If possible, a person should meet the emergency responders on the street and at night turn on all outdoor lighting.

If you have any questions or concerns regarding your road, fire lane or lot number, they can be addressed by any member of the fire department.

**101-3 General Rules**

- (1) Access from shore shall be developed on soils appropriate for such use and constructed so as to control erosion.
- (2) The location shall not interfere with existing developed or natural beach areas.
- (3) The facility shall be located so as to minimize adverse effects on fisheries.
- (4) The facility shall be no larger in dimension than necessary to carry on the activity and be consistent with the surrounding character and uses of the area. A temporary pier, dock or wharf in Sebago Lake shall not be wider than six feet for non-commercial uses.
- (5) No new structure shall be built on, over or abutting a pier, wharf, dock or other structure extending beyond the normal high-water line of Sebago Lake or within a wetland unless the structure requires direct access to Sebago Lake or wetland as an operational necessity.
- (6) New permanent piers and docks on Sebago Lake shall not be permitted unless it is clearly demonstrated to the Planning Board that a temporary pier or dock is not feasible, and a permit has been obtained from the Department of Environmental Protection, pursuant to the Natural Resources Protection Act.
- (7) No existing structures built on, over or abutting a pier, dock, wharf or other structure extending beyond the normal high-water line of Sebago Lake or within a wetland shall be converted to residential dwelling units in any district.
- (8) Except in the General Development Districts and Commercial Fisheries/Maritime Activities District, structures built on, over or abutting a pier, wharf, dock or other structure extending beyond the normal high-water line of Sebago Lake or within a wetland shall not exceed twenty (20) feet in height above the pier, wharf, dock or other structure.

**NOTE:** New permanent structures, and expansions thereof, projecting into or over Sebago Lake shall require a permit from the Department of Environmental Protection pursuant to the Natural Resources Protection Act, 38 M.R.S.A. section 480-C. Permits may also be required from the Army Corps of Engineers if located in navigable waters.

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

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### ***Fireworks are Illegal on Frye Island***

In 2011 the legislature voted to legalize fireworks in the State of Maine, the governor signed the bill making it law. I'm still trying to wrap my head around this one. Fact; the most heavily forested state in the country, which is largely protected by volunteer fire departments now has to worry about people blowing things up in the often dry Maine woods.

During the October 2011 Town Meeting, the Town voted to adopt a Town Ordinance making the use of fireworks illegal within the Town. This was done for several reasons, personal injury, and annoyance as well as protecting the community of Frye Island from excessive fire danger. Just a heads up, if anyone is caught illegally blowing up fireworks they will be charged with a violation of the fireworks ordinance, there will be no warning.

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### ***Parking Tickets Have Arrived***

Just a reminder, the Town recently passed a parking ordinance restricting parking in certain locations. I ask that everyone familiarize themselves with the ordinance. I would pay particular attention to not parking in Handicapped spaces (\$250), fire hydrants or full size vehicles on Marina Road.

### ***Free Blood Pressure-Glucose***

As High season gets underway the Town's EMS service will be offering free blood pressure and Glucose checks. This service will be offered Monday through Friday 10:00am to Noon at the Ferry Landing Rescue Barn next to the Post Office. Please stop by and say hi to the EMT's that will be working on the island this summer.

### ***Safe Boating Tips***

- **Boating Supplies:** The following boating supplies checklist, may be used as a guide for the items that you should have with you on all boating trips. For boats 16 feet and over, you must have an additional throw-able device:
  - U.S. Coast Guard approved PFDs (personal flotation devices)
  - visual distress signaling device
  - anchor and line
  - bail bucket
  - flashlight
  - approved boating fire extinguishers
  - bell or whistle
  - paddle or oars
  - tool kit, spare parts
  - navigation charts & navigation equipment
- **Boating Operation-Safe operation of a watercraft** depends on proper maintenance and preparation before, during and after use. The following items will assist you, the boater, and help assure you and your passengers of a safe trip:
  - full fuel tank
  - lights and horn working
  - weather & water conditions suitable
  - PFDs checked for proper fit
  - operator alert, ready, and sober
  - transom plug in, bilge bailed out/dry
  - fuel lines and tanks checked for leaks
  - all gear properly stowed and secured
  - propeller and lower unit free of debris
  - passengers briefed on emergencies




