Island Manager's Comments

“Downtown” Congestion: Last week I mentioned the congestion we have in the “downtown” area especially on weekends and in the evenings. We have had a number of suggestions but there are so many different scenarios that come into play it is difficult finding a single solution. Last Saturday a few of us watched from my perch on the second floor of the office as people attempted to exit the ferry or enter the ferry, some with boats and trailers, while others tried to launch boats and personnel watercraft at the boat ramp. All the while, people needed to find parking to conduct business at the office, visit the store/café, or get their mail. Long story short, there didn't appear to be an easy fix. So we all agreed that the best solution was to change the traffic pattern around “Small Frye Island” similar to a proposal suggested by Richard Norris a few years ago. Dicks proposal very basically created two way traffic on the north side of “Small Frye Island” to accommodate traffic to and from the ferry; and traffic to the office and store on the south side of “Small Frye Island”. This will require some work to widen the road a little if the Executive Committee approves the proposal. This is on the agenda for next Saturdays meeting.

Parking: Speaking of parking; as you know parking in the downtown area has become more of an issue lately. Jim Frederick suggested that we close the downtown boat ramp in the evening to open up a few more spaces. This seemed to make a lot of sense so effective immediately; the downtown boat ramp will be closed from 5:00PM in the evening until 6:00AM in the morning. If anyone needs to launch a boat or remove a boat the ramp at Long Beach Marina will be open. I would caution you to be careful about blocking others in.

Raymond Cape “Ring Road”: We met again with the Raymond Planning Board this week as they continue the review of our application to construct a Ring Road through the property on the mainland. We still need to get the storm water approval from the DEP. That review is almost complete and we should have the results of that review by the first part of August. In addition, we have been asked to provide additional signage / warning lights to insure approaching traffic is aware of the intersection at the ferry access road. We probably won't have everything ready until the September meeting. I will keep you posted.

Ferry Porta-Potti: We have leased a porta-potti for the benefit of those traveling to the Island for many years. It may not be the best facility but it does provide relief when relief is needed. It seems of late however, some folks have been compelled to dispose of their trash in the porta-potti; and not just inside of the unit but they have chucked it down the hole. It doesn't take too many brains to know that these units are not trash receptacles. And to top it all off, this week some genius defecated in the urinal. We just got it cleaned up (by a ferry employee) when a medical emergency backed-up ferry traffic and a 10ish year old young lady needed to use the facility. It would have been quite sickening had she walked into that mess. It is kind of difficult to idiot proof a porta-potti short of removing it, but if this crap continues that is just what is going to happen.

Pickleball: I am not sure how many of you have heard of Pickleball but it is becoming a very popular activity in many parts of the country and is now being played in a number of Maine communities. It is played on a smaller version of a tennis court with a paddle similar to a Ping-Pong paddle only a little larger and a whiffle ball. I mention this because in the near future we are going to tape some additional lines on one of the older tennis courts near the pool for Pickleball. If you are playing tennis there just ignore the additional lines. There was an interesting article in the July 17th issue of the Portland Press Herald if you are interested and didn't get the paper you can see it on line. Once we get started and you hear the very distinct pop as the paddle meets the whiffle ball feel free to stop in and give it a try. You might like it.

Planning Board / Board of Appeals Secretary: We are still looking for a secretary for the Planning Board and the Board of Appeals. It typically takes 4 to 5 hours a month and pays \$10.00 per hour. If interested please call the office at 655-4551

Heart Attack Warning Signs

Some heart attacks are sudden and intense, but most heart attacks start slowly, with mild pain or discomfort. Here are signs that can mean a heart attack is happening:

- **Chest discomfort.** Most heart attacks involve discomfort in the center of the chest that lasts more than a few minutes, or that goes away and comes back. It can feel like uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness or pain.
- **Discomfort in other areas of the upper body.** Symptoms can include pain or discomfort in one or both arms, the back, neck, jaw or stomach.
- **Shortness of breath.** This feeling often comes along with chest discomfort. But it can occur before the chest discomfort.
- **Other signs.** These may include breathing out in a cold sweat, nausea or lightheadedness.

If you or someone you're with has chest discomfort, especially with one or more of the other signs, Call 9-1-1 - Get to a hospital right away.

If you're the one having symptoms, and you can't access the emergency medical services (EMS), have someone drive you to the hospital right away. Don't drive yourself, unless you have absolutely no other option.

Minors and Alcohol

A few weeks ago a young man who was driving his vehicle on one of the islands roads at a high rate of speed went off the road due to vehicular speed as well as being impaired by alcohol. What could have been a tragic event luckily turned out to be a vehicle off the road and hung up on boulders. In the words of one of the participants as he described the accident and after failing to remove the vehicle from the ditch "we went back to the party to enjoy the rest of the evening"

As a result of the investigation five young adults were charged. Some with Furnishing Liquor to a Minor and others, Providing a Place for Minors to Consume Liquor.

Maine Liquor Law Title 28A reads

§2081. Furnishing or allowing consumption of liquor by certain persons prohibited

1. Offense. Except as provided in subsection 2, a person may not knowingly:
 - A. Procure, or in any way aid or assist in procuring, furnish, give, sell or deliver liquor for or to a minor. The following penalties apply to violations of this paragraph.
 - (1) A person who violates this paragraph commits a Class D crime.
 - (2) A person who violates this paragraph commits a Class D crime for which a fine of not less than \$500 may be imposed, none of which may be suspended, if the violation involves a minor who is less than 18 years of age.
 - (3) A person who violates this paragraph after having been previously convicted of violating this paragraph or paragraph B within a 6-year period commits a Class D crime for which a fine of not less than \$1,000 may be imposed, none of which may be suspended.
 - (4) A person who violates this paragraph after having been previously convicted of violating this paragraph or paragraph B 2 or more times within a 6-year period commits a Class D crime for which a fine of not less than \$1,500 may be imposed, none of which may be suspended.
 - (5) A person who violates this paragraph commits a Class C crime if the consumption of liquor by the minor in fact causes serious bodily injury to or death of the minor or any other individual. For purposes of this subsection, "serious bodily injury" has the same meaning as set out in Title 17-A, section 2, subsection 23; [2005, c. 292, §1 (AMD).]

B. Allow a minor under that person's control or in a place under that person's control to possess or consume liquor. The following penalties apply to violations of this paragraph.

- (1) A person who violates this paragraph commits a Class D crime.
- (2) A person who violates this paragraph commits a Class D crime for which a fine of not less than \$1,000 may be imposed, none of which may be suspended, if the violation involves a minor who is less than 18 years of age.
- (3) A person who violates this paragraph after having been previously convicted of violating this paragraph or paragraph A within a 6-year period commits a Class D crime for which a fine of not less than \$2,000 may be imposed, none of which may be suspended.
- (5) A person who violates this paragraph commits a Class C Felony crime if the consumption of liquor by the minor in fact causes serious bodily injury to or death of the minor or any other individual. For purposes of this subsection, "serious bodily injury" has the same meaning as set out in Title 17-A, section 2, subsection 23; [2005, c. 292, §1 (AMD).]

In short; If you give alcohol to anyone under the age of 21yrs, you will be criminally charged.

If you provide a place for minors, under the age of 21yrs, to consume alcohol, you will be criminally charged.

If you are under the age of 21 and you are in possession of alcohol, you will be charged.

If you are under the age of 21 and are transporting alcohol outside of the scope of your employment, you will be charged.

Certified Contractors:

Code Enforcement Officer: John Thompson

Starting January 1, 2013, any excavation contractor that engages in an activity that disturbs, or displaces more than one cubic yard of soil within the shoreland zone must ensure that a person certified in erosion and sedimentation control practices by the DEP is on-site. The certified contractor must be on-site each day earthmoving activities occur and for a sufficient duration to ensure the proper implementation of erosion and sedimentation control practices. This is required until the site is permanently stabilized.

So what is an excavation contractor? 38 M.R.S.A.

§ 439-B, defines an excavation contractor as either:

- An individual or firm engaged in a business that causes the disturbance of soil, including grading, filling and removal, or
- In a business in which the disturbance of soil results from an activity that the individual or firm is retained to perform.

This neither applies to municipal employees working on municipal projects nor to homeowners doing the work themselves.

Since this requirement is not likely to be found in local ordinances, we suggest adding this requirement to the permit application itself. A simple box in which the applicant can state the contractor's certification number would be sufficient.

The DEP also has a certified contractor searchable database on its website at www.maine.gov/dep/land/training/cccec.html.

Enforcement of this provision will be at the municipal level, but simply updating your application is the best approach for dealing with this. As always, we are available to assist you.

Safe Boating Tips

- Watercraft towing a person or persons on water-skis, surfboards, aquaplanes, or similar devices shall not operate within water safety zones (area of water within 200 feet of any shoreline, mainland or island). Exception: to drop-off or pickup passengers, while ensuring that persons and property are not endangered in the process.
- No person shall operate any watercraft for the purpose of towing a person on water-skis, surfboards, or similar devices on any waterway between the hours of ½ hour after sunset until ½ hour before sunrise.
- Any person being towed on water skis, surfboards, or similar devices must wear a life jacket, life belt, or similar life saving device. No watercraft operator shall tow anyone involved in the aforementioned activities unless the person being towed has complied with this requirement.
- Watercraft towing a person on water skis, surfboard, or other similar devices must have a person in the watercraft who is at least 12 years of age, in addition to the operator, who is in a position to continually observe the person/s being towed.

Night Golf Safety

Sign Up for Night Golf is this weekend and it always goes fast and always sells out completely. A Sign Up Sheet will be posted Saturday morning at 11:00 AM so make sure you get down to the club house as early as possible. You must submit your entry fee when you sign up.

There a couple of safety issues that should be addressed before we all race off into the night with sticks in our hand hitting little glow balls in the dark at each other.

First: There will be no walkers allowed for Night Golf. It’s simply too dangerous to have individuals without carts walking the course in the dark.


Second: All Golf Carts must be wired with head/tail lights as required for any carts used on Frye Island Roads. Golf Cart Rentals are not available since they are not equipped for driving after dark on the course.

Use of your own cart if you have not paid a \$220 “Trail Fee” this season will require that you pay a cart fee – but it is a reduced price for using a cart that you own

Third: In the package you will receive Saturday Night are all sorts of glow in the dark adornments for both you and your golf cart, please use both. Safety depends upon all of us being able to see anyone standing in the direction we are hitting our ball.

Forth: If you are unfamiliar with the course try and play with someone who is. Hazards such as ponds, stream and sand traps as well as an abundance of trees make it difficult to see in the dark. And one year one golf cart ended up in one of our ponds.

This, as always, is a Shot Gun Start. We tee off just about dusk to allow everyone to get to their assigned holes in some sort of daylight. We would expect to tee off somewhere around 8:15 – 8:30 PM and be done around 10:30 – 11:00 PM.
