## Island Manager's Comments

**EMS / Safety:** Many of you know that we reorganized the Emergency Medical Service for the Island last spring. Part of that reorganization was to license the service so that we could legally transport a patient at the Basic level. We were also able to provide licensed emergency medical services 24/7 through the high season. So far this year we have had almost 30 reportable calls. The Maine EMS grades each service on the timeliness of the reports and the thoroughness of the reports. On the timeliness of the electronic reports, you get 24 hours to submit the reports. The Frye Island EMS got a grade of 100%. On the thoroughness of the reports, which insures all of the critical information is on the reports, the Frye Island EMS received a grade of 96%. Average grades range between 80% - 100%. In addition, the average response time for all of the calls, from the time the call is received until the first contact with the patient has been 2 minutes - 28 seconds. This compares to an average of 25 – 30 minutes before Raymond EMS is able to arrive on scene. This is not to say anything negative about the exceptional service Raymond provides at the advanced level. It is just they have more distance to cover. We have found that in most cases when transport is required we have been able to package the patient and deliver the patient to Raymond on the mainland which saves valuable time. I would like to publically thank everyone for the understanding and patience when we suspend ferry operation during emergency situations, the EMS staff and the trained AVOC drivers for their superb performance this season, the ferry crews for their understanding and effort, and the mutual aide service we receive from Raymond primarily, and from Casco and Naples when needed as it was this week.

That gets me to the second point...safety. As you have probably heard, we had a very serious golf cart accident this week involving 7 people. Two of those folks received rather serious injuries, though as it turned out, not life threatening, while all the others had bumps, bruises and lacerations to one degree or another. This accident followed very closely on the heels of a golf cart accident at Point Sebago that took the life of a Sanford Maine man. For those of you not in the area this week, the report that was in the Portland paper follows:

*“A Sanford man who fell off a moving golf cart in Casco and hit his head was pronounced dead Monday night at Maine Medical Center. John MacKay, 52, had been in critical condition since Saturday night with a brain injury. The driver of the golf cart, Gary Belinsky, 59, of Westford, Mass., is free on \$300 bail, facing a drunken-driving charge. The Cumberland County Sheriff's Office said the accident was not the result of reckless driving but Belinsky was charged because police believe his blood-alcohol content was higher than 0.08 percent and a golf cart is considered a motor vehicle under state law. Belinsky and MacKay drank at a barbecue with their spouses Saturday evening at the Point Sebago resort in Casco, police said. They were riding in the cart back to their residence when MacKay fell onto the paved road in the complex. Belinsky was driving the cart with his wife in the passenger seat. The other couple were seated on the back of the cart, police said. MacKay apparently stood up, wearing flip-flops, slipped and fell from the moving cart, hitting his head, police said”.*

Chief Beaulieu and I have been preaching vehicle safety for years and the police officers have been stopping people for inappropriate operation only to get tons of grief. But; they are not going to stop. If one stop saves a life it is well worth it. I know people scoff at this: saying what can possibly happen to me, or my family, on a golf cart on an Island like Frye Island. Or, maybe they don't, maybe they don't think at all. To the best of my knowledge we have not had a fatality on the Island but I think we came very close last Tuesday evening. Thank God everyone will recover, but a matter of inches could have made it very different.

While I'm at it...parents, I am not going to tell you how to raise your children, it's not my place, but I will tell you that I ride a bike on these roads almost every morning and there are pot holes, exposed ledge, stones and sand that can very easily throw a rider off balance. When I see kids racing down some of these hills without a helmet on I shudder at the thought of what could happen. One pot hole or stone could be enough to send a child skidding down the road on his / her head, or hurtling into a tree or a boulder or an oncoming vehicle. Bumps and bruises will heal, a head injury may not.

**Elected Officials:** Mark Thomas has been a selectman for the past 6 years; however, he has decided not to run for re-election in October. Therefore we have an opening to serve a three year term as a select-person. In order to be a candidate and serve as a select-person a candidate must be a registered voter in Frye Island. If you are a registered voter in Town and would like to run for this position please contact the office.

In addition, Gary Donohue's 3 year term as a BIT representative on the Executive Committee has expired. Mr. Donohue has decided to run for re-election. If you are a member of the BIT and would like to become a candidate for this position as well please contact the office.



## **RULES PERTAINING TO THE USE OF OPEN FIRES IN SCREENED ENCLOSURES AND CHIMENERAS**

Open fires in a screened enclosure designed for such use or a chimenera are permitted under the following conditions:

It must be used only on an acceptable permit required burn day within the State. (Check with the Fire Department for this information)

The appliance must be located on a sand or dirt surface in a wide-open area to prevent any spread of fire.

The appliance must be fully screened or, in the case of a chimenera, must be screened at the top.

It must be placed away from any structure and CANNOT be situated on a porch, deck or other similar area.

An adult must continuously monitor it.

A garden hose or bucket of water must be located nearby.

The fire must be extinguished when finished.

The fire department has the authority to extinguish any fire that constitutes a hazard.

A person using one of these appliances accepts full responsibility in the State of Maine for their action if a mishap occurs.

Violators of these rules will be reported to the Maine Forest Service, Forest Protection Division, for disciplinary action.

- Turn-off all electrical equipment when docking your watercraft after a days activities. When accidentally left in the "on" position, they could drain your battery. "Lock" your battery switch in the off position to avoid theft and as another way in which to save your battery life.
- After a day on the water, remove any visible vegetation, animals, mud, fishing gear and all equipment exposed to the water while you are at the launch ramp. Frye Island has a wash down station at it's ramp located at Long Beach Marina.

### **MEMSRR Quarterly Progress Report April 1 to June 30, 2013**

In an effort to provide feedback and help improve the quality of the reports entered into the Maine EMS Run Reporting (MEMSRR) System, Maine EMS sends services quarterly progress reports. These reports will begin by focusing on Report Entry Time and Report Validity. This report looks at the preceding quarter and provides a snapshot of our service's performance. The enclosed report is for the Second quarter of 2013; April 1 to June 30, 2013

#### **1. Report Entry Compliance**

Maine EMS rules require services and providers to enter patient care reports into the MEMSRR within 1 business day. For patient care purposes, services and providers should strive for as soon as possible! Providing a complete and timely run report is an essential part of providing quality patient care and is an obligation we have to each patient.

Providing a complete patient care report is the only skill we perform in every patient encounter. The information documented in a run report is an important part of the patient medical record and is invaluable in assisting with patient treatment decisions.

#### **2. Report Validity**

The MEMSRR validity rule system helps guide providers towards a complete report. The validity score helps administrators identify reports that are missing critical elements of a report; a lower score means that more elements are missing.

Reports do not need to be 100% to be complete; however, this system helps identify reports that should be reviewed. Ideally, a service would have an average validity score between 80% and 100%.

Completed reports are utilized at a number of levels. A service can use this information for quality assurance and improvement activities to ensure the population of its coverage area are receiving the best care possible and resources are being utilized to their full potential. Hospitals use the reports to make clinical decisions and shape the care the patient receives both in the emergency room and after admission. Primary care physicians will use the information to determine the care that is necessary to ensure proper care and safety for their patient when they return home.

Pre-hospital protocols are also influenced by the information documented on patient care reports. With each protocol revision, information from the EMS patient care report has been used to determine the effectiveness of treatments and provide insight on what EMS services and personnel are experiencing for calls in the field. This will help guide the Medical Direction and Practices Board (MDPB) to develop protocols enabling the safe and effective treatment of our patients.

For any of these benefits to occur, services must ensure that providers are entering a complete and accurate run report.

#### **Frye Island Rescue Service score-96%**

As of July 22, a survey of the Frye Island Rescue Service calls for patient care was averaged over an approximate 25 calls to date. I am pleased to report that the average time the Frye Island Rescue Service reaching a patient with a licensed EMT from tone out to on scene is **2 minutes 28 seconds**. This is a huge improvement from 2012's average of approximately 25 minutes as we relied on mutual aid from other communities to provide patient care with licensed EMT's.

#### Road Opening and Use Policy - **Permit required**

All road openings shall be approved by the Frye Island Director of Public Works before any work is to proceed and before any building permit is issued.

If the Frye Island Public Works Director approves of the road opening, the Director will issue a Road Opening Permit, the landowner or contractor may present said road opening permit to the Frye Island Code Enforcement Officer, who may then, issue a building permit.

If a road opening is approved and said opening will cross the Town water line or sewer line etc., the Town Public Works Department will locate the water line and or sewer line, at a charge of fifty dollars (\$50.00). Work will not proceed until the water or sewer line has been located and marked.

Sewer lines shall be installed under the Town water line, and no less than two foot below the water line. Sewer and water lines that are approved for under the road shall be sleeved with a minimum of schedule 80 pipe, and the sleeve pipe shall be large enough to remove the pipes and install new pipes if needed.

All drainage or driveway culverts shall be N-12 type (smooth inside) and the size shall be approved by the Frye Island Director of Public Works.

All under road piping and culverts, including driveway culverts shall be marked at both ends with an oak or metal stake painted blue for water, gray for sewage, olive green for drainage.

Road openings are defined as;

Curb cuts (Driveway Openings)

Under road sewer or water lines

Under road or under driveway drainage culverts

Under road, electrical lines or electrical services shall not be allowed.

Under road gas lines, piping or services shall not be allowed
