Island Manager's Comments

E-ticket system: I have been asked to go over some of the operating aspects of the E-Ticket system as a reminder for the original users and for the benefit of the new users. After trying to find an “off the shelf” computer software package that we could use to replace the paper ferry ticket system we finally contracted to have a program developed for us. We are now into the third year with the new system and it seems to be working very well. The system provides a means for both Islanders and non-Islanders to establish an E-Ticket account. When establishing this account an individual can select to replenish their account by paying with cash or check at the office or by mail. An individual also has an option to replenish their account through an automatic bank transfer. Each account will have an owner, the person responsible for the account, and any numbers of users, those people authorized to use the owners account. Everyone associated with an account will be issued a bar-coded ID card which identifies the user and the account to be charged. The account owner will be asked to provide an email address when completing the application. Once the information is entered into the system, an email will be automatically generated and a notice sent to the email address provided so the owner can validate the email address and establish a password. All passwords are protected and not available to anyone in the office so if you forget it we can't retrieve it for you. Once the account owner has validated the email address and set the password he/she will be able to access their account by going to the fryeisland.com website under the “ferry” tab. By accessing the account the account owner will be able to view all of the transactions charged to that account. They will also be able to identify who is using the account because each user has their own identifying ID. We can also make special accommodations for an individual that wishes to establish an account but doesn't have access to a computer; but it does make it a little more difficult for them to monitor their account transactions. If you have an account there is no need for you to come to the office to purchase ferry tickets. You and the users of your account can use their ID card for ferry passage. If you are the owner of the account and you want to provide a ticket for a family member or a friend you can purchase a ticket on line and send it via email or print it out and snail mail it. Those people identified as “users” of the account do not have access to the account nor can they purchase tickets unless the owner gives them the account access information. In 2011 the Board of Island Trustees established a three tier ticket pricing structure. If a person without an account drives up to the mainland ferry terminal they will have to pay full price to ride the ferry which is \$35 for a passenger vehicle. The cost could be more or less depending on the size of the vehicle or for a pedestrian. A Frye Island property owner without an account can purchase ferry tickets in the office at a discount but will still pay \$25 for a passenger vehicle which is adjusted for larger and smaller vehicles. A property owner with an account will receive the maximum discount on all vehicles. That rate is \$15 for a passenger vehicle. All of the ferry fares are adjusted for larger vehicles, pedestrians, golf carts etc. We are in the process of reviewing the system now to see what we might do, if anything, to keep pace with ever changing technology. The current scanners are unable to read a bar code from smart phones or iPad type devices. We have been asked about this and are investigating the feasibility. In addition, we are looking into the ability to use credit cards to purchase ferry fares.





SUMMER SAFETY TIPS

On extremely hot and muggy days, exposure to heat can lead to heat exhaustion and heat stroke. Seniors, infants and individuals in poor health are at greatest risk. Joggers and other who exercise outdoors are also at risk. The Frye Island Fire Department recommends the following prevention tips for beating the heat this summer.

Stay out of the sun because sunlight increases body heat, and sunburn prevents the release of body heat.

Avoid jogging, or do it at night when it is cooler.

Wear clothing that is lightweight, light-colored, and loose fitting.

Drink plenty of water and cool, non-alcoholic beverages.

Stay indoors; use a fan and air conditioning if possible.

Eat light food and avoid high protein and high calorie foods, which increase body heat.

Seek medical advice if you or someone you know becomes ill. If someone develops a high temperature, is flushed, and stops perspiring; bathe the person in cool water and seek medical advice immediately.

Keep a flashlight with fresh batteries close by since blackouts often occur during extremely hot weather. Please remember that candles are a serious fire hazard.

Check on elderly or infirm neighbors to see if they need help. Escort them to a "cool area" if necessary.



- Age Requirements—"When operating a motorboat with more than 10 horsepower, a person under the age of 12 must be under immediate supervision of a person located in the boat who is at least 16 years of age. A person under the age of 16 years may not operate personal watercraft, which includes jet skis. **A person between 16-18 years of age may operate a personal watercraft if they have successfully completed an approved education course, or if they are accompanied by a person 18 years of age or older.** Proof of age and course must be possessed while operating a personal watercraft." For the safety of all, please abide by the above law.

Attention to safety concerns by all of us, whether we're boaters or guests, will make our boating experiences fun and memorable. Please try to keep your fellow boaters and their guests in mind while utilizing either the Long Beach Marina or Quail Circle Marina. Try to be vigilant for unsightly trash and hazards (small stumps, brush, logs, discarded or lost boating equipment, etc.) Some of our boaters utilize our docking facilities during the hours of darkness. Early in the season, an unlighted stump or piece of winter "slash" could cause a serious injury. PLEASE take the time to remove these items and take them out of harms way, by making an effort to dispose of them in the proper manner. If we all pitch in, our marinas will be kept in a condition that we can all be proud of.

Septic Checklist

Do Checklist

- **Inspect** your tank for signs of sludge buildup and make sure the baffles or tees are in working order.
- **Pump** your tank as needed (every 2-3 years for year-round residences, and every 4-5 years for seasonal residences), and keep a written record for yourself or for a future owner.
- **Compost** food garbage or put it in the trash.
- Keep a **grease can** handy.
- **Mark** your septic system so you can protect it from vehicles and encroaching trees and shrubs.
- **Conserve** water; install water saving devices, such as low-flow faucet and shower heads.
- **Use non-toxic cleaning products** such as baking soda to scrub toilets, or boiling water to clear clogged drains.
- **Contact** a site evaluator if your septic system shows signs of failure; contact your local plumbing inspector if you see evidence of other malfunctioning septic systems.
- Request that your site evaluator design a **loam liner** for your leaching field if the site has sandy soil.
- Plant shrubs, trees, and grasses downhill from your system to act as a sponge (it will tie up excess nutrients and water as well as prevent soil erosion).

For Clogged Drains

- Use a plunger or mechanical snake.
- Or pour 1 handful baking soda and ½ cup white vinegar down drainpipe and cover tightly for 1 minute. Repeat process as needed.
- Or pour ½ cup salt and ½ cup baking soda down the drain, followed by 6 cups boiling water. Let sit for several hours or overnight, then flush with water.

Out of sight, out of mind. That's what many people think after the toilet flushes or the sink drains. But that wastewater may be seen again if the household's septic system fails. Some very simple measures can prevent septic system failure and protect Maine's lakes, streams, and groundwater from pollution.

DON'T Checklist

- Don't use a garbage disposal-it adds 50% more solids to your system.
- Don't pour automotive oil, cooking oil, or grease down the drain.
- Don't drive vehicles over the septic system or leach field.
- Don't plant bushes or trees over the leach field.
- Don't use phosphorus detergents.
- Don't use too much water, especially during rainy, wet seasons when the ground is saturated.
- Don't pour paint or paint thinner into your sink (let it air dry and throw it out in the trash).
- Don't use drain cleaners or other toxic chemical products.
- Don't use chemical or biological septic system cleaners which can plug up leach fields and ruin your system.
- Don't wait-if your septic system shows signs of problems, act immediately.
