Island Manager's Comments

Greetings everyone: School is out now and the high season population on the Island is growing. There will be more vehicles, golf carts, bicycles and pedestrians using our roads. It is extremely important that everyone be very careful no matter what your mode of transportation. We had a single car accident on the Island last weekend that could have been extremely serious. Fortunately, no one was injured but we may not be as lucky the next time. All of our roads are gravel, they are narrow and there are soft shoulders. It is very easy to lose control; so please drive with caution.

NIXLE: Our NIXLE system is up and running. This system will notify all subscribers of important / emergency notices in their selected areas via text, web, and email. The best part of this is that it is a free service to both the municipality and to residents as well. We can initiate notices to all Islanders that subscribe to the service. However, in order to access the notices you will be required to subscribe. You can subscribe by going to their website at www.nixle.com and following the prompts. A test notice was sent yesterday to those that have enrolled. I would encourage everyone to subscribe to this service. It is an ideal way to be notified of issues that may affect your time on the Island.

Charter Amendment: We have been publishing a proposed charter amendment that, if approved, will change the annual town meeting date from Columbus Day weekend in October to a date on or before the last Saturday in August. State statutes require that the vote on this amendment be by registered Frye Island voters only. However, there have been a number of people question whether members of the BIT (Board of Island Trustees) would be allowed to speak at a special meeting. The consensus was "NO" but I felt one last discussion with legal counsel was warranted. So I made that call yesterday morning. I knew that this vote had to be conducted by "secret ballot" but, somewhat to my surprise, I learned that the home rule statutes required that the vote be conducted by referendum. This means that there will be no special town meeting at all. Instead we will open polls and a secret ballot referendum vote will take place on Saturday July 19th at the Community Center. This will be a YES or NO vote. Yes to change the meeting date and no to leave it as it is. The statutes allow us to open the polls as late as 10:00 AM but we cannot close them until 8:00PM. Because this is a referendum election, absentee voting will be allowed if you are a registered Frye Island voter and will not be able to attend in person. The proposed amendment is reprinted below. A majority of YES votes is required to pass the amendment and the total number of votes must be equal to or greater than 30% of the total votes cast in the last gubernatorial election. If this amendment passes, it will become effective January 1, 2015.

Fire Works: The fireworks have been scheduled for Saturday evening July 5th. They will begin as soon as the pyrotechnic technician feels it is dark enough for the display. In order for the office staff to participate in the activities planned for the weekend, the office will be closed all day Saturday July 5th. We will be open as scheduled on the 4th so if you need to conduct business in the office please plan accordingly.

Pickleball: Pickleball, similar to tennis but different, is catching on in a lot of places around the country and here on Frye Island as well. I have been asked to mention that there will be a group of Islanders playing from 9AM to 11AM every Monday, Wednesday & Friday on the courts on Lancaster Loop (near the pool). Everyone is welcome to play whether you've played before or not.

Internet Access: A number of Islanders have inquired about the possibility of getting internet access at the Community Center. Well we do have Wi-Fi there. It is presently a secure connection but if the Community Center is open you can get the password from the person there in charge.

Meeting Reminders: The Frye Island Board of Directors has scheduled a meeting for 8:00AM on Saturday morning July 12th. The meeting will be held at the Community Center.

The next Executive Committee meeting has been scheduled for 7:00 PM August 15th at the Community Center.

The referendum election for the charter amendment will be held on Saturday July 19th, the polls will be open from 10:00AM until 8:00PM. The vote count, including the absentee ballots, will take place immediately following the closing of the polls. We will need volunteers to help man the polls and to count ballots after the polls close. Please call the office if you are interested.

Final FINS (for me): As most of you know, my last official day as manager will be June 30th. It is hard to believe that it has been 12 years since I became the manager. I want to thank everyone for the support I have had, it wouldn't have been possible to make it this long without it. Nancy and I plan to stay on the Island so I am sure I will see around, all be it in different circumstances. Gary Donohue will become the new Town Manager and Marie Tedford will take over as the Town Clerk effective July 1st. I am sure they will receive the same support I was given. I hope you all have a wonderful season. Stay safe and may God bless you all.

Proposed Town Charter Amendment

Shall the municipality approve the charter amendment reprinted below?

Article II. Town Meeting

Section 1. Meetings. Annual Town Meeting shall be held each year in the Town of Frye Island *on or before* the *last* weekend of ~~August~~ ~~Columbus Day Holiday (October)~~ each year. *The exact date shall be published at least 30 days before the meeting.* Town Budget and Elections shall be a part of the Annual Meeting. Special Town Meetings can be called by a majority of the Selectmen or, if the Selectmen refuse to call a Town Meeting, by a notary public on the written petition of a number of Voters equal to at least 10% of the number of votes cast in the Town of Frye Island at the last gubernatorial election, but in no case less than 10. Special town meetings held during the months of November through April require 30 day advance notice by first class mail to all Frye Island Voters and property owners. There is no quorum requirement (i.e., minimum number of Voters required to conduct valid transactions) for Town Meetings or Town Elections.

Article VII. Financial Procedures

Section 2. Budget Preparation - Municipal Items. The Town Manager shall initiate and assist in municipal budget development and capital improvement plan development for the coming fiscal year no later than *July 1* ~~September 4~~, consult with the Executive Committee of the Board of Island Trustees (or Municipal Budget Committee, if one is appointed) and hold at least one public hearing *during the last weekend in July* ~~by September 4~~, and present to the Executive Committee of the Board of Island Trustees the proposed budget by *the first weekend in August* ~~September 15~~. The Executive Committee of the Board of Island Trustees will review the proposed budget and make any changes with the recommendations of the Budget Committee so noted and have available to the Selectmen by *the second weekend in August* ~~September 30~~. The Town Manager shall also review contribution requests from the public service organizations serving the local area and submit recommendations to the Executive Committee of the Board of Island Trustees by *August 1* ~~September 4~~.

Section 3. Budget Preparation - Other Items. The Town Manager shall initiate and assist in non-municipal budget development (school, county and state budget items) for the coming fiscal year no later than *July 1* ~~September 4~~, consult with the Board of Selectmen (or Budget Committee, if one is appointed) and hold at least one public hearing *during the last weekend in July* ~~by September 10~~, and present to the Board of Selectmen the proposed budget by *the first weekend in August* ~~September 15~~. The Board of Selectmen will review the proposed budget and make any changes with the recommendations of the Budget Committee so noted and have available *one week before the Annual Town Meeting* ~~by September 30~~.

USS Zumwalt Day on Frye Island



After a one-year pause, a new ship is completing its construction at the Bath Iron Works, providing us with the opportunity to welcome its sailors for a day of R&R here on Frye Island. Sailors from three previous ships have all loved it, as have the Islanders who hosted them.

This ship is the first of a new class of destroyer, the USS Zumwalt, DDG 1000. It's half again as big as the older Arleigh Burke class, with half the crew, because of increased automation. It's really impressive, and it's commanded by no less than Captain James Kirk!

Save the date on your calendar, Saturday, August 9th, as we'll be looking for Islanders to help out.

school is finally out, all the snow days have been for everyone! Bring on the sun, the warm weather

Lots of new things at the store this week. Each week we add a few new things based on requests that we have gotten or area where we see a potential need. This week we have added pre-packaged deli meats from Dietz-Watson, the same manufacturer that you can find in the grocery store. We have packages of roast beef and sandwich pepperoni that are approximately 1 lb each and packages of turkey breast that are approximately 2 lbs. You can find these in the cooler near the dairy products. This past week was also the when we received our first delivery of fresh vegetables in the store. We have eggplant, zucchini, squash, potatoes (red and russet), tomatoes, avocados, garlic and more. These vegetables come to us from Native Maine, a company that specializes in vegetables grown locally. And to celebrate the coming Fourth of July holiday and the numerous cookouts and parties that will occur, we will be setting up a "farmstand" on Thursday July 3 with a larger than normal vegetable and fruit selection so that you can complete that last minute shopping for vegetable essentials without having to leave the island. We will also be restocking our plant selection one more time and will have fresh hanging plants and bedding flowers to fill in those empty spots that you might have in your yard. Be sure to stop by and check out the "farm"!

In the store we have also added non dairy milk products for those that are lactose intolerant. We have quarts of soy milk as well as 8oz containers of almond milk. You can find these in the coolers where we stock the meat and (ironically) the dairy products. Also new to the store this weekend will be an increased selection of beer. We will be adding a number of specialty beers from Stone Brewing in California and Clown Shoes Brewing from Ipswich Massachusetts. These will mostly be available as 22oz bombers that you can find back near the wine selection. These are great for trying something new without committing to an entire six pack. Another way to try something new is to grab one of the variety twelve packs that we have in the back of the store to sample the best that the brewers have to offer.

In the bar we have lots of things going on with the onset of the summer season. As you know, we have put a lot of effort into our beer selection, working to provide a creative selection of local and national drafts. And we have experimented with and expanded our frozen drink selection. But the wine selection has been pretty drab. However, this is the season that we are out to change that and we are now offering a number of upgraded wines by the glass as well as a much more complete selection of wines by the bottle. We are in the process of completing table tent cards that detail the new selections. But until those are made, be sure to ask for server about our expanded selection! From the kitchen, as we have mentioned before, we are looking to increase the frequency and rotation of daily specials. The last two weekends our specials have been smoked meats - brisket, ribs and chicken. They have been pretty yummy if I can say so myself. Chef boy our Dave! In the bar as well we will feature frozen drink specials, with at least one drink of the week each week. There have been some pretty good creations so far! Finally, also fully up and operational at this time is our coffee bar offering a range of lattes and other custom made coffees served from our bar. We whip up a wicked good peppermint mocha latte or a cookies and cream frappe! Be sure to check them out. And if you come in during the breakfast hour, enjoy a small specialty drink and a muffin from the bar for \$5. A hot steaming deal!

And the café is not just about the food and drink, it's also about the fun! This coming week we will officially launch our weekly activities that include Tuesday Trivia and Karaoke Wednesday. We had practice sessions this week and I think that I can say that a good time was had by all. Mondays are margarita Monday with a \$1 off frozen margaritas, Thursday is Thirsty Thursday with a \$1 off all draft beers and Friday is Frye Pye Friday with \$1 off of our delicious Frye Pye dessert. Saturdays we feature live entertainment from 7:00pm until 9:00pm and on Saturdays and Sundays we also offer our Breakfast Buffet. This Sunday, we will also feature live music from 5:00pm to 7:00pm with one of our island neighbors entertaining us with music from his electric keyboard. I have heard that there may even be a guest set of vocals or two that will occur during the performance! You certainly won't want to miss this musical event.

As high season gets underway the Towns EMS service will be offering free blood pressure checks. This service will be offered Monday through Friday 10:00am to Noon at the Ferry Landing Rescue Barn next to the Post Office. Please stop by and say hi to the EMT's that will be working on the island this summer.

Also offered at no charge will be routine first aid. So for anyone that has an injury that needs attention, stop by the Rescue Barn and have the EMT's take a look at your situation, or call 893-2810 for non-emergency, 911 for emergency and we'll come to you. As always, all patient care offered by Frye Island EMS will be at no charge, you will not get a bill.

This is a service we are happy to offer to all islanders and visitors.

Coyote seen on the island

This notice is not meant to alarm anyone, only for your due diligence when allowing pets to roam at large. Coyotes are medium in size, they have pointed muzzles and long, brushy tails. Their coats are usually a mixture of tan, black and gray, but can range from black to strawberry blond. The average adult coyote weighs 30 to 35 pounds, with males being heavier than females. Large males only rarely will exceed 45 pounds. Coyotes occasionally kill domestic cats, dogs and other wild predators that might compete with them for food. Coyotes are protective of their young and will attack dogs that get too close to their den and pups. **To date, there have been no documented coyote attacks on humans in Maine.**

Dogs and cats, because they have been raised by humans, are not prepared to fend for themselves against predators. If you leave cats and small to mid-size dogs outside at night in an unprotected area, they can easily become prey. If you do lose a dog or cat to a coyote, notify your neighbors, because once a coyote finds easy prey it may continue to hunt in the area.

Coyotes are as much a part of the Maine landscape as deer, moose, bear or any other woodland animal. Coyote's tendencies are to avoid human contact as they hide within forested areas. As stated, be cautious of your pets if they are allowed to roam unattended.

A note from the Frye Island Fire Dept

The Frye Island Volunteer Fire Department is once again collecting returnable bottles and cans at the Transfer Station. If you wish to donate your bottles and cans, the transfer station attendant will direct you to the proper location, which is to the far right upon entering the facility. Proceeds from the bottles and cans go towards funding the Frye Island Firefighters Association to help defray the cost of community events such as the Fire Department Open House and Hot Dog Picnic held

over the July 4th weekend. The Hot Dog Picnic will be held this year on Saturday, July 5th immediately following the parade, at the Fire Station on Fairway Lane. All are welcome.

There is **NO LIFEGUARD ON DUTY AT ANY TIME!** We have a brand new pool deck, if you spill something please rinse it off. **NO GLASSWARE** of any kind allowed in the pool area. Unsupervised children are not allowed without an adult.
