## Island Manager's Comments

**Elected Officials:** I know it is a bit early but at the town meeting in October we will be electing one person to serve as a Select-Person and one person to serve on the Executive Committee as a representative from the Board of Island Trustees. This sometimes gets a little confusing so I will try to explain it.

In most of the small to middle sized communities in Maine the chosen form of government is the Manager, Selectman, Town Meeting form of government. Frye Island has chosen this form of government. The Manager is appointed by the elected officials and the Select-Persons are chosen by the registered voters of the Town by written ballot at the town meeting. The Town Charter, which was approved by a majority of the Town voters, established this form of governance to be used on the island.

Mark Thomas, who has been a selectman for the past 6 years, has decided not to run for re-election. Therefore we have an opening to serve a three year term. In order to serve as a select-person a candidate must be a registered voter in Frye Island.

The Charter also established a Board of Island Trustees (BIT). In order to be a member of the BIT a person must meet the following criteria:

- a. He or she must be a citizen of the United States.
- b. Must be at least 18 years of age.
- c. And, an owner or the spouse of an owner of real property located within the Town of Frye Island with a fixed home currently occupied by that person, with a maximum of two people per fixed home.

When the Charter was being developed, the Charter Commission realized that there could be a limited number of Islanders registered to vote on municipal business so the Commission and its legal representation wrestled with the State in an effort to maximize the number of Islanders that would have a voice in the operation of the Town. The result of that effort was the formation of the BIT. The Charter gives the BIT the authority to review and approve the annual budget and all ordinances pertaining to zoning, subdivisions, and building regulations. Once these items are approved by the BIT they are placed before the Town voters for ratification.

The Charter also formed the BIT Executive Committee. The Committee is comprised of the three elected Select-Persons and four representatives from the BIT.

Gary Donohue has been an Executive Committee representative for 3 years and has decided to become a candidate for re-election at the October meeting.

If anyone is interested in running to fill Mr. Thomas' position, or to become a candidate from BIT, please pick up the volunteer form in the office. We will need this form completed and a brief biography to share in the FINS.

**Ferry facts:** In the month of June, 2013 the ferry crew transported 7,597 vehicles, 3,900 to the Island and 3,697 from the Island. This compares to 5,330 in 2012, 3,326 to the Island and 2,004 from.

**“Downtown” Congestion:** Following my article last week about a suggested plan for dealing with the traffic pattern in the Store / Office area I received a number of comments and suggestions. These will be discussed at the Executive Committee meeting on Saturday.

**E-911 Street Names:** We met again to discuss the street name changes required. I also discussed this with the Fire / EMS Chief in Raymond for his input. It was determined that we could leave Leisure Lane as it is and accomplish the necessary identification by using numbered signs identifying the range of addresses in each direction. The others will be recommended to the Executive Committee as follows:

- Hilltop – leave as is
- Hillside – Running Hill Road
- Hillcrest – Blueberry Lane
- Birch Road – Hemlock Road
- Harbor Lane – Poplar Lane

## Frye Island Public Works

This past week we had a well meaning islander called in a water leak to 911. PLEASE, this was not a life or death emergency! Do you know that not only was Frye Island Fire, EMS and Police but also Raymond Fire and EMS were all awakened at 11:45 pm for this so called "EMERGENCY".

So here is the proper protocol for an emergency water leak: During normal Town Office/Ferry hours: If the Town Office is open call 655-4551 or the Ferry at 655-4258 or DPW (but we may not get the message till much later) at 655-7493.

AFTER HOURS: CALL CUMBERLAND COUNTY DISPATCH NON EMERGENCY NUMBER at 207-892-2810 report the leak and location, they will contact the on duty Police Officer who will then contact the on duty DPW personnel.

Waterline work continues on Beachview Drive, PLEASE; be on the lookout for our "TRENCH MONKEY'S" they are very hard to see. Also watch out for moving equipment in the construction area. 10am Monday through Friday is a good time to travel the construction zone as this is "Trench Monkey" coffee break time, the "Trench Monkey's" are always ready to accept donations of baked goods at the magic 10am hour.

I am sure you all have noticed the cleanliness of the Transfer Station, our two employees are Deb Edwards and Trish Flynn, who both do an excellent job. Please be kind to them, they do not make the rules or set the fees, any questions? Call John at Public Works at 207-655-7493. Did you know that Deb and Trish collect cans and bottles for Children's Hospital in Boston? At the end of our season Deb will let us know how much money she was able to send to them. ## Fire Department

Fire Barn: 207-655-8618

Here are some safety tips to reduce risk of fire or explosion with gas grills.

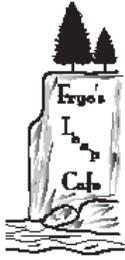
- Check grill hoses for cracking, brittleness and leaks. Make sure there are no sharp bends in the hose.
- Move gas hoses as far away as possible from hot surfaces and dripping hot grease
- Always keep propane gas containers upright
- Never store a spare gas cylinder under or near the grill or indoors
- Never store or use flammable liquids, like gasoline, near the grill
- Never keep a filled container in a hot car or car trunk. Heat will cause the gas pressure to increase, which may open the relief valve and allow gas to escape

- Make sure your spark igniter is consistently generating a spark to create a flame and burn the propane gas. If the flame is not visible, the heavier-than-air propane gas may be escaping and could explode
- **Never** bring the propane tank into the house
- We recommend that all barbecue grills be at least ten feet away from the house, especially when in use. They should not be on porches and away from building openings such as doors, windows and vents

### **THERE IS NO OPEN BURNING PERMITTED ON FRYE ISLAND**

Only permits for warming or cooking are issued providing that an adequate weather advisory has been dispatched to us from the State and that additional guidelines are met.

**There are no other types of open burning allowed, including campfires or bonfires on either private or public property.**

**Did you know that....**

Code Enforcement Officer: John Thompson  
Signs - Permit required

Signs are specifically prohibited except as herein provided:

**1. Materials and maintenance**

All signs must be constructed of durable materials and shall be maintained in good condition and repair at all times.

**2. Residential identification signs** [amended October 6, 2001; WA 12]

In any district, a sign not exceeding four (4) square feet in surface is permitted without permit which announces the 911 designation number and/or the name of the street, owner, occupant, and/or house on which said sign is located. A sign that also announces the profession or home occupation of the occupant is also permitted but requires a permit as specified in ¶ O.5.

**3. Bulletin boards**

A bulletin board not exceeding twenty-four (24) square feet is permitted in connection with any church, school, or similar public structure. A bulletin board for a business is permitted provided that other provisions of this Ordinance are met. Any bulletin board for a business shall be counted towards the business's total sign area.

**4. Temporary real estate and construction signs**

A temporary real estate or construction sign not exceeding six (6) square feet is permitted on the property being sold, leased, or developed. Such sign shall be removed promptly when it has fulfilled its function.

**5. Permit required** [amended October 6, 2001; WA 12]

Except as provided for in ¶ O.2, Residential Identification Signs, each new sign must receive a permit before erection from the municipal officers or their duly appointed agent.

**6. Signs in disrepair**

Any sign which is or becomes in disrepair shall be removed upon order of the municipal officer is not repaired after thirty (30) days' notice. Any new sign must conform to all regulations

No permit for a portable sign shall be granted for a period in excess of 120 days for any particular property, business, or location in any twelve-month period. Portable signs shall not be placed on a lot such that sight distance along a public way is constricted, either for vehicles exiting the premises or for vehicles traveling along the public way.

Ground signs shall be at least fifteen (15) feet from any street or from any lot line of the premises. Such signs shall have a maximum height of ten (10) feet.



## **Marina News**

### **Safe Boating Tips**

- Watercraft may not be operated at a speed greater than “headway speed” while within a water safety zone (**200 feet of shore**), marina or approved anchorage. Headway speed is defined as the minimum speed necessary to maintain steerage and control of the watercraft while it is moving.
- Boaters must always consider the effects of the wash or waves created by their watercraft to piers, floats, shorelines, or property of others. The operator is civilly responsible for any damage incurred.
- Watercraft towing a person or persons on water-skis, surfboards, aquaplanes, or similar devices shall not operate within water safety zones (area of water within 200 feet of any shoreline, mainland or island). Exception: to drop-off or pickup passengers, while ensuring that persons and property are not endangered in the process.
- After a day on the water, remove any visible vegetation, animals, mud, fishing gear and all equipment exposed to the water while you are at the launch ramp. Frye Island has a wash down station at it's ramp located at Long Beach Marina.


