Island Manager's Comments

Greetings everyone:

Town Manager: I am pleased to announce that Gary Donohue has been appointed the Town Manager effective July 1st 2014.

NIXLE: We have become an "Authorized Information Provider" with NIXLE. NIXLE is a service that provides a means for municipalities and public safety agencies to connect with their residents via text, web, and email so their residents can be informed of important notifications. The best part of this is that it is a free service to both the municipality and to residents as well. We can initiate notices to all Islanders that subscribe to the service. However, in order to access the notices you will be required to subscribe. You can subscribe by going to their website at www.nixle.com and following the prompts. One point of interest we found out is that NIXLE has an app for a smart phone that will walk you through the process and allow you to enter various zip codes of your preference. In addition, the app is able to follow your smart phone if you are traveling via GPS and will notify you of issues in the location you are in.

Ferry Ticket Policy: We used to have a policy that required residents "not in good standing" to have to pay the full rate for ferry tickets. "Not in good standing" meant a resident was not current on their taxes or owed some other required fees. We abandoned that a few years ago but the Executive Committee has decided to revive that policy. Therefore, effective June 1st, all property owners that have been issued a lien on their property because of delinquent taxes will be required to pay the "office rate" for their ferry tickets. This means the cost for a standard automobile will be \$25 as opposed to the discounted price of \$15.

Charter Amendment: At an Executive Committee meeting held on May 31st, the Select Board voted to hold a Special Town Meeting on Saturday July 19th at 9:00 AM in the Community Center to vote on a proposed charter amendment. This proposed amendment, if passed, would change the Annual Town Meeting date from Columbus weekend to a date on or before Labor Day weekend. It would also adjust the dates for the budgeting process. As we get closer to that date I will have more information for you.

MunicipiPay: MuniPAY is a program that Frye Island will be implementing soon. This will allow residents to pay all of their fees including taxes on a web based program from their home computers using a credit / debit card or an electronic bank transfer. There is no cost to Frye Island to use this system and all of the fees will be deposited into Frye Island's accounts. However, there is a fee charged to the user. This fee is to cover the costs to process the credit and debit cards. If the charge is less than \$122 the fee is \$3.00. Greater than \$122 the fee is 2.45% on the total amount charged. If an electronic check is used the fee is a flat \$1.50. We will have a link on our website directing you to a secure site containing the forms customized for Frye Island. We had hoped to implement the system this weekend but I think it best if we wait another week. We just installed a couple of new computers in the office and we have had a few problems getting everything operating at 100% so we will postpone the implementation until next weekend.

I would like to remind everyone that vehicles (except for golf carts), trailers and boats can be re-registered on line. In addition, fishing licenses can also be purchased online. All of the

Draft Warrant Article -- Town Charter Amendment

Article YY. To see if the Voters of the Town of Frye Island will vote to amend the Town Charter Articles II & VII to move the Annual Town Meeting date and Budget Preparation dates as shown in following text (additions shown in red italic and deletions shown in strike-through):

Article II. Town Meeting

Section 1. Meetings. Annual Town Meeting shall be held each year in the Town of Frye Island *on or before* the *last* weekend of *August* ~~Columbus Day Holiday (October)~~ each year. *The exact date shall be published at least 30 days before the meeting.* Town Budget and Elections shall be a part of the Annual Meeting. Special Town Meetings can be called by a majority of the Selectmen or, if the Selectmen refuse to call a Town Meeting, by a notary public on the written petition of a number of Voters equal to at least 10% of the number of votes cast in the Town of Frye Island at the last gubernatorial election, but in no case less than 10. Special town meetings held during the months of November through April require 30 day advance notice by first class mail to all Frye Island Voters and property owners. There is no quorum requirement (i.e., minimum number of Voters required to conduct valid transactions) for Town Meetings or Town Elections.

Article VII. Financial Procedures

Section 2. Budget Preparation - Municipal Items. The Town Manager shall initiate and assist in municipal budget development and capital improvement plan development for the coming fiscal year no later than *July 1* ~~September 4~~, consult with the Executive Committee of the Board of Island Trustees (or Municipal Budget Committee, if one is appointed) and hold at least one public hearing *during the last weekend in July* ~~by September 10~~, and present to the Executive Committee of the Board of Island Trustees the proposed budget by *the first weekend in August* ~~September 15~~. The Executive Committee of the Board of Island Trustees will review the proposed budget and make any changes with the recommendations of the Budget Committee so noted and have available to the Selectmen by *the second weekend in August* ~~September 30~~. The Town Manager shall also review contribution requests from the public service organizations serving the local area and submit recommendations to the Executive Committee of the Board of Island Trustees by *August 1* ~~September 4~~.

Section 3. Budget Preparation - Other Items. The Town Manager shall initiate and assist in non-municipal budget development (school, county and state budget items) for the coming fiscal year no later than *July 1* ~~September 4~~, consult with the Board of Selectmen (or Budget Committee, if one is appointed) and hold at least one public hearing *during the last weekend in July* ~~by September 10~~, and present to the Board of Selectmen the proposed budget by *the first weekend in August* ~~September~~

15. The Board of Selectmen will review the proposed budget and make any changes with the recommendations of the Budget Committee so noted and have available *one week before the Annual Town Meeting* by September 30.

USS Zumwalt Day on Frye Island



After a one-year pause, a new ship is completing its construction at the Bath Iron Works, providing us with the opportunity to welcome its sailors for a day of R&R here on Frye Island. Sailors from three previous ships have all loved it, as have the Islanders who hosted them.

This ship is the first of a new class of destroyer, the USS Zumwalt, DDG 1000. It's half again as big as the older Arleigh Burke class, with half the crew, because of increased automation. It's really impressive, and it's commanded by no less than Captain James Kirk!

Save the date on your calendar, Saturday, August 9th, as we'll be looking for Islanders to help out.

As before, we will start with a welcoming ceremony and ballgame in the late morning, followed by a barbecue lunch and informal recreation in the afternoon, including swimming, boating and kayaking, golf, basketball, soccer, volleyball, and tennis. We will close the day by inviting groups of two to four sailors, as well as others with their young families, to the homes of Islanders for supper and relaxation. This has been the high point for many of the sailors in past years, who have been missing their own homes while on temporary duty in Bath.

Summer! It has arrived and I the warm weather and let the arrival of summer, we are open days a week until Labor Day.

We have been hard at work in the store the last several days trying to get as much of our inventory out on display as opposed to sitting in the backroom. To accomplish this we are having to take advantage of every nook and cranny and have had to move some things around. So when you come down to the store, be sure to browse around and ask the staff to point out where things are located. If you want to get a sense for the different shirts that we have available, look up to the ceiling. We have tried to get as many of our shirts as possible hanging from the ceiling so that you can see our selection. With the beginning of summer, we received our first delivery of fresh vegetables in the store. We have eggplant, zucchini, squash, potatoes (red and russet), tomatoes, avocados, garlic and more. These vegetables come to us from Native Maine, a company that specializes in vegetables grown locally. For the sweet tooth, we have added something new in the ice cream cooler – gelato. We are selling pints of gelato from Gelato Fiasco and have flavors such as Maine Wild Blueberry Crisp and Espresso Chip. Yummy! And to quench your thirsts, we have added some fun new beer selections. We are carrying variety packs of beers from local brewers ranging from Harpoon to Gritty's. It's a great way to try the different beers that the brewers feature.

In the café with the arrival of summer we are at full menu. That means fried clams, lobster mac and cheese, crab cakes and more! This also marks the beginning of offering salads for the season. And we have added some really nice summer salads to the menu, be sure to check them out. Another item that we are adding to the menu in the form of daily specials will be smoked barbecue meats. We piloted our new smoker last weekend with a brisket offering on Saturday and ribs and chicken on Sunday and both were well received. That sealed the deal and we will continue to offer smoked meats on a rotating basis throughout the season. This weekend we will be serving Texas style smoked brisket that will have been slow cooked for over 10 hours. Hopefully I can have this batch of brisket turn out as good as the first!

In the bar, we have a great selection of drinks for you. For the frozen drinks we have increased the number of recipes that we are making on a routine basis and have also added a drink of the day to our repertoire. On draft, we have 12 great beers to choose from. Frye's Leap IPA remains our best selling and most favored beer but we have some other great beers that are giving the IPA a challenge such as Switchback Ale, an unfiltered amber ale from Vermont. And we have some new guest beers on draft that people are really enjoying such as Banner Rye, a full flavored Rye ale with an ABV of 4% that allows you to lengthen your session, and Harpoon UFO Big Squeeze, an unfiltered grapefruit shandy that is wildly refreshing. It is my new favorite! (at least when I am not in the mood for an IPA!). On the wine front, we are working on increasing our wine selection beyond just a house pour to having several upgraded wines available by the glass as well as offering an enhanced selection of wines available by the bottle. Check out the café announcements at your table (another new addition) for more info as these wine selections get launched.

One of the things that Amy and I got exposed to this past year on our travels in search of the finest beers available was the "tap takeover". This is where a brewery "takes over" your taps for the day and features a number of their beers that are available on tap. I enjoyed this so much that I just had to bring this to the café this season and I am happy to say that we have our first ever tap takeover scheduled! On Saturday July 19 Baxter Brewing from Lewiston will be taking over five of our taps and we will be serving Stowaway IPA, Pamola Xtra Pale Ale, Summer Swelter Ale, Tarnation (a California style lager) and the Daughters of Poseidon (a black IPA brewed with oysters. I have tried it and it is pretty darn good!). Baxter beers will be \$4.50 that day and we will have representatives from the brewery on site from 3pm to 6pm to discuss their beer and have giveaways. It should be a great day, rain or shine! Obviously though we will hope for the shine. ☺

And as we wrap things up, we want to let you know that we will continue to have live music played on Saturday night for your listening and dining enjoyment. Our very own Alana MacArthur entertains us with an assortment of easy listening music. If you have not yet had a chance to hear her play, be sure to come down Saturday at 7:00 pm and hear her lovely voice. And we are hoping that over the course of the season that we will have a few other guest performers for your listening pleasure!

Almost forgot! We want to make sure that you don't forget that we offer a breakfast buffet on Saturday and Sunday morning, from 8:00am to 11:00am. It's a great way to start your weekend day. You can even treat yourself to a mimosa or a bloody mary with your breakfast if you like. It's 5:00pm somewhere!

Coyote seen on the island

This notice is not meant to alarm anyone, only for your due diligence when allowing pets to roam at large. Coyotes are medium in size, they have pointed muzzles and long, brushy tails. Their coats are usually a mixture of tan, black and gray, but can range from black to strawberry blond. The average adult coyote weighs 30 to 35 pounds, with males being heavier than females. Large males only rarely will exceed 45 pounds. Coyotes occasionally kill domestic cats, dogs and other wild predators that might compete with them for food. Coyotes are protective of their young and will attack dogs that get too close to their den and pups. **To date, there have been no documented coyote attacks on humans in Maine.**

Dogs and cats, because they have been raised by humans, are not prepared to fend for themselves against predators. If you leave cats and small to mid-size dogs outside at night in an unprotected area, they can easily become prey. If you do lose a dog or cat to a coyote, notify your neighbors, because once a coyote finds easy prey it may continue to hunt in the area.

Coyotes are as much a part of the Maine landscape as deer, moose, bear or any other woodland animal. Coyote's tendencies are to avoid human contact as they hide within forested areas. As stated, be cautious of your pets if they are allowed to roam unattended.
